THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Temple in the County of
Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in
Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Temple on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. To choose a selectman for two years.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.
3. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
4. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for snow removal.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700 for State Aid Maintenance; the State to give \$2100.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for Trunk Line Maintenance; the State to give \$800.
7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to relocate a part of the road passing through the land of Marian Mann, the expense to be borne by petitioner.
8. To see if the town will vote to close the portions of unused Trunk Line Road No. 101 located in Temple subject to gates and bars.

9. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate to combat the White Pine Blister Rust.

10. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of snow fence.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 to plant a hedge in rear of town buildings.

12. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

13. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for support of Library.

14. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Temple:

I submit my eighth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

There are two changes in the teaching staff from last year. Miss Ella Walker is teaching in the Grammar Room. She was graduated from Plymouth Normal School last June in the two-year course with additional training in the Junior high classes. We have returned to the former plan of employing a music supervisor jointly with the other five towns of the Supervisory Union. For this position we secured Miss Anna G. Smith, a graduate of the three-year music supervisory course at Keene Normal School.

The statistical tables following this report show very slight changes in enrollment from that of last year, a slight decrease in per cent of attendance and a marked increase in tardiness. The tardiness continues to be abnormally great this year.

SUPERVISION

The testing program described in my last two annual reports has been conducted along the same lines. In addition to this the teachers are using standard tests and informal tests as checks upon their own work to an increasing extent. These teachers' tests serve two purposes. They give the teacher definite data with which to check her own record of daily work on which to base the periodical reports of each pupil's standing to the parents. They also indicate to the teacher those items of her teaching which need further emphasis or re-teaching.

PROGRAM OF STUDIES

The Program of Studies for Grades One to Six in the elementary schools was revised during the year 1930 by committees of Superintendents and teachers in the state and edited by the staff of the State Board of Education. This was a very complete revision and makes up a book of nearly five-hundred pages covering all of the subjects taught these grades in considerable detail. A chapter is devoted to each subject stating the objectives, describing teaching processes, and outlining the subject matter in minute detail for the guidance of the teachers.

The most extensive revision was in the subject of arithmetic and conforms to the conclusions of common practice and of research in the teaching of arithmetic. The chief departure from the former program is in making first grade arithmetic incidental rather than formal, that is, no definite attempt is to be made in the first grade to teach the combinations in either addition or multiplication.

The chapter on reading has been enlarged and extended with very definite and helpful suggestions for the teaching of silent reading throughout grades four, five and six. The chapters on drawing and music have been made very concrete and definite. The same is true of the chapters devoted to health and physical education. There are also two chapters on the special problems of the rural school.

MEDICAL INSPECTION

The medical inspection made by Dr. Pease and Mrs. Gilbert in September showed the following:

The one pupil reported as unvaccinated has complied with

the law by submitting to the process of vaccination three times without success.

CONCLUSION

I have appreciated the activities of the Parent-Teacher Association in behalf of the school children and I commend the faithful efforts of the teachers and appreciate the support of the School Board and citizens. In closing I wish to make an appeal in behalf of the older pupils, particularly the boys. Many of them are at the critical period in a boy's life when they need a sympathetic understanding of themselves on the part of all who have dealings with them, not only in school but everywhere, and I feel that we all need to make a special effort in this direction with the situation as it has existed during the past year. These are normal boys but have come into a somewhat abnormal state of mind and in my opinion need above all things to be understood.
