To the inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriation of the same.
3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
4. To hear the reports of Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Construction of highways.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the relief of town poor.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire prevention.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100 to be used by the Committee in improving the town forest.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$81.90, based on a 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation, for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,650 to purchase a truck and snow plow.

14. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such an audit.

15. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.

16. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.

17. To see if the town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

School Superintendent's Report

Shelburne, New Hampshire

February 1, 1945

Your school year at the present time has the lowest enrollment for several years, namely, fourteen pupils.

Miss Minetta Tibbetts is again in charge as teacher for her third consecutive year.

Six Shelburne pupils are now registered in High School at Gorham, and we have three registered in the Eighth Grade at our own school, making the number of pupils in High School from Shelburne next year to be nine.

The water supply at the school this year has been very inadequate, and it will probably be necessary to make some arrangement for a better supply of water.

The Health Supervision is again being conducted by Mrs. Gladys Fancy, R. N., of Gorham.

For the complete school year ending June, 1944, the percentage of attendance, on account of much sickness, was unusually low—78.9%. The school year, as required by law, was thirty-six weeks.

Another Enemy to Conquer

Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,788 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available manpower the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

Keep in mind these simple rules:

1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.
2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.
3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.
4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.
5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.
