THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Middleton in the County of Strafford in the said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Middleton on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for same.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote \$220.00 for electric lights and make appropriation for same.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote \$1,000.00 for town roads and make appropriation for same.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$270.00 for state aid construction and town road aid.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum of money for county tax.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for tractor expense.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$35.00 for workmen's compensation insurance.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$16.00 for insurance on tractor and shed.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$12.00 for the Lakes Region Association.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to petition the state tax commission to have an audit made by the Division on Municipal Accounting, and make appropriation to cover expense of such audit.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for the control of white pine blister rust.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to purchase a truck and equipment for plowing snow and raise and appropriate money for same. By petition.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the hourly rate for men and trucks. By petition.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the salaries of the town officers. By petition.

Article 16. To see if the town will give the selectmen the power to hire money if necessary.

Article 17. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees and elect same.

Article 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Middleton:

This report is submitted to you after only two weeks in your Union. I am particularly pleased to begin work here as it brings me back to a part of New Hampshire with which I am somewhat familiar. I anticipate a great deal of pleasure from being your Superintendent of Schools.

School supervision in Union No. 36 has been upset the last few months because of the changes in Superintendents. Much of the responsibility which is normally the administrator's has had to be assumed by School Board members. They and the teachers are to be commended for the fine conditions that have been maintained in the schools.

Your teacher this year is Mrs. Elma Howard. The closing of one school has crowded the Corner School building. There is probably no solution to this as the state has refused aid for more than one school in Middleton. Extreme scarcity of teachers makes us wonder how all positions are going to be filled for the school year 1944-1945. This year former teachers felt a sense of patriotic duty to return to the profession when local conditions became critical. I assume that it will be from this group that many districts will find faithful teachers.

Citizens of Middleton undoubtedly recognize the fact that the costs of maintaining schools are rising along with the increased cost of everything else. Taxes, living conditions, and the great scarcity of teachers have necessitated increased salaries; the cost of materials and labor makes all kinds of repairs higher, and other expenses have risen proportionally.

It seems extremely important during these times of unsettled conditions that the best education possible in reading, writing, arithmetic, and citizenship be main-

tained. This necessitates an unusual amount of effort, thought and patience on the part of citizens, teachers, and pupils. It is only through the cooperation of all concerned that the generation now growing up can be given an adequate education.
