

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk, One Selectman, Assessor, and Trustee of the Trust Fund for a term of three years, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, three Constables, a Chief of Police and all other Town officials for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- Article 3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the expense of the general government, for the protection of persons and property, for the health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the support of the town poor and all other necessary expenditures for the year ensuing.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, and to renew and refund Town notes.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on taxes.
- Article 6. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise to defray the expense for collecting garbage at Seabrook Beach, the contract to be awarded by the Selectmen.

Article 7. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 8. To raise and appropriate for advancement of the Town, its interests, resources and natural advantages, through the issuance and distribution of Publicity Material and to assist in the promotion of the developments for the benefit of the town in co-operation with the other towns working together in the Seacoast Regional Development Association, the sum of \$84.00.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$220.71, the State to contribute \$882.83, for Town Road Aid.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to defray the expense of lighting the World War II Soldier's Memorial at Smithtown Square, for the ensuing year.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to about the following ordinance relating to clam worms.

Section A In order to protect, propagate and conserve the clam worms within the limits of the Town of Seabrook, no person shall dig or take clam worms from any flats or creeks in the Town of Seabrook unless he is a bonafide resident citizen of the State of New Hampshire, provided however, the Selectmen may issue to a bonafide resident citizen of any State, owning or leasing real property within the Town of Seabrook, an annual permit which shall entitle said permittee to dig or take clam worms for his own use, not in excess of one pint in any one day.

There shall be no fee for such annual permit.

Section B. All permits shall expire on June 30th., following the date of issuance.

No permit shall be transferable.

Section C. If any person is convicted of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, his permit may be suspended or revoked by the Selectmen for such a period of time as they may determine.

Section D. If any provisions of this ordinance are held invalid, it shall not effect the validity of the remaining provisions thereof.

Section E. Whoever violates any of these provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than ten dollars.

Article 12. Upon petition of Mabel M. Rowe and fourteen other legal voters of the Town of Seabrook:

To see of the Town will vote to buy equipment for the Fire Department at a cost not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and to appoint a committee of five, said committee to consist of the Fire Chief and four legal voters appointed, or elected, at this meeting, to purchase the same and pay for the same by raising and appropriating the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the year 1946 and the balance of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) to be paid in four equal annual installments of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each by the issuance of Town Notes; all matters in connection with the issuance of said notes to be left to the discretion of the Selectmen.

Article 13. Upon petition of Edgar P. Dow and thirteen other legal voters:

To see if the Town will take necessary action to determine the cost of piping all essential roads in the Town of Seabrook for adequate supply of running water.

- (2.) To see if the townspeople will vote to raise the sum necessary to defray the initial expense for the proper piping of all essential Seabrook Roads and Lanes.
- (3.) To see if the townspeople will discuss, and raise the sums necessary to defray the expense of locating fire hydrants at regular intervals along the town's roads.

Article 14. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.
