School Report

The number of pupils enumerated by the truant officer between the ages of five and sixteen is ninety-one.

The schools have been under the same teachers throughout the year, a unique record for our town. This has added greatly to the efficiency of our schools. We hope to make only one change for the coming year. We feel that much better work can be done if a constant change of teachers can be avoided.

We have had a visit from the state superintendent of public instruction during the past year. He informs us that our school buildings are not in accordance with modern ideas of light, ventilation and sanitation and suggests that enough money be appropriated each year to put one school-house in an up-to-date state of repair. This to be repeated until the buildings in the four school districts in town are put in modern condition.

5. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
7. To see how much money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of the schools.
8. To see how much money the district will raise and appropriate for repairs on school property.
9. To see if the school district will adopt Chapter 82 of the Laws of 1913, relating to the medical inspection of schools.
10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to unite with one or more town districts or special districts to form a supervisory district for the purpose of employing a superintendent of the public schools therein, under the provisions of Chapter 77 of the Session Laws of New Hampshire, 1899, and raise money to carry such vote into effect.
11. To transact any business that may legally come before said meeting.
