TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston, in the County of Hillsborough, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Boston on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, Polls to close at 6 o'clock P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.
 - (a) For town officers' salaries.
 - (b) For town officers' expenses.
 - (c) For election and registration.
 - (d) For the expense of the town hall.
 - (e) For the police department.
 - (f) For the fire department.
 - (g) For the health department.
 - (h) For vital statistics.
 - (i) For summer maintenance of highways.
 - (j) For winter maintenance of highways.
 - (k) For street lighting.

- (1) For general expense of the highway department.
- (m) For the support of the library.
- (n) For town poor.
- (o) For old age assistance.
- (p) For Memorial Day and care memorial.
- (q) For interest.
- (r) For payment of long term notes.
- (s) For town dump.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$539.25, the state to contribute the sum of \$2,350.46 for town road aid, or act in relation thereto.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a road grader, or act in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to build any bridge, raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for cooperation with the state in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust, or act in relation thereto.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to petition the Division of Accountancy of the State Tax Commission to audit the town accounts, raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or administer real estate acquired by gift or tax deed.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of New Boston:

It is with pleasure that I submit my annual report as Superintendent of your schools.

One change in the teaching staff has occurred since last year. Miss Hilda K. Cate of Laconia, a graduate of Plymouth, replaced Miss Eastman who left us for a position in Beverly, Massachusetts.

The enrollment last year as will be seen by the table accompanying this report was 131 as compared with 140 the year before. The high school enrollment has increased slightly which is gratifying at a time when high school students in many communities are leaving school for employment.

Out of School Youth courses are being continued with Federal aid. The classes in food preservation last summer and fall were among the most successful in the state. A course in the care and repair of farm machinery is being conducted this winter and plans are already under way for a community canning center next summer. This project will provide modern equipment which can be used for many years. The work of Miss Coburn and Headmaster Nedeau in these projects merits appreciation.

Teachers and pupils have cooperated in a fine manner to meet the increased demands of war and to prepare our students for the peace which will follow. The aims and objectives of instruction have been the training of youth for the immediate tasks at hand as well as to equip them with the knowledge and experience needed to live in the world of the future as worthy citizens.

Immediate demands for assistance in the war effort have been efficiently and cheerfully met in our schools. High school students saved perishable crops with their hard work during the harvesting season. In recognition of their efforts they received a cup presented by the New Hampshire Horticultural Society for working the greatest number of hours per pupil of any school in the state. The elementary pupils are purchasing war stamps in great volume. During the first half year they bought over \$800 worth and are well on their way to buy a jeep.

Teaching of the basic skills is the essential task of the schools and it is our policy to see that the job is thoroughly done by means of the best accepted methods. In order for pupils to succeed in school work it is necessary that they possess a good foundation in reading habits and abilities. For this reason the major part of book expenditures has been to equip elementary grades with a good reading system supplemented by workbook exercises for reading growth with correct language habits in writing and speaking.

We as citizens owe our gratitude to the teachers who have remained loyal to their profession of teaching. Like their sisters in the armed forces, the Wits, our Women In Teaching Service, are protecting our social structure from danger. What our civilization may be tomorrow depends in large measure upon what the present generation becomes.

The future offers a great challenge. The shortage of teachers was acute last year; now it is alarming. It will remain serious even after the war because new teachers are being trained in smaller and smaller numbers. Teacher college enrollments now are the smallest in many years. Consolidated schools and better salaries are measures which will be adopted in the most progressive towns to provide better advantages for children and to secure the best of available teachers.

The cooperation of parents, other citizens, and members of the school organization is greatly apreciated.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

Every child should make a regular annual gain; therefore, each pupil is weighed and measured at the beginning of the school year, then several times before the close of school in June, so that we may ascertain their rate of growth according to the scale prepared by the State Board of Health.

The normal weight is judged according to the height and age of the child.

About 125 pupils were examined the first of the school year by Dr. Fraser, and the parents notified of any weakness or defect found.

Frequent use of the clinics affords an opportunity for an early diagnosis, treatments and corrections without any or but little cost.

Due to the shortage of doctors in the fall of 1943, we have been unable to take advantage of the heart clinics usually held the first of each month at the Elliot Hospital.

The same condition exists in the dental profession, and we regret that we have been unable to hold our usual dental clinic this year. Our last clinic was held in April, 1942.

We have been more fortunate with the orthopedic clinics for treatment by appointment only was given to several of our physically handicapped children in this Union.

This past year has been unusually free from any kind of an epidemic.

Record of annual examination and follow-up work from September, 1942 to December, 1943:

Defective vision, 25—number of defects corrected, 20.

Defective teeth, 95—number of defects corrected, 45.

Diseased tonsils, 6—number of cases corrected, 3.

There have been 10 cases of chicken pox this month, January, 1943.

There were 4 orthopedic cases. One boy had his foot operated on at the Shrine Hospital in August, 1942, and went for a check up in July, 1943.

One girl has been attending the orthopedic clinics held at the Elliot Hospital.

One boy received treatment at the County Hospital in September, 1943—leg ailment.

One boy suffered a fractured leg.

Accompanied two girls to the heart clinic in January, 1943. No organic disease was found.

I gave the high school a demonstration on the blood bank at the time the Red Cross was asking for blood donors. The equipment was loaned to me by Sister Eva, laboratory technician, at the Notre Dame Hospital.

We are in hopes to have the audiometer for testing the hearing this Spring.
