STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Warner in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Warner on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred (100) Dollars for the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association for the purpose of promoting and publicizing the natural advantages of the Town, together with other towns in the region.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred (400) Dollars for Pine Blister Rust control in the Town in co-operation with the State Forestry Department.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred (600) Dollars towards payment of the Concord Hospital deficit.
6. To see if the Town will vote to move one of the Street Lights, now located on the back road at Roby, to pole 68/2 on Church Street in Warner Village.

7. To see if the Town will vote to elect the Chief of Police instead of by appointment.

8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue printing the list of Taxpayers in the Town Report as it is now printed and instead thereof print in the Town Report once every five years commencing in 1956 a complete list as it appears in the Selectmen's Blotter Books.

9. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the printing of Trustee of Trust Fund report. A true copy to be kept in the Selectmens' Office and another made a permanent record in the Town Clerks Books.

10. To see what action the Town will take relative to the firing of all types of weapons within 150 yards of any dwelling or buildings.

11. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the action heretofore taken at a previous annual meeting in connection with the acceptance of the William D. Davis School Fund and relinquishing any and all rights that it may have in and unto said fund as provided by the terms of the Will of the late William D. Davis.

12. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow money in the anticipation of taxes on the note, or notes, of the Town, payable on or before December 31, 1955.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to sell property taken for taxes.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize BEANO for the ensuing year.

15. To hear reports of the officers of the Town heretofore chosen and committees appointed and pass any vote relating thereto.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate for new highway equipment, the sum, not to exceed four thousand eight hundred dollars (\$4,800.00) dollars: To raise by taxation in 1955 the sum of twenty four hundred dollars and to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to hire on the note or notes of the Town the sum of \$2,400.00 payable on or before December 31, 1956.

**DIVISION OF MUNICIPAL ACCOUNTING
STATE TAX COMMISSION**

Concord, New Hampshire

Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Warner which was made by this Division, acting under authority of Chapter 82, Section 27, of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, which provides in part as follows:

“Audit on Motion of Commission. The Commission may cause an audit to be made of the accounts of any city, town, school district, village district or precinct, as often as once in two years, or whenever conditions appear to it to warrant such. xxxxx”

This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, and the period from January 1st to November 8th, 1954.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: Dec. 31, 1952 - Dec. 31, 1953: Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1952 and December 31, 1953, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$278.22 in 1953.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net revenue surplus of \$736.65, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$884.39, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$1,621.04.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of November 5th, 1954, is indicated in Exhibit L.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes:

Table I presents a ten year statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes, covering the fiscal years of 1943 to 1953, inclusive.

It is noted that the amount of long term notes outstanding decreased from \$21,250.00 to \$10,750.00, and the Net Debt from \$13,578.60 to \$5,885.28 during this period.

The assessed valuation of taxable property increased by \$413,721.00, or 40%, while the amount of the annual tax levy increased from \$41,196.00 to \$83,966.00, or 104%. Uncollected taxes at the close of the 1953 fiscal year amounted to only \$818.07, or less than 1% of the current year's tax levy.

The local average tax rate increased from \$3.84 to \$5.67 per hundred, compared to an increase in the average tax rate for the State during this period of \$3.03 to \$4.48.

It is noted that as of November 8, 1954, there were uncollected and unredeemed taxes on account of the Tax levies of 1951 and prior years as follows:

It is recommended that such taxes on these lists as appear to be uncollectible be abated and that tax deeds be issued to the town by Collector on properties represented by tax liens as indicated above.

Tax Collector's Records:

It is recommended that the Tax Collector adopt the use of the standard loose leaf columnar form of cash book. This provides for the segregation of property, poll, yield and head tax collections as well as redemptions from tax sales, by year of levy. The prescribed form of report should also be used when remittances are made to the Town Treasurer, indicating the breakdown of tax collections and redemptions as recorded in the cash book.

Town Treasurer's Surety Bond:

It is recommended that the surety bond of the Town Treasurer be increased from \$5,000.00 to \$10,000.00 in order that it may be more proportionate in amount to the funds handled by this official.

Conclusion:

The accounts of the town officials which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting and financial procedure conformed to prescribed methods. The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211 of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report. This letter of transmittal should be included in its entirety but the inclusion of Exhibits is optional.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Warner for their assistance during the course of the audit.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business

Carelessness is responsible for 97 percent of all our forest fires. This is a serious indictment of our interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbors. In too many instances this carelessness results in the destruction, not of the careless one's own property, but of someone not even known to him.

Thoughtlessly thrown lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles by hikers, hunters and fishermen; the careless burning of debris during hazardous periods, high winds or in dangerous locations; improperly extinguished camp or cook fires - all add up to the CARELESSNESS that means serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

It points to the need of eliminating CARELESSNESS so far as it concerns fire from our daily life. The rules are simple - your cooperation is earnestly solicited.

1. Be careful with fire in or near woodlands.
2. Be sure that all lighted material — cigars, cigarettes and matches — is completely out before discarding it. Use ash trays in autos.
3. Secure the required written permission to burn from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not completely covered with snow.
4. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
5. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

Let's remember that FOREST FIRE PREVENTION is EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS and our MOST IMPORTANT undertaking!

There has been only one change in the teaching staff this year. Miss Betty Barton of Presque Isle, Maine, replaced Mrs. Merle Kincade. This was a position I sought to replace all spring and summer with no success and didn't employ Miss Barton until the day before school opened.

This is an indication of the shortage of teachers. Back in 1950 it was predicted that for the next four or five years we would have an increasing number of children in our schools and that 1956 would be the peak year and then it would begin to taper off. However, in 1953 we had the greatest number of births in the history of the nation and this year will exceed last year's total births. Warner's population is fairly stable so we do not have the pressing problems that other communities have which show a sharp increase in population. We are affectedly indirectly as other towns not only have to replace teachers who have left the service, but, also get additional teachers. Hopkinton, for example, has four more teachers than they had four years ago and will have to add still more in the next few years. Warner has to compete with other towns in getting replacements from a decreasing supply.

As a matter of fact, Superintendents do not interview teachers any more. Teachers interview Superintendents. Girls that I talked with had offers of as many as five or six positions so they asked the questions. The questions were something like this; "How much is your starting salary? Do you have a salary schedule What kind of bus service do you have? Are the people of the community sympathetic to teacher problems? How many classes do I have to teach? Is there any activity for young people? If you cannot answer these

questions satisfactorily, they just aren't interested.

A committee has been working on the salary schedule for Warner. They have come up with some very modest recommendations which will be presented to the budget committee and the school district. You will be familiar with the details of this committee's report long before the town report is published. I think it is sufficient to say that it is an attempt to get and keep, for a reasonable time, good teachers.

Warner operates a high school which receives tuition pupils. It is surrounded on all sides by high schools that also receive tuition pupils. In order to maintain our enrollment of tuition pupils, we must maintain a good staff of teachers. Whatever your feeling may be about tuition pupils, if we did not have them, our high school program would be totally inadequate.

Several new courses have been added to the high school program and we hope to extend a mathematics program. This has been possible only because the teachers have been willing to take on extra classes. At the present time, all the teachers have extremely heavy teaching loads. The average teaching load in a high school is five classes. Most of our teachers have seven classes and, in addition, an outside activity which takes a considerable amount of time. Sometime another teacher should be added to the high school staff.

These are trying times for Education in America and in New Hampshire. Each year the cost of education in many communities increases, and the tax on real estate goes up and up. Yet, we have the children and they must be educated to the maximum of their ability if we are to survive in this world struggle of conflicting ideas.

I have enjoyed my work in Warner and the friendly cooperation of the school board, teachers and parents.
