TOWN WARRANT

- To the inhabitants of the Town of Chatham, New Hampshire in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:
- You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Chatham on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:
- To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to discount all property taxes paid before July first and if so how much.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute blank inventories at the time they appraise property to be taxed.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$19.00 for the White Mountains Region Association.
- 6. To see what the Town will vote to do about taking a new valuation of town property, subject to Section 4, Chapter 76, Revised Laws of 1942.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars to maintain its street lights as now located.
- 8. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
