The State of New Hampshire

- To the Inhabitants of the Town of Milton in the County of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:
- You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, with polls not closing before seven of the clock in the afternoon, to act on the following subjects:
 - 1. To bring in your ballots for Town Officers.
- 2. During the emergency to determine the salaries, wages, and other compensation and allowances for all persons serving the Town.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) to pay for breaking roads and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for sidewalk construction and repair and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for construction of the Class II road known as Union to Farmington road and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of two thousand two hundred fifteen dollars (\$2,215.00); and/or will

accept State Aid for the construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of two hundred forty-nine dollars (\$249.43) and forty-three cents.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200.00) to oil hard surfaced streets for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to be expended on private roads leading from "New Bridge" road, so-called, to cottages.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay Town charges and expenses and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the maintenance of hydrants in the Milton Fire Precinct.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for the maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year and to pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to pay the First and Second Engineers and Firemen in addition to the amount allowed by law; to see how much per hour the Town will vote to pay the engineers and firemen while fighting fires and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed three hundred

dollars (\$300.00) for the purpose of maintenance of the fire engine in the Milton Mills Fire District.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed two thousand three hundred and fifty dollars (\$2,350.00) for the maintenance of street lights for the ensuing year.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for Memorial Day expenses.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the benefit of the Free Public Library at Milton Mills and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire on notes of the Town a sum of money necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes of 1945 and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for continuing the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, thereby receiving the usual State aid.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for life guard and maintenance of Town Beach and to pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
- 20. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to expend from the treasury a sum not to exceed one-tenth of one per cent of the 1944 valuation for post-war work.

- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six thousand seven hundred seventy dollars (\$6,770.25) and twenty-five cents as its share of a new bridge between Lebanon, Me., and Milton as approved at the last town meeting.
- 22. By petition of Elizabeth A. Laskey and twenty-seven (27) others to see if the Town will vote to close the road leading from the East Side highway, so-called, at a point near Town Farm Hill to the State Highway.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of the Commissioners of the Milton Fire District

Your Commissioners wish to report the water system has gone through another year supplying adequate water of a good quality for home use and fire protection with no freezeups or breakdowns.

We have had several complaints about the milky look of the water immediately after drawn in a glass container, but would quickly clear up. Many believe this condition was caused by some chemical being put in the water for purification purposes. Our water at its source is of a quality that needs no treatment, a very small amount of soda ash is injected into the water as it passes through the pumps for the sole purpose of neutralizing any acid that might be there and greatly prolong the life of the system. The milky look that appears at times we believe due to air in the system, owing to the high pressure and the changes of ground temperature. It is no easy matter to eliminate this trouble. We have, however, found by careful checks of our two pumping units which we run alternately about two weeks at a time, that while one unit seems to quiet the condition the other seems to aggravate it which may be a clue that will solve the trouble when conditions get so we can work on it.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

Milton, 1943-1944

To the School Board and Citizens of Milton:

I am privileged to present my eleventh annual report, which I think is the thirty-fifth report to be made since Milton adopted supervision under state auspices.

The statistics given cover the school year ending June 30, 1944. You will note a slight increase in total enrollment and average membership. The per cent of attendance improved slightly and is satisfactory. The number of tardy marks is excessive compared with other schools in this Union. See my report of last The schools were in session six more days than in 1942-1943 due to the fact that no time was lost for government rationing. The school children have been consistent purchasers of war savings stamps and bonds. are continuing in scrap drives and helped to gather milk weed pods for use in making Mae West jackets for the sailors. The money obtained has been used in large part to purchase playground equipment. We again express appreciation to the town officials for help in maintaining a skating place at the Milton Grammar School. Weather conditions have not made a skating place feasible this year.

We have been fortunate to retain all the teachers at the Milton Grammar School and Nute Ridge. We secured a good teacher locally to succeed Mrs. Thurston at Milton Mills. Mrs. Thurston resigned late in the summer to take a more advantageous position in her home town in Maine. Mrs. Marion Stanley took her place. We were unable to secure a music supervisor.

Our transportation has continued just as last year. The ODT approved all routes as outlined but made no allowance for expansion.

Hot lunches are being provided just as last year, Mr. and Mrs. Blaisdell carrying on the work. We have been able to secure milk at Milton, Milton Mills and Nute High School. It is sold to pupils for two cents per half pint bottle. The distributor is paid four cents which is the ceiling price. The War Food Administration pays the other two cents. The WFA is also assisting in the lunch program by allowing rebates on approved foods purchased locally. The schools had no locally canned goods this year. The District owns several dozen quart glass jars which we hope can be filled again next summer.

The State Teachers' Association held a two-day meeting at Manchester in October and all of your teachers attended at least one day. Your superintendent also attended a very helpful meeting of the National School Administrators held in New York last February. He has made plans to attend a similar meeting in March of this year, provided the authorities grant the Association permission to hold the meeting.

We have been fortunate to secure fuel for all schools and with minor repairs all heating apparatus has functioned fairly well. Your superintendent was afraid that those in authority would force the consolidation of your schools in order to save fuel. Under present conditions further consolidation would have been impossible for lack of seating accommodations at Milton Village. In the opinion of the superintendent the day is not far distant when circumstances will bring about consolidation. In the long run money would be saved if the Milton Grammar School was enlarged and all pupils adequately housed there in a modern building. Transportation costs would increase very little since buses are already conveying pupils from West Milton and Milton Mills. The School District should give this matter serious attention as there may be, and probably will be, Federal funds available for building purposes after the present war is ended. Those communities with plans ready will be likely to be those first to benefit.

I commend for your reading the Report of the Headmaster of Nute High School, Mr. Elliot Burbank. The Trustees are to be congratulated for securing the services of this able educator. It was with difficulty that a teacher of Home Economics was secured and we had to go to Massachusetts. Miss Beatrice Hastings, a graduate of Framingham Teachers College, was secured to replace Miss Catherine Guyer, who entered into matrimony. The enrollment of the school is good considering that the war effort is taking both boys and girls from the upper classes.

This year as well as last your superintendent spends a great deal of time supervising defense courses and attending to details of lunch programs and other war demands. A great deal of paper work is done at the office. He has a secretary five days a week during the weeks that schools are in session but writing letters, ordering supplies and books, issuing tax exemptions and bookkeeping keeps her very busy.

Your school nurse is one of the busiest women in town. Owing to the scarcity of doctors her burdens have increased. The State Department of Education urges each year that money be provided either by the District or the Trustees so that the services of the nurse could be extended to Nute High School.

Again I must call your attention to the serious teacher situation. The National Education Association has just released these figures for the present school year:

"One teacher in every seven is new to his position."

"One teacher in ten is holding an emergency certificate."

"One teacher in five is paid less than \$1,200 for the year's work."

"These are times that try not only the souls of men but their ingenuity, determination and vision. Programs of school finance, teacher preparation, and teacher personnel can and must be improved." We need men and women of ability to make citizens intelligent enough to maintain a world order in which war shall play no part.

Report of the Headmaster of Nute High School

To the Superintendent of Schools and the Board of Trustees of Nute High School:

I hereby submit the annual report of Nute High School which opened its fifty-fourth year on September 6th with an enrollment of sixty-nine pupils divided as follows: Seniors, 13; Juniors, 14; Sophomores, 19; Freshmen, 23.

The staff consists of five teachers as follows:

Miss Marjorie E. Goodwin—Commercial and Economics

Miss Bertha M. Leathers—English and History
Miss Beatrice Hastings—Home Economics and
English

Mr. Stephen H. Perkins—Trades and Industries
Mr. Elliot W. Burbank—Mathematics and Science

The old and the new pupils were greeted with the improvements which had been made within the building during the vacation. The assembly hall had been entirely redecorated including the sanding and treating of the floor. The upper and lower halls leading to it were included in the work of the carpenters and painters. New composition treads and stainless steel edges replaced the old rubber treads on the stairs. In the laboratory a new fluorescent lighting unit had been installed in place of the old lighting fixture. Small philgas tanks have replaced the large cylinders thus reducing the annual expense for gas. The return pipes to the steam heating plant have been replaced at the request of the insurance inspector.

New equipment has been purchased for the laboratory including much needed apparatus and chemicals. New textbooks have been obtained for Sociology, Mathematics, Chemistry, and the Shop, together with books for class reference.

The boys in the shop classes, under the direction of Mr. Perkins, have aided several members of the community by doing various types of projects, such as cement work, putting up plaster board, and assisting and observing the construction of a garage. They are called upon to do repair jobs about the school premises. This practical work has proved very beneficial to them. The flag pole which was blown down in the September hurricane has been painted and stored with expectations of its being erected in the spring.

As has been the custom, hot lunches are being served at cost to those pupils who wish them. These lunches are prepared by girls from the home economics classes under the supervision of Miss Hastings. Milk is also provided at noon for two cents a half pint due to a Federal subsidy.

The critical shortage of manpower has made it necessary to call on the boys to assist in snow removal. This tends to upset the good attendance that has been enjoyed up to the winter months. Although these boys are performing a patriotic duty and a community service, their parents should recognize the fact that time thus lost, unless made up, hampers their education.

The work of the Student Activities Association has been continued as a democratic student governing body. At present it is sponsoring musical clubs and a school orchestra. A period at the end of the school day makes time available for extra-curricular activities.

The Southeastern League was revived this year with the opening of the basketball season. Games are

being played with its members. It is hoped that the rules of good sportsmanship and the making of new friends from the squads of other schools will broaden the outlook of our boys and girls.

I wish to thank the Superintendent, Board of Trustees, teaching staff and pupils for their fullest support. The success of Nute High School depends upon the continuation of this cooperative spirit.


