THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee. Auditor, and all other necessary Town Officers.
- 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for
 - a. Town Officers' Salariesb. Town Officers' Expensesc. Election Expenses

 - d. Municipal Court Expenses
 - e. Care and repair of town buildings

 - f. Police Department g. Town fire protection and Department h. Forest fires

 - i. Bounties and damage by dogs
 - j. Health department and vital statistics k. Sewer maintenance
 - l. Highways and bridges
 - - 1. Town maintenance 2. Snow removal
 - 3. Cleaning streets
 - 4. Street lighting
 - 5. General expense highway department
 - m. Public Library
 - n. Old age assistance o. Town poor

 - p. Memorial Day q. Soldiers' aid r. Cemeteries

 - s. Insurance

 - t. Interest, bonds and notes
 u. Traffic lights
 v. Sidewalk maintenance
 w. Payment on principal of town debt
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club, for public purposes, the free use of the town hall.
 - 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the se-

lectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

- 5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid construction of Class V. roads, commonly known as town roads, raise and appropriate for the purpose, the sum of \$509.77, and receive from the state \$2,039.06.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for advertising, the same to be expended through the Board of Trade.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$205 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%), for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,000 to aid in maintenance of the Morrison Hospital.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the amount of \$200 to continue the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, thereby receiving the usual State Aid.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the public highway over Bray Hill from Sylvester Newell's homestead turn northerly to Jefferson Town line.
- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to widen the Daniel Webster Highway on the easterly side between the bridge and Main Street.
 - 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and ap-

propriate not to exceed \$1,000 for improvement and maintenance of the Common and repair of bandstand.

- 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at private or public sale the Hunt Field on Highland street which was purchased by the Town for cemetery purposes.
- 15. To see if the Town will authorize the installation of one new street light on Union Street, south of the residence of C. W. Putney.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars for new sidewalk construction.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to cancel the order given under vote of the March, 1946, town meeting, to purchase a grader/snowplow at a cost not to exceed \$10,000.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$500 to install a two-way radio set in automobile of the Chief of Police, and also a receiving set to be installed in the town hall.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise not to exceed \$2,500 for development of Whitefield Air Terminal, this money to be matched with federal and state funds.
- 20. To transact any other business that may law-fully come before said meeting.
