A motion was made by J. Henry Greenwood and duly seconded by James Snow that the Water Department be required to submit in the Town Report in similar form as the Selectmen a month by month item by item report of expenses listing:

- (1) to whom paid
- (2) For what purpose
- (3) Total amount paid.

Voted in Affirmative.

A resolution was made by Edgar Sargent of Green. Hills that the Selectmen work with Mr. Foley in con-

junction with the lawyers in resolving the road situation at Green Hill Estates, and to report back to the next Town Meeting be it a Special or Annual.

Voted in Affirmative.

A motion was made by Gary Hyre and duly seconded by George Goldzung that the Raymond Medical Center find quarters elsewhere, on their own, somewhere besides the Fire Station, hopefully in the Town of Raymond, within six months time from March 11, 1972, and that the Selectmen contact them regarding same.

Voted in Affirmative.

This action was taken in reply to a letter written to the Selectmen dated 2/23/72.

A resolution was presented by Frank Wilich as follows: "We, the people of Raymond wish to express our appreciation and thanks to Mr. James Turner for his dedicated service to the Town of Raymond over the past three years."

A hearty round of applause was accorded Mr. Turner.

A resolution was presented by William Prince, Sr., that the Selectmen be instructed to stop demanding the serial numbers of hand guns when permits are issued.

Voted in Affirmative.

William Grance informed the assembly he had obtained a pistol permit two years ago with no serial numbers given and it was signed by the Selectmen including Gordon Cammett.

A resolution was presented by Barbara Clement that the town give a vote of thanks to Mr. John Harney in appreciation of service rendered to the Town of Raymond for taking care of the Police, Ambulance and Fire Telephones.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative State-town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire, remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Because Warden, Raymond Smith, passed away last November, I will make a brief report of the Fire Service for 1972.

We had a good year due mainly to the fact that it was a wet season. Alsm, most citizens seem to be more fire conscious and willing to cooperate with the Fire Service.

We had 9 Brush and/or Grass fires, and 2 calls to the Town Dump to which the Fire Department had to respond. Also, there were numerous calls to check out smoke, called in from the Look-out Towers.

I know "Ray" would want me to thank all Departments and the citizens for their cooperation during the year. This I do in his behalf.

Since the State has now appointed me as the Warden, I will issue Permits under the same conditions as the State law requires. You **do** need Permits for any outside burning, including incinerators, except when the ground is covered with snow.

Raymond Fire Department

The following is a brief report of the Fire Department for the year 1972

We had a total of 68 alarms as follows:

37 Box or outside alarms, 22 Still or Phone Calls and 9 over the Monitor System......

18 Building

- 6 Trailers
- 9 Brish and Grass fires
- 2 Town Dump fires
- 6 Car fires
- 3 Auto accidents
- 5 False Alarms
- 5 No School
- 2 Chimney fires
- 7 Miscellaneous Calls
- 5 Mutal Aid calls

These lires involved taxable property valued at approximately \$993,000.00 with an estimated loss of \$294,550.00. Our greatest loss, of course, was the Regis Tannery.

We received Mutual Aid once from Exeter, Fremont, Chester, Deerfield, Newfields, Newmarket and Kingston. Twice from Epping and Candia. We responded to Mutual Aid once to Fremont and Nottingham and three times to Brentwood.

This year we received our State Forestry Truck and, with the assistance of the firemen, we installed an 800 Gallon water tank which was custom made to fit the truck. A new 300 Gallon p.m. portable pump is connected to the thank which can be removed quickly and carried to a source of water that cannot be reached with the truck. This truck is also equipped with a new radio, chain saw, axes, indians (back pumps) and 1000 feet of 1-2" hose. We hope to install a 10 ton winch which could prove useful in many ways..i.e. rescue work, auto accidents, etc.

It was necessary to buy some 2½" hose after the Tannery fire since the old hose, purchased in the 1930's, could not withstand the pressure and burst several sections. However, we still have, and are using, some of this old hose which will eventually have to be replaced. We also purchased a new 3 sectioned 40 foot extention ladder because we did not own a ladder capable of reaching some third floor apartments.

In November of last year we lost, by death, our oldest fireman, Raymond H. Smith who was the Forest Fire Warden and my 1st Deputy. Needless to say we all miss "Ray"...He was a very faithful and devoted fireman in all respects.

The position of Forest Fire Warden has now been turned over to me since the State desires the Fire Chief of each town to assume the duties of the Fire Warden. This position requires someone be available at all times, especially during the forest fire season, to issue Permits for outside burning, including incinerators, and for checking and investigating all suspected fires, making the position of Chief more comples than before. Therefore, since the Town has greatly increased, and is still increasing, in population and valuation, the workload, with it's additional paper work, time-consuming investigations and added responsibility, has also increased. For this reason, my budget for 1973 includes funds necessary to sustain a full time Fire Chief who will be able to devote the required time necessary to perform the duties of the Fire Department and Forest Fire Service.

A REPORT OF THE TANNERY FIRE

On Monday, July 10, 1972 at 5:34 P.M., we were called for a fire in the Tannery. This fire was in the ceiling and under the roof in the center of the building.

We laid 1200 ft. of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " hose and the fire was put out in a short period of time with an estimated loss of \$6000.00.

On Sunday, July 16, 1972 at 9:55 P.M. we were, again, called for a fire in the Tannery. Arriving on the

scene, we found a "working" fire in the east end of the building, over the truck storage part of the Tannery. The fire was in progress under the roof with some fire showing through the roof. A 2½" hose line was laid from the hydrant near the Reed home, and a second line from the hydrant by the Tannery. Firemen were raising a ladder to get onto the roof as the water was being turned on, and to our dismay we discovered we did not have pressure enough to reach the roof! (about 5 lbs!). A third line was laid from the hydrant in front of Harry Doane's house, and when turned, THIS hydrant was found to be broken off below ground level!

I radioed the Fire Station to send Eng. no.1, (the old Maxim truck) to lay a line from the hydrant by the Common, and for Eng. no2 to hook up at the same hydrant to give us extra pressure, if needed.

At 10:05 P.M. with 3 lines laid and no water, I called for Mutual Aid from Fremont and Epping, as the fire was progressing very rapidly.

At 10:15, there were explosions erupting within the building, so a call was sent to Exeter, our Mutual Aid Dispatch Center, for a general Mutual Aid Assistance. Exeter sent their new aerial ladder and called Chester, Candia and Deerfield.

Candia hooked their pumper to the hydrant by the Fruit Store and pumped water through 2, 2½" lines to Exeter's aerial aldder which was set up at the east end of the Tannery to protect the houses nearest the fire. Epping fed two lines from the hydrant by the Congregational Parsonage while Fremont stood by at our Station and later laid all their 2½" lines to supplement the pumpers already working.

Meanwhile, the firemen had pulled back the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " lines that were without pressure and hooked up to Eng. no2 making 3, $2\frac{1}{2}$ " lines from this truck. Deerfield and Chester, under the direction of Lieut. Ted Welch, laid 2, $2\frac{1}{2}$ " lines, from the river, near Cooley's Beach. These 2 lines fed our 500 Gallon p.m. Deluge Gun, which was set up mid-way of the fire.

The fire, by this time, had traveled the entire length

of the building with all kinds of explosions coming from within, from propane tanks, chemicals, etc., some with such force, they lifted the roof. Tank trucks hauled water to the railroad side of the fire, as the grass and trees were burning, and there was one 500 Gallon propand tank that had to be kept cool by a constant stream of water.

By 11:45 P.M. the fire was under control. Exeter's Chief Toland and I agreed that a lot more water would be needed to wet down the fire, so another call for additional Mutual Aid brought in Newmarket, Newfields and Kingston, each with 1000 Gallon p.m. pumpers. Kingston also sent their hose wagon which laid a 4" line from the bridge by Welch's: Newmarket laid a 2½" line from the same bridge with Newmarket and Newfields pumping into these two lines to relay-pumpers set up by the Methodist Church. We were then able to discontinue using the Town water supply. These four pumpers continued pumping until 2:05 A.M., when we felt we could handle any remaining fire ourselves. All Mutual Aid trucks were then released to return to their home stations..the last one leaving about 3:00 A.M.

Our Engine no2 pumped most of the following day from Cooley's Beach into lines left, for our use, by Chester, Deerfield and Fremont. It was 9:00 P.M. July 17, when our last truck returned to the station.

It took several of our firemen nearly two days to pick up hose, wash, dry and reload the trucks. Hundreds of feet of hose, belonging to other Departments also had to be treated in like manner and returned to their respective towns.

It was approximately 11 o'clock, that night, when we finally were able to enter the building to discover the reason why we had no water pressure from the first two lines we had laid. We found that the 6" main, that fed the sprinkler system in the Tannery; had fallen and broken off completely, thereby losing all the water from the 6" main on Wight Street. The shut-off valve, for the 6" main that served the sprinkler system, was under a truck that had been consumed by fire. After removing the truck, we were able to close the valve thereby restoring the pressure on Wight Street.

During the fire there were 50, or more, explosions of propane tanks and chemicals, etc. Steel Lally columns, filled with cement, looked like opened fans after they exploded. There were pieces of cement blocks that were propelled as far away as 1000 ft., and so hot, you could not touch them. Several of the residents, living nearby, vacated their homes at the height of the fire.

There were so many cars and spectators, at the scene, the Police had to close all roads coming into Town, as this fire was seen as far away as Hootsett, Portsmouth and Haverhill, Mass!

Besides our own 7 trucks, we had: 8 pumpers, 8 tankers, 1 aerial ladder and 1 hose wagon, which were accompanied by approximately 76 firemen. There were also 6 firemen, from Salem, N.H. who, having heard of the fire on their monitors, came in private cars and relieved our men with the hose lines and-or helped where ever their assistance was needed. Assistance was also offered by the Londonderry, Derry and East Derry Fire Departments plus other members of our Mutual Aid System who were standing by. Our own Ambulance Association, with it's entire crew, were in readiness for any emergencies.

There was approximately 12,000 ft. of hose used and an estimated 1,000,000 gallons of water pumped on this fire and, although it was considered a total loss, there were thousands of dollars worth of machinery and leather that was salvaged. This was due to the continual pumping of enormous amounts of water which kept the fire under control as far as humanly possible.

Any major fire, such as this, proves how important communications are, since all the surrounding communities were aware of our situation, and many Departments called in standy crews in case they were needed.

Thanks to our Radio man, Ed Thompson, we were in contact with all out of town trucks, while en route, and had their set-up locations prearranged by the time they arrived.

We will be forever grateful to all the citizens and outsiders who helped pull hose or assisted the firemen in

any way. Also, thanks to the generousity of the Raymond Fruit Store and Cammett's Country Store, all the fire fighters were given refreshments and cigarettes. The Long Branch Restaurant served breakfast, free of charge, to any fireman wishing one.

To this day, it's unbelievable and miraculous, considering the crowd of spectators, volunteer helpers and all the firemen, that no one was hurt. We were fortunate that a Greater Power, than ourselves, was with us that night.

The Ambulance Boys, as always, have been working with the Dept. as standby men and sending the Ambulance on all fire calls in the event their services might be needed.

Last, and most importantly, I wish to thank all my firemen for their faithful response to their duties and dedicated cooperation during this past year..all 28 of them.

This is the twelfth annual report that I am privileged to prepare for the citizens of Raymond, explaining the activities and functions by your Police Department.

The year 1972 was a very busy year, every service that the Department performs shows an increase. On April 5th the Police Department completed it's first year with a full time officer and by the mandate of the citizens, the Chief's job became a full time position. In 1967 the Department requested and was furnished with it's first cruiser based on a 30,000 mile a year factor. In 1972 the Department was furnished with it's second cruiser and the actual mileage for 1972 was 51,000 miles, which is due to the curiser being used 2 full shifts a day. If eel that this is a very good growth pattern and hope and urge that it be continued.

Motor vehvenicle accidents show an increase and there were 3 unfortunate fatals in the Town. Many theories and safety measures have been projected to curb these statistics each year and even though some may help, until we remove from our highways the real cause of these statistics, the habitual offenders and the people who cannot adjust to the responsibility of operating a motor vehicle on the highways, then every report such as this one will have to contain these statistics.

Burglary during 1972 shows a sharp increase over 1971. The encouraging statistic here is the fact that more than half of these burglaries have been solved. The only proven method of reducing these figures is by increased patrol. I feel in comparison to the crime report figures your Department has done a good job in this line.

Juvenile problems took a big jump this year, both in Court and out of Court action. The real answer to this

You are hereby notified to meet at Raymond High School in said Raymond on Saturday, the Tenth day of March, next at one of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell at public auction any property acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) to reimburse, impart, the Seacoast Regional Office of Child & Family Services of New Hampshire, a private charitable organization, for services rendered to five (5) families of the Town of Raymond during the calendar year of 1972 who were unable to pay for said services.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the Seacoast Regional Counseling Center.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for control of pest at the Town Dump.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a Building Inspector to administer the functions of issuing permits and inspection to insure compliance with the recommendations of the Planning Board.

Article 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Seven hundred and seventy-nine dollars and forty-eight cents (\$779.48) for Town Road Aid.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty thousand dollars (30,000.00) for the purpose of a revaluation of property in the Town of Raymond by the State Tax Commission, or an approved private organization.

Article 10. To see if the Town will adopt the voluntary semi-annual payment of taxes as outline in RSA 80:52 (a).

"Any town by vote at a town meeting under a proper article in the warrant and any city by vote of its governing board may authorized the pre-payment of taxes and authorize the collector of taxes to accept payments in prepayments of taxes. If a town or city so votes, any person, firm or corporation owning taxable property on April first may, after April first and before notice of the amount of taxes assessed against said property for that year has been received, make payments on account of such taxes in the sums of not less than ten dollars or in any sum divisible by ten dollars and the collector shall receive such payments and give a receipt therefor and credit the amounts paid toward the amount of the taxes eventually against said property. In any town or city which shall vote to authorize the prepayment of taxes the collector of taxes shall file such bond in the form and amount which the tax commission shall require, and he shall pay over all sums so received to the town treasurer under the provision of RSA 41:35."

If adopted a tax-payer may, at his own option, pre-pay one half of his current years taxes between 15-30 June, the remainder to be billed on the usual date, 15

November. If taxpayer elects to pay semi-annually he shall pay between 15 - 30 June one half of the amount of last years tax bill. The balance billed in November, will reflect whatever increase or decrease has occured, and will be discounted at the rate of 2% if paid before 31,-December.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the National Building Code and the National Fire Protection Association Life Safety Code 101 as recommended by the State of New Hampshire Department of Safety Division of Safety Services.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) for the purchase of office equipment.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the removal of dead trees.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) to gravel and widen twelve hundred feet (1200) of the Bald Hill Road.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) to gravel and widen sixteen hundred feet (1600) of the Prevere Road.

Article 16. To see if the Town will approve the expenditure of Revenue Sharing Funds to build and equip a Town Office Building total cost not to exceed the total of two years Revenue receipts.

The original cost of this complete package was twenty thousand two hundred ninety-three dollars and sixty-eight cents (\$20,293.68). We have paid in lease eight thousand four hundred ninety-one dollars and sixty-eight cents (\$8,491.68). This lease money will be deducted from the twenty thousand two hundred ninety-three dollars and sixty-eight cents(\$20,293.68)leaving the balance of eleven thousand eight hundred two dollars (\$11,802.00). (Duplication of last years article).

Article 18. On petition of fourteen (14) voting residents of Raymond to see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Summer Recreation and Water Safety Program to be supervised by the Raymond Boosters, Inc.

Article 19. On petition of thirteen (13) voting residents, to see if the Town will vote the following;

Do you favor adoption of the Town Manager Plan as provided in Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes Annotated.

"Yes" or "No"

Article 20. On petition of thirteen (13) voting residents, to see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) to finance the Town Manager plan as provided in Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes Annotated.

Article 21. On petition of Leon Duval (Englewood Mobile Home Park) and eleven (11) others, to see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road subject to gates and bars leading from the residence of Leon Duval to the Harriman Road.

to see if the Town will accept the roads in Green Hills Estates and assume responsibility for maintenance and snow plowing, as shown on the entitled, "Green Hills Subdivision," recorded in the Rockingham County Registry of Deeds, a copy of said plan being on file at the Town Office of the Town of Raymond, so that said roads will be maintained and plowed by said Town of Raymond to the same extent, and in the same manner as all other roads of said Town of Raymond will be treated fairly and equally in respect to the maintenance and snow plowing of roads.



problem lies squarely on the shoulders of the parents of these juveniles, and when these parents and all parents start exercising parental control this problem will take a very sharp decrease.

Having touched on some of our most time consuming functions, I would like to relate a few plans for the coming year. The bicycle project, although not completed but still very important, has improved tremendously due primarily to the cooperation the Police Department received from the "kids" themselves when requested to equip their bicycles with lights and reflectors. Proper operation of bicycles is next and if the response and cooperation is the same, I feel the bicycle situation will be under control.

Having spent a considerable amount of time in the school area and having changed the speed limits, it became very evident that during the late school dismissal on the short winter days, that the lighting and signing of this area has to be changed and improved. With the cooperation of the Selectmen the lighting will be vastly improved. The two local banks have participated in a sign program and these signs will be installed in the very near future. I feel certain that every citizen will be pleased with these improvements.

In closing this report I am sure we are all aware of the shopping center that has been developing just outside of town, and the projected increase in population and growth of our community, I have submitted a budget that I feel is essential and necessary to conduct the business of this Department with the least amount of increase to the taxpayer. If the caliber of men required to do this job is to be maintained and the schooling necessary to provide the best service, then the funds necessary to provide these men must be made available.

All dogs six (6) months old and over must be licenced each year beginning May 1st of the current year. Licenses may be paid for at the Town Clerk's Office. After July 1st a penalty of \$1.00 will be charged.

The tranquilizer gun purchased by the Town has proved very successful. I have helped two other towns when they have been in trouble with dogs and they were very grateful.

I would like to thank Mrs. Belle Jones for her interest in our animals and for her generous contributions to the Town, for their care.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

What is a Planning Board?

Basically, it is a board authorized by State law, with specific duties and limitations. It is a permanent board, composed of 6 members, made up of citizens like yourselves who are appointed by the Selectmen for a term of 5 yrs. Its main duty is to Plan. Plan for the future of your town as a whole. Future only, as what already exists cannot be made to go away but what does not exist can be regulated for the good of the town.

The Planning Board should try to identify the problem areas of the Town, present or future, actual, probable or possible, and work along with other applicable town boards or officers as necessary to arrive at a solution or preventative measure for the future.

Since the Planning Board has no direct authority in most cases, what it learns of these problem areas it must bring to the citizens, you voters, and what it considers the best solutions or preventative measures for the town as a whole, that are within the state law and as fair as possible for all citizens.

You voters then accept or reject the recommendations of the Planning Board, which is as it should be. The Planning Board is only a recommending agency, the power of what becomes Law lies only with the voters.

This was the case with the Zoning Ordinance, the discontinuing of the old town roads and the Subdivision regulations.

In the year of 1972 the Planning Board finalized and presented the Land Subdivision regulations to the voters who accepted them. It has had 21 preapplication hearings for subdivisions approved 6 subdivisions for a total of 9 new lots and disapproved none. It has clarified or simplified several citizen problems in reference to land. Studied and proposed the discontinuance, subject to gates or bars, of approximately 81, miles of old unmaintained town roads. Studied and prepared proposed changes to the existing Zoning Ordinance. We also have

attended several school hearings, and other meetings besides our own regarding planning areas.

As to the future, the list of areas that the Planning Board would like to consider contains, A municipal sewage system, town solid waste disposal, a workable building code and since the town is growing rapidly, we will need a system of street addressing before too long and the addition of the new well to the water system are some of the more important issues. We of the Planning Board intend to work on these issues with all the vigor and determination at our disposal while in the meantime continue to admininster the subdivision regulations and carry on the regular business of the Planning Board.

Since the Planning Board is composed of citizens, all citizens who are interested, are willing to work and who have some free time are urged to apply to the Selectmen for appointment to the board when a vacancy is advertised.

The Planning Board regular meeting night is the second Thursday of each month and it is open to the public. We as a board or as individuals are always ready and willing to try to help any citizen of the town who has a problem or needs advice in our area.

Last but not least, we would like to thank all the citizens of the Town of Raymond for the support you have given us this past year.

GENERAL COMMENTS

An appropriation of \$11,802.00 was omitted from the budget that was approved by the State Tax Commission. This a special artical No. 20 for new highway equipment was voted in the affirmative by the towns people. The equipment was purchased without funds, therefore, this was a large contributing factor in the net budget deficit of \$16,910.77 for the year.

A new clerk for the Board of Selectmen was hired, she appeared before us for a conference on how to keep the records and classification methods, a few minor chabges in classifications were noted and changed.

Verification notices were sent to all deliquent tac payers, levy of 1972.

May we thank all the town officials for aid and cooperation given to us during the course of the audit.

Report of the Trustees of Trust Funds

The main activity of the Trustees of Trust Funds has been the maintenance of the Cemeteries, using the \$750.00 Town appropriation and interest earned by the various Trust Funds. In addition to the Pine Grove Cemeteries, we have cared for the Lane, the Chester Line and the Prescott Cemeteries. For the last one a Trust Fund was started early this year. We believe that both the Lane and the Chester Line cemeteries have benefitted from regular care.

Costs of Cemetery care have increased 9.3 percent over the previous year due, largely to increased hourly costs for labor.

During the year new or enlarged Trust Funds totaling \$1575.00 have been established for Cemetery care. Experience has shown that this is a wise provision for the future, since families frequently move away or die out.

Other new Trust Funds are shown in the tabulation.

Case and duly seconded by Marion Lovejoy that the Raymond School District raise and appropriate \$774,275.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of the School District officials and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriations for such sums as are estimated to be received from the State Foundation Aid Fund together with other incomes; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriations, which balance is to be raised by taxes of the town.

An amendment to the motion was made by Josiah R. Gordon and seconded by James Snow that the sum of \$11,800.00 be deducted from the \$774,275.00 as this money was raised under Articles 8 & 11.

AMENDMENT SO CARRIED.

The original motion with the reduced figure of \$762,-475.00 was voted in affirmative.

Article 13. A resolution was presented by Stephen Goldthwaite that the District go on record to request the Town Road Agent to plow those additional areas on the school grounds deemed necessary above and beyond the normal road plowing presently being carried out.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Today's schools are indeed becoming more and more complex. We see evidence of this here in Raymond. The job of the teacher is ever more demanding and one that requires constant re-evaluation in terms of today's business. Inside and outside education, there are forces that propose changes in our schools.

Some call for a return to "basic education", while still others want more emphasis on "creativity" and "individualized instruction". This is the dilemma facing your School Board.

At our town level, we realize that the curriculum is affected by the availability of materials, physical facilities, and community demands, including financial resources.

Teaching techniques previously have been geared toward drill and repetition. Today we find the stress on developing understanding and overall content, rather than studying isolated factual material.

There is great need to adjust the curriculum to the needs of the times. We might very well find in the near future, full-time teachers working on developing the curriculum when students are not in attendance.

Libraries or media centers will need to receive a high priority in our town budget if standards are to be maintained. Title II of the Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965 has helped us some but much more local effort is needed in the years to come.

We need and hopefully will see much stress in the future on Vocational Education. A school program is certainly needed that will enable every young person completing Grade 12 to be ready to enter higher education or to enter useful and rewarding employment. We are really talking about the capacity of our people to sustain and accelerate the pace of progress in this country during a lifetime of learning.

I appreciate the cooperation of the School Board and the community in our educational endeavors.

RAYMOND SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

TO THE CITIZENS OF RAYMOND:

The Raymond school system is presently in its second year of a double session program and plans are underway to continue for 1973-74. While this program continues to receive general support by the community and has fulfilled thus far, our space needs, it does not appear to meet the educational needs of our entire school population. To repeat a statement that appeared in our last year's report, "double sessions is merely a stop-gap measure to our over-crowded classrooms."

Presently, Grades 1-3 occupy the "old building" and Grades 9-12, the two "new wings" in the morning session. Grades 5-8 occupy the two "new wings" and grade 4 (three classrooms) are in the "old building" in the afternoon. One might suggest then, that until the enrollment has increased to the point of 100 percent utilization of all space in the afternoon, additional space is not needed. In theory this appears to have merit, however, in practicality, it is not so. The physical characteristics of a primary education room, and size of classroom furniture would not be acceptable for older children. There reaches a point where classrooms for children of a wide age span cannot be interchangeable. It may be interesting to note here that Raymond is unique in that it operates the only double session program for Grades 1-12 in the State of New Hampshire!

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From early morning until late at night, the gym facility is in constant use. Scheduling practice sessions as well as contests for three or four athletic teams, assemblies, concerts, dramatics, etc. while conducting a physical education program for grades 7-12 is a chaotic situation, not to mention the ever-increasing requests for evening use by groups in the community. The cafeteria is also being used for physical education—and other group activities.

As an indication of the board's concern of our growing problem, it initiated a meeting this fall with schools boards of Candia, Deerfield, Auburn, and Hooksett to explore what might be done collectively to meet common needs. A definite commitment to an AREA or Cooperative study committee was not forthcoming from any of these boards because of prior commitments and arrangements with Manchester and within their own communities. Thus, it would appear that because of the growth situation with limited borrowing capacity, and a reluctance on the part of communities to co-operate, Raymond in all likelihood will have no choice but to "go it alone."

Your school board, therefore, will once again commence to work on some type of building proposal for presentation during the 1973-74 school year. It is entirely possible that in meeting school building needs, thought could also be given to meeting community needs-recreational, meeting areas, youth center, and adult education.

Again we remind you that Education is a function of the State, providing the State Board of Education the power of management, supervision, and direction over all public schools, with the local district as a subdivision.

The purpose of such is to insure that all children living in the State receive an equality of educational opportunity. However, this is not the case. There is a vast difference between the ability of economically poor towns such as Raymond to offer educational opportunity, and economically wealthy towns such as Bow, Newington, etc.

If the state is not to abdicate completely its responsibility to Education, it is imperative that the General Court implement those statute which now exist to support the system. Below is a comparison in some areas of state support.

An Educational Council was created last year, comprised of board members, administrators, teachers, townspeople, and students. This group has been meeting on a regular basis to study such topics as community school, adult education, teacher evaluation, open campus, and work-study programs. The goals of this council are (1) to provide a forum for open communication to all facets of the educational community (2) to create meaningful recommendations to the school board, and (3) to improve the quality of education in the Raymond school system.

The board acknowledges and appreciates the fact that so many of our staff members are giving time and energy over and above the call of duty for the betterment of our children.

Also, a thanks to you, the townspeople, for continuing to support an educational program in the community at a time when rapid growth, ever-increasing costs, and a diminishing return in State aid place a growing hardship on the local taxpayer.

Commingling of District and Non-District Funds:

It was noted during the course of the audit that nondistrict funds (teachers activities monies), were being comingled with th Milk Program Funds of the District. The regulations pertaining to the receipt and disbursement of District Funds prohibits any private funds from being administered through the District accounts.

Note, Bond and Coupon Register:

You are once again reminded that the Treasurer should adopt the use of a standard form Note, Bond and Coupon Register, as prescribed by the State Tax Commission. The provisions of R.S.A. 33:12 require that this register be maintained.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 71, Section 27-a, require that the auditor's summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the School District. Publication of the Exhibits included in the audit report is optional at the discretion of the School Board.
