TOWN WARRANT

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs: YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, at 3:00 p.m. of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles:

POLLS will be open from 3:00 p.m. and close at 8:00 p.m.

BUSINESS MEETING to start at 7:00 p.m.

ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$51,120.00 to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1985.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction, or by advertised sealed bid, to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and accept gifts and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Nelson and grant them power to expend such funds.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the support of the Town Library.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$932.00 as the Town's share of the operating costs of the Home Health Care and Community Services.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$328.50 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00, this sum to be held in the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodeling of the Old Schoolhouse or Town Hall, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$445.00 as the Town's share for the Southwest Region Planning Commission.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Grand Monadnock Arts Council, or take any other action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 as the Town's share of the operating costs of a summer day camp sponsored by the Cheshire County YMCA.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$3,500.00 from the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund. This money to be used for construction of a leach field for the Town Hall/Schoolhouse.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$2,500.00 from the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund. This money to be used for the replacement of the woodshed at the rear of the Old Brick Schoolhouse.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$2,850.00 from the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund. This money to be used for painting and repairs to the Town Hall.

16. To see if the Town will vote that on the expiration of the term of the Road Agent at the Annual Meeting of the Town in 1985, that the Selectmen be and hereby are authorized thereafter to appoint the Road Agent in accordance with the Revised Statutes Annotated as amended.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH SERVICE AND PROTECTION

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 which sum is to be paid to the City of Keene for the use of its Landfill.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$234.00 as the Town's share for the operating costs of the Southwest Solid Waste Management District established under RSA 149-M. It being understood that these funds can only be used for planning purposes.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for Memorial Day purposes.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the

sum of \$4,500.00 for the proper expenses and member reimbursement of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that Townspeople will still be charged for individual calls.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new truck for the Fire Department, it will be understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by the vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Department.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,000.00 for the purchase of a new Fire Truck and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw \$42,500.00 from the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund for this purpose, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the remaining \$27,500.00 by Long Term Bond and/or Notes.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purchase of protective clothing for the Fire Department.

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the inspection and if needed, necessary repairs to the Fire Department's 3M1 pump.

26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the proper expenses of the Police Department.

27. To see if the Town will vote to establish a new Capital Reserve Fund and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for said fund. This Capital Reserve Fund to be applied to the purchase of a new or used vehicle for the Police Department. It being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Police Department.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$34,500.00 for wages in the maintenance of the roads and bridges.

29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,700.00 for General Highway expenses--gas, repairs and supplies.

30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to receive and appropriate the monies from the State Highway Block Grant. These monies to be used to offset summer and winter road maintenance.

31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action relating thereto.

32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Equipment Capital Reserve Fund it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Town Equipment Committee.

33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 for paving 1200 feet of McIntire Road.

34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for the extension (widening) of the Burns Brook Bridge on the Nubanusit Road.

35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for the construction of a salt shed by the Town Highway Barns.

36. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of R.S.A. 53-B:1 to 11 inclusive providing for the establishment of a regional refuse disposal district with the towns of Chesterfield, Fitzwilliam, Gilsum, Harrisville, Hinsdale, Marlborough, Nelson, Roxbury, Surry, Swanzey, Troy, and Westmoreland and the City of Keene, and the construction, maintenance, and operation of a regional refuse disposal facility by said district in accordance with the provisions of a proposed agreement filed with the selectmen.

37. To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as they may be legally be brought before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE CEMETERY BOARD

1984

During 1984 burial rights of three lots have been sold in the new section of the cemetery. In this period we have had one burial in the new section and two burials in the older portion.

Most of the routine work such as mowing, raking and repair and straightening of damaged grave stones has been completed as usual.

One exception to these items was in the fall raking of fallen leaves which could not be finished to the satisfaction of our Sexton, Mr. French. Two factors appeared responsible for this problem. One of these was adverse weather conditions and the other was in the difficulty in finding needed help.

The Cemetery Board recommends that the Town appropriate \$1,800 for the cemetery expenses in 1985.

SOUTHWEST REGION PLANNING COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

The scope and diversity of the work of the Commission is precedent setting in New Hampshire and the northeast, and has placed the SWRPC among the highest and most respected of Regional Planning Commissions serving our area of the country.

Regional Studies have been completed covering such topics as Land Use, Housing, Transportation, Recreation and Open Space, Economic Environment, Groundwater, Solid Waste and Septage Management.

Community Comprehensive Plans have been completed in 26 communities and are presently underway in three additional towns. Local zoning ordinances have been prepared for many of our member towns, as well as Historic Surveys which have been completed for several towns, including Nelson.

The Regional Planning Commission was instrumental in establishing the Southwest Solid Waste Management District, of which Nelson is a member. The Commission is also engaged in a major regional transportation effort to devise an innovative transportation system which will greatly expand the transportation opportunities to people throughout the region.

Several towns, including Nelson, have received assistance from the Regional Planning Commission in preparing applications for such grants as Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Urban Development Action Grants (UDAG), Land and Water Conservation Fund Grants and Farmer's Home Administration Grant and Loan Program.

In an effort to respond to the fiscal management needs of our communities in reducing the cost of government, the SWRPC has initiated a series of service programs such as cooperative purchasing, printing, and computer services.

Under the cooperative purchasing program, towns in the region join together in the bulk purchase of such items as fuel oil, gasoline, chemicals, etc. Nelson is an active participant in this program.

Computer services are greatly expanded to meet the growing needs of member towns. The Commission now has three computers which are capable of handling a myriad of member towns' needs. In addition, our portable computer enables us to offer a training program to those towns considering the purchase of "in house" computers.

Nelson has also taken advantage of the Commission's printing capabilities, and has had the Annual Reports for 1983 and 1984 done by SWRPC.

POLICE REPORT

This being my last report I would like to reflect on some of the gains that have been made in the past 4 years since I have been your Police Officer.

Pagers were purchased to make the members of the department available 24 hours a day.

A filing and case log system was instituted to keep reports separate and organized.

The hiring of certified people to establish professionalism and gain expertise.

Equipment has been updated slowly and is all inventoried to ensure accountability for what was purchased.

The budget has been kept in line with no overexpenditures.

To look ahead, I hope that the town will vote yes to establish the new capital reserve fund for the Police Department. This would be a good way to prepare for the future and make it financially easier to purchase capital equipment.

In closing I would like to thank the residents for giving me the opportunity and the support to serve the town. I would also like to thank the area police departments for continued assistance.

TOWN MEETING, MARCH 13, 1984

Minutes of the Town Meeting of Nelson, New Hampshire

The checklist was handed over to the Town Clerk and was signed by the Clerk and the Supervisors of the Checklist.

It was snowing hard when Moderator John Bradshaw commenced the meeting at 3:00 PM. ARTICLE ONE was read: "To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing". It was moved and seconded to suspend the reading of the rest of the warrant until the start of the business meeting. The polls were declared open, and voting began.

At 7:20 PM, with about 100 people in attendance, Moderator Bradshaw called the business meeting to order.

ARTICLE TWO: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,210.00 to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THREE: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1984". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE FOUR: "To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction, or by advertised sealed bid, to any proper buyer, any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE FIVE: "To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for and to accept gifts and/or Federal or State aid in the name of the Town of Nelson and grant them the power to expend such funds". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE SIX: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 for the support of the Town Library". It was then moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE SEVEN: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$766.50 as the Town's share of operating costs of the Home Health Care and Community Services". Selectman Richard Lothrop explained that the amount has gone up from \$1.00 per capita to \$1.75 per capita, in order to help make up a deficit. This service has helped many families in Town. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE EIGHT: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$328.50 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service". Selectman Lothrop explained that because of reduced federal and state support, costs have gone from \$.50 to \$.75 per capita. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE NINE: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$438.00 as the Town's share for the South-west Region Planning Commission". Selectman Lothrop explained that the Commission provides cooperative fuel purchasing, computer services, and solid waste management. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TEN: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,460.00 to develop a passive recreation area on the so-called Quigley Lot next to the Town Hall, furthermore, to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept, and extend a 50 percent matching grant from the Land and Water Conservation Fund of the U.S. Department of the Interior, to defray the expenses of said project. In the event that the said Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant is not awarded to the Town, the Selectmen shall have the authority to expend \$1,230.00 for said project". Selectman John Bunce explained that the land was purchased with private funds; \$230.00 is left from the purchase, and \$1,000.00 more would be raised by taxes. The money would be used to buy shrubs, more fill, and grass. "Passive" is a bureaucratic term that implies no active recreational equipment would be used or installed. Mr. Bunce said that anyone in Town who wants to be involved in the landscaping is welcome to help. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE ELEVEN: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00, this sum to be held in the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodeling of the Old Schoolhouse or Town Hall, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of

the Town". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWELVE: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Grand Monadnock Arts Council, or will take any other action relating thereto". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$340.00 as the Town's share of the operating costs of a summer day camp sponsored by the Cheshire County YMCA". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund the sum of \$7,500.00. This money is to be used for construction of a leachfield, and reconstruction of the restroom facilities of the Town Hall". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Bunce then explained that \$3,000.00 of the sum would go toward the new bathrooms; \$4,500.00 would be used for the septic system, including the leachfield. This expenditure would leave a balance of \$17,100.00 in the capital reserve fund. He said that the Town hoped to avoid problems caused by the poorly drained area behind the Town Hall by using drainage tile to meet the state standards. At present, sewage goes into a holding tank that is pumped out twice a year at an annual cost of \$100.00. Barry Tolman suggested that we rebuild the bathrooms but hold off on the leachfield until we are sure the holding tank is inadequate. Selectman Bunce said there would be some savings in digging it all up at once. It was then moved and seconded to amend the article to withdraw only \$3,500.00 from the capital reserve fund and use the money to do the inside plumbing and hook up to the holding tank. The article was adopted by voice vote as amended.

ARTICLE FIFTEEN: "To see if the Town of Nelson shall call upon the Governor and Executive Council, its State Representative (s), and State Senator to promptly convene a special session of the legislature for the sole purpose of preventing the imposition of exorbitant increases in the electric rates resulting from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant on the citizens, businesses, schools, and agencies in the Town of Nelson; and to direct the Selectmen to promptly notify our above listed elected officials of the Town's desire (by Petition)". Proponents of the article pointed out that costs of the Seabrook Plant have risen from \$990 million to an estimated \$10 billion, with dire consequences to the consumer.

It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE SIXTEEN: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for expenses that will be incurred in acquisition of Rye Pond property, if such property is given for the purpose of creating a Conservation Park and 50-50 matching federal Land and Water Conservation Funds are granted for said project". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Cornelia Iselin asked that the article be amended to read "to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for expenses of the Conservation Commission", because she felt that the group was not yet ready to apply for the grant. Selectman Bunce said that the Conservation Commission budget of \$100.00 was part of Article Two. Ms. Iselin said that would be sufficient, and withdrew the amendment. The article was defeated by voice vote.

ARTICLE SEVENTEEN: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00, which sum is to be paid to the City of Keene for the use of its landfill". Selectman Lothrop explained that the reduction of \$3,000.00 from 1983 was due to Keene's change in landfill procedure. The new policy requires the individual to buy tickets before using the landfill. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE EIGHTEEN: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Memorial Day purposes". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Ken Jeffery explained that the observance has been underfunded for years, and costs have gone up. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE NINETEEN: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the proper expenses and member reimbursement of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that the Townspeople will still be charged for individual calls". Selectman Jeffery noted that the Town spent \$1,902.00 in 1983 for this service. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-ONE: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new truck for the Fire Department, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Department". The Selectmen reported that \$29,500.00 is currently in the fund. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-TWO: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for the purchase of two self-contained breathing apparatus". This would replace a defective breathing apparatus bought last year and add another, Fire Chief Robert West explained. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-THREE: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the purchasing and outfitting of a vehicle for the Police Department". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. The liveliest discussion of the evening ensued during the next fifteen minutes. Selectman Bunce explained that Police Officer Michael Blaudschun has to use his personal car and personal insurance for Town business; the Town can only insure him for excess liability. The money would be used to buy a used car (\$3,500.00) and, also, to outfit it (\$500.00). Voters offered various alternatives, such as leasing a car, requiring public bids on a used car, and investigating the insurance situation further. An amendment was proposed and seconded to require that the car be purchased under public bid. The amendment was defeated by voice vote. A written ballot was requested for the vote on the article. The article was defeated, 51 against and 43 in favor.

ARTICLE TWENTY-FOUR: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,800.00 for the proper expenses of the Police Department". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Bunce corrected the 1983 Town Report by stating that Michael Blaudschun's salary as listed on Page 79 should read \$1,091.67, and not \$1,910.67. Since nearly half of the money requested had been set aside for maintenance of the vehicle requested in the previous article, Mr. Bunce offered an amendment to change the article to read \$2,230.00 instead of \$4,800.00. The amendment was seconded. During discussion on the amendment, the view that Mr. Blaudschun should be given more money instead of a car was offered. The amendment was defeated by voice vote. A second amendment was offered to change the sum in the original article to \$2,830.00. The amendment was seconded. The article

was passed by voice vote as amended to read \$2,830.00.

ARTICLE TWENTY-FIVE: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 for wages in the maintenance of the roads and bridges". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-SIX: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42,524.00 for General Highway expenses--gas, repairs, and supplies". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. The Selectmen explained that this figure is down \$1,800.00 from last year. The money would be spent as follows: approximately \$26,500.00 for normal maintenance; \$1,400.00 for a 9-foot plow; \$1,800.00 for the small sander; also, \$9,000.00 for paving McIntire Road and \$3,500.00 for the bridge at Burns Brook. The article was adopted by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-SEVEN: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to receive and appropriate the monies from the state Highway Block Grant. These monies to be used to supplement summer and winter road maintenance". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Jeffery amended the article to read "offset" instead of "supplement". The amendment was seconded. The amendment was adopted; the article was passed as amended by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-EIGHT: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other actions relating thereto".

It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Lothrop amended the article: the related article should be 25, not 24. The amendment was seconded. The article was adopted as amended by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-NINE: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may then be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment

except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Town Road Equipment Committee". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the purchase of 2 acres of land located on the southeast side of the present Town Barn, being a portion of the former Elliot Priest property". It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Bunce explained that the land could be used for storage, and as a site for future buildings. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY-ONE: "To see if the Town will vote to exchange .03 + acres owned by the Town next to John Bradshaw's garage on Old Stoddard Road for .03 + acres owned by John Bradshaw behind the present Highway Barn, with John Bradshaw paying all transfer fees". At this time, Don Bennett took over as Moderator, since Mr. Bradshaw was involved in the article under question. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY-TWO: "To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as they may be legally brought before the meeting". Terry Upton extended the gratitude of the Town to retiring Selectman Kenneth Jeffery. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:10 p.m. by Moderator Bradshaw, and voters shoveled out their cars and headed for home.

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

NOVEMBER 14, 1984

Minutes of the Special Town Meeting of Nelson, New Hampshire:

Moderator John Bradshaw called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Present at the meeting were 10 people: the moderator, the three selectmen, the town clerk, two supervisors of the checklist, and three other voters.

Moderator Bradshaw read the Warrant: "To see if the Town of Nelson will vote to create a special unpaid committee to be known as a Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Committee consisting of three persons to be appointed by the Moderator pursuant to RSA 53-B:1. This committee shall study the advisability of establishing a Regional Refuse Disposal District; may not obligate the Town in any way; and shall report back to the Selectmen and the Town for further action at a subsequent Town Meeting."

Selectman Richard Lothrop explained that the projected life of the Keene landfill, which Nelson uses for trash disposal, is only another two to four years. The State has set up solid waste management requirements that call for phasing out or strictly controlling landfills, and in our area of New Hampshire, a waste-to-energy facility plus a recycling program is recommended as a long-term solution. Nelson is one of 27 communities, mostly in Cheshire County, that can band together to form a Refuse Disposal District that will ultimately be able to negotiate with a firm such as Consumat Systems, Inc., of Richmond, Virginia, to build a trash-to-energy plant in our area, possibly in Marlborough. The job of the committee will be to investigate whether Nelson should join the district, and try to determine the Town's best way of handling the problem of waste disposal.

It was moved and seconded that the Article be adopted as read. The Article was passed unanimously. Mr. Lothrop volunteered for the committee; two others will be appointed.

It was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned. The Moderator, hearing no dissent, adjourned the meeting at 7:55 p.m.

This is an existing bridge which should be widened to eliminate a hazardous situation.

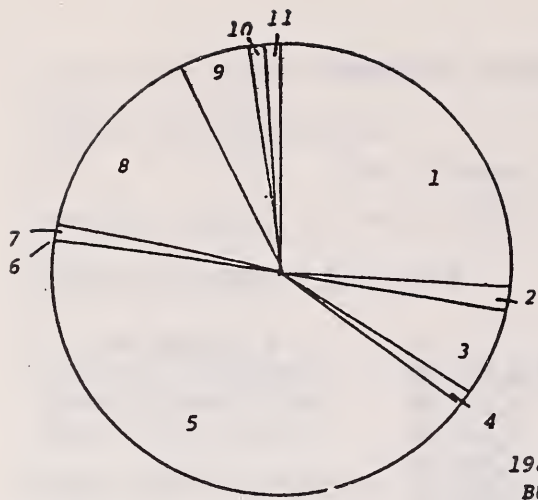

ANNUAL SCHOOL MEETING

March 9, 1984

The polls were opened for persons wishing to vote for the officers listed by nonpartisan ballot as required by law by the Moderator, Ethan C. Tolman, at the Nelson Town Hall at 5:00 p.m. The Moderator announced that the polls would be opened until 10:00 p.m.

The checklist was handed over to the Clerk, and signed by the Clerk and the Supervisors of the checklist.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. The Moderator asked that it be moved and seconded to pass over the reading of the warrant in favor of saving time. It was so moved and seconded, and the motion passed.

The chairman of the School Board, David Upton, passed out information sheets covering budget distribution.

The Superintendent of Schools, Richard Champagne, David Hill, a Supervisory Union administrator, and Lawrence Seavey, Assistant Superintendent of Towns were introduced by the Moderator. It was stated that these gentlemen would be available to answer questions throughout the meeting.

Article 1.

Richard Church, member of the School Board, gave his report regarding the repairs made to the waste disposal system at the Munsonville Elementary School; the total amount used for these repairs was \$2,839.00, rather than the \$6,847.87 which was appropriated from the Capital Reserve Fund for said purpose at the District Meeting in March 1983.

Motion was made and seconded to accept Mr. Church's report with thanks to him and his committee for a job well done and to approve as printed all reports contained in the Nelson School District Annual Report. The motion carried.

Article 2.

Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 2 as read. The motion carried.

Article 3.

Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 3 as read. David Upton explained that this would allow the use of "unanticipated funds" without the need for a meeting. He said last year \$4,673.00 unanticipated dollars of federal money was made available, allowing five students in math, and sixteen students in science to receive tutoring. The motion passed.

Article 4.

Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 4 as read. Karen Tolman, member of the School Board, explained that this money is what would have been spent if the fifth grade went to Camp Union. She said the staff planned to research other options this year. Pat Colby suggested that they look into an internship program with one of the several colleges in the area. Sandra Upton then shared her experiences at Camp Union with those present at the meeting. The Moderator suggested that it be formally proposed to look into the option of an internship program. The motion passed.

Article 5.

Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 5 as read. Richard Church reminded the meeting that the \$500.00 usually deposited in the Capital Reserve Fund stood the school in good stead last year when improvements to the septic system were needed and the money was there and available. He recommended that the practice be continued. The motion carried.

Article 6.

Motion was made and seconded "that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$272,097.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for payment of statutory obligations of the District." David Upton explained that the increase from \$259,987.00 as originally written in the warrant was because four more children were counted only two days prior to the meeting, therefore the increase in the number of tuitions had to be added into the budget. David Upton then explained the handouts concerning budget distribution. Pat Colby suggested that it might be worthwhile to look into IBM (or other computer company) who might be interested in donating used equipment to the school. Mr. Upton agreed.

During discussion of staff salaries and fringes, Mr. Upton said they had attempted to develop a system to reward teacher growth and productivity with a comparable salary increase. Mrs. Colby stated that it wasn't clear to her how a salary increase promoted better teaching, she felt that time spent teaching had a more direct impact on the quality of teacher. Mr. Upton said that the idea was that teachers here had to perform to high standards, and this would be used as a guideline to potential earnings. Mrs. Colby suggested that she still did not feel comfortable with the Salary Comparison Chart (Towns SAU 29) as written, without further explanation that although it is possible to achieve a certain salary level under a merit system, it is not necessarily certain that a teacher will receive this maximum increase.

Vote was cast and the motion was passed as presented.

Article 7.

It was moved and seconded to accept Article 7 as read. Nancy Stretch, speaking for the Community Council, explained that two attempts to get the townspeople involved in scraping and painting the exterior of the school had been made, with only four or five people coming each time. The decision was made then to hire someone to do the job. She stressed that it was very important for the children to have a good environment to go to. The motion carried.

Article 8.

Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 8 as read. Nancy Stretch, again representing the Community Council, said that this money would be used to restore the equipment that was there, as well as to build an "owls nest"--different play levels which could be built with tires and telephone poles and whatever else was on hand. . She said Ms. Fink expressed interest in involving the children in this project, measuring, calculating areas, and building etc. The motion carried.

Article 9.

It was moved and seconded that the district take no action under Article 9. Vote was cast and the motion carried.

Article 10.

To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

It was moved and seconded to adjourn the meeting, and it was so done.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD CHAIRMAN

Learning and teaching at the Munsonville School continue to progress successfully for our students, and staff, as they enjoy the unanimous support of parents and community, school board and school administration.

Our goals and our budgets outline your school board's intentions to provide our students with a rewarding educational experience and to provide our teaching staff with the support and encouragement they need to maintain their professional growth, and their personal enthusiasm. Our goals for the 1984-1985 school year are listed below:

INSTRUCTION

1. To continue curriculum development emphasizing our best understanding of individual learning process, appropriate teaching methods, and student progress evaluation.
2. To continue to develop programs, training, and materials for improved teaching and learning in science, social studies, and the arts.
3. To encourage curriculum articulation with the Keene schools through comparison of existing programs, considering teacher, student, and parent viewpoints. (Articulation in no way implies that curricula will be developed solely by Keene teachers and then imposed on our school.)

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

4. To involve parents and other members of the community in the planning, operation, and outcomes of the school program.

DEVELOPMENT

5. To institute a performance evaluation/salary award process that is fair and positive; one that identifies specific strengths and weaknesses in individual staff member's abilities, rewards those strengths and corrects those weaknesses.
6. To assure staff enthusiasm and competency by providing opportunities for advanced degree work, community relations projects, towns/Keene committee service, and creative classroom project assignments.

LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

7. To continue to place emphasis on developing an educational atmosphere within the Munsonville School that provides for the individual differences of each student, and produces students who value themselves and other people.

FACILITIES

8. To develop a multiyear plan to provide direction to the district for maintenance of facilities.
9. To develop the playground at Munsonville School.

The 1984-1985 budget, passed last March, contains, along with the usual items for instructional materials and programs, facilities, and transportation, monies for a newly devised salary funding plan, participation of each full-time teacher in a graduate level college course, our principal's membership in the state principals' association, and funds to support a summer curriculum development project. Using this curriculum money, Judy Sargent and Judy Fink developed an integrated science and social studies program for all six grades at the Munsonville School. This investment created a learning experience for our teachers, and resulted in them making a major contribution to our school. We plan to continue to support local efforts toward instructional program improvements. We also plan to continue to improve our salary plan for our professional staff.

Please support our 1985-1986 school budget, and join with us as we strive toward achieving our goal of making the Munsonville School the best elementary school our children could attend.

Principal's Report

The 1984-85 school year began on September 4 with a student enrollment of 37 and three new staff members. Fourteen of our children were new to the school this year. New staff members included: Mr. Kent Gemmell (psychologist), Ms. Patricia Wilson (Speech and Language therapist), and Ms. Melissa Woods (Chapter I teacher).

Ms. Sargent and Ms. Fink, with the support of the Nelson School Board, designed and have implemented a Science/Social Studies Curriculum which combines the basic skills in these areas as well as "Critical Thinking" skills. Each area within the curriculum includes art, music, drama, and language arts specific to the unit. This continuum will be evaluated during the summer of 1985.

The playground is in the process of upgrading through the support of Nelson residents and the School Community Council members. Some of the existing equipment has been repaired and new equipment will be purchased in the spring. The school building was scraped and stained during the summer creating an appearance we can be proud of. A subgroup of the School Community Council is working on long-range site plans in order to continue upgrading the area surrounding the school.

The children continue to be involved with the STAMM math program, the language arts continuum, computer education, music, art, and a variety of reading programs designed to meet each child's individual needs.

The Chapter I program is in its second year and continues to provide additional instruction in the areas of reading, math and language arts.

The continuation of support and encouragement from parents, community members, Nelson School Board members, and School Administrative Unit 29 personnel has enabled the staff to create an environment in which the children can reach their maximum potential both academically and emotionally.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

At the beginning of the school year, records were readied to transfer to the Keene Junior High School for all outgoing sixth grade students, and were delivered to the School Nurse, Karen Reedstrom. New records were started for all students who entered the first grade, and transfer students from other schools. Each student now has an individual health folder.

Heights, weights, blood pressures, and head checks were done for all students. Head checks are done again when students return from Christmas vacation, and all other vacation periods. Eye testing and hearing tests were done for new and fourth grade students.

Dr. McMurphy, School Physician, did fourth grade physical examinations in November. This is a good opportunity to have the students checked during their elementary growth period; and I want to urge parents to allow their children to participate in this program.

As I am only at the school three hours, once a week, I cannot monitor all the health activities for the students, especially emergency or accidental care. The teachers at the school have had to take care of this on a daily basis. I feel that they are doing an excellent job, and I will try to help them in this capacity.

During the rest of the school year, I will be trying to have more educational sessions relative to health, utilizing services offered through the media department at the Day Center.

I have enjoyed working with the staff and students at Munsonville School. What it lacks in size is more than made up in heart.
