TOWN WARRANT

NOTICE

As a part of the following warrant you are called on to vote by Australian ballot as follows:

A resolution adopted by the General Court.

Is it expedient to revise the constitution?

To the inhabitants of the Town of Chesterfield in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chesterfield on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To vote by Australian ballot for all necessary Town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regards to Assessors.

Article 3. To determine the method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

Article 5. To see what action the Town will take in regards to the unexpended balances of appropriations for 1936.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for highway maintainance.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal.

Article 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the poor.

Article 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the Public Libraries.

Article 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the Fire Department.

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for street lighting.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to observe Old Home Day and raise money for the same.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to enlarge the fire house in the center village to house the Town traector and raise money therefor.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for the purchase of a new booster tank for the middle town fire truck and a hose drying rack for the West Part Fire House.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to restore the salaries of all Town officers the twelve and one half per cent cut voted several years ago, and instruct the Selectmen to restore and pay such increase or act thereon.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the rate of Town labor to forty cents an hour, to conform with the rate paid by the State for labor or act thereon.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following by-laws:

Section 1. The Selectmen are authorized and empowered to set aside in the compact parts of the village of Spofford, Chesterfield and West Chesterfield, and the compact parts of the area beside Spofford Lake and on the State highway, areas where parking shall be limited and restricted. Such areas when so determined shall be defined and limited and the hours and method of parking shall be set forth and defined by vote of the Selectmen duly recorded in the office of the Town Clerk. Said areas shall be properly marked by the Selectmen.

Section 2. The board of Selectmen are also authorized and empowered to locate traffic lights, stop signs, and other markings on the highways in the Town of Chesterfield for the purpose of safeguarding the lives and property of those resorting to the highways for travel. The location of such lights, signs and other markers shall be recorded by the Selectmen over their signatures in the office of the Town Clerk.

Section 3. No public dance, skating rink, show or other exhibition as defined in Chapters 145 and 363 of the public laws shall be held within the Town without a written license shall have been granted by the Selectmen for which license the fee shall be one dollar.

Section 4. The Selectmen may make and prescribe rules and regulations for such public dances, roller skating and other exhibitions, which rules and regulations shall be duly recorded over the signatures of the Selectmen in the records of the Town Clerk.

Section 5. All rules and regulations made by the Selectmen under the authority of the forgoing sections shall have the full effect of by-laws of the Town when duly recorded in the Town Clerk's office as above set forth.

Section 6. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of the foregoing by-laws shall be fined not exceeding ten dollars for each offence for the use of the Town.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$500.00 to be used to install a fire alarm system in West Chesterfield.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum sufficient to place two water closets, or more, on the Town property on the north side of Lake Spofford.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to install a blinker light in front of the store of Clifford W. Tuttle in Spofford village and raise money for the same.

Article 23. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of money not to exceed a thousand dollars to drill a well and install a deep well pump near the Town Hall.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to install eight street lamps along the State road between the Lake Spofford Hotel and Stone House four corners, location as chosen by the Selectmen as best suited to protect winter residents and guide summer pedestrian traffic.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to place a street light at the foot of Mill hill, so called, near, or at the new bridge, in the village of Spofford, or act thereon.

Article 26. (A) To see if the Town will vote a Town ordinance to take effect at once, if voted as follows—That any special officer or patrolman employed by the Town for purpose of patrol or law enforcement other than those required by law to be voted for and elected shall be voted for at a regular Town meeting.

(B) That it be further enacted that no officer or patrolman shall be hired by the Town or receive compensation from

the Town for services unless he or they shall be elected by vote of the Town.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to disband the Budget Committee so called and save the Town \$120.00 (one hundred twenty dollars) for work formally done by the Selectmen and included in their regular salary, or act thereon.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to install two (2) lights on the Keene road, one at intersection of upper road from the Kellogg place, so called, and one at, or near residence of George Goodrich, or act thereon.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the Emoretta T. Robertson trust fund. The income to be used for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Noyes Robertson lot in Coolidge cemetery.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 in trust to be known as the Jennie E. Burroughs Trust fund, the income to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Association for the perpetual care and improvement of the Jennie E. Burroughs burial lot. Lot numbers 235 and 236.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the Squire Amidon trust fund, the income to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Association for the perpetual care and improvement of the Squire Amidon burial lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the George F. Amidon trust fund, the income to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Association for the perpetual care and improvement of the George G. Amidon burial lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery.

Article 33. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to take advantage of Town Road Aid and raise the sum of \$760.39 for the same.

TOWN MEETING, MARCH, 1936

Proceedings of the annual town meeting of the voters of the town of Chesterfield called at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, March 10, 1936.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, E. James Winslow, at 9 o'clock and the first two articles of the warrant were read by the Clerk.

Assistant Town Clerk, Ralph C. Chickering, and assistant Moderator, Alice L. Spaulding took their oaths of office before the Moderator.

Balloting was declared in order by Australian ballot for all necessary Town officers for the ensuing year and for the election of Delegates-at-large, Alternate Delegates-at-large, District Delegates and Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice President of the United States.

At 10.30 o'clock the rest of the warrant was read by the Clerk and the articles were disposed of as follows:

Voted that the Selectmen act as Assessors as in the past year.

Article 4. Voted that the same method of collecting taxes be used as in previous years.

Article 5. Arthur H. Post, Chairman of the budget committee gave a brief report of its meeting and work.

Article 6. Voted that the unexpended balances of appropriations of 1935 be turned into the general fund in the treasury.

Article 7. Voted to raise the sum of \$4,500.00 to defray town charges.

Article 8. Voted to raise the sum of \$6,000.00 the same as last year for highway maintainance.

Article 9. Voted to raise the sum of \$2,000.00 for snow removal.

Article 10. Voted to raise the sum of \$1,750.00 for the support of the poor including old age assistance.

Article 11. Voted to raise the customary sum of \$200.00 for the support of the public libraries.

Article 12. Voted to raise the sum of \$550.00 for the support of the fire department.

Article 13. Motion made and supported to raise the sum of \$1,700.00 for street lighting. An amendment to the motion to make the amount \$1,780.00 was made, supported and accepted by a vote of 19 for the amendment and 10 against.

Article 14. Voted to raise the sum of \$150.00 for old home day celebration. Harry E. Winn was elected by voice vote to serve as chairman of Old Home Day and he refused to serve. Paul M. Penning, Maurice Amidon, Walter Dunbar, Ralph Chickering, Frank Guyette and John P. Redding were each in turn elected to serve as chairman and each in turn refused. Voted to leave the election of a chairman in the hands of the Selectmen.

Article 15. Voted to accept State aid on class 5 roads and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$759.69 for the same.

Article 16. Voted to raise \$500.00 for a new bridge or culvert to replace present bridge on the river road north of the residence of C. E. Chickering.

Article 17. Voted to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 to buy land and build a fire house in West Chesterfield.

Article 18. Voted to raise the sum of \$3,700.00 to purchase a tractor and snow plow.

Article 19. Voted to raise the sum of \$50.00 to be spent on the Crowningshield road.

Articles 20 and 21. Voted to place lights asked for in both articles 20 and 21. These are to be installed as follows: On a pole at the top of the hill at the bend in the road near the house owned by Mrs. Elsie Foster and occupied by Mr. Arvid Pearson.

Article 22. Voted to authorize the Selectmen and the Trustees of Trust Funds to adjust the records of the Trustees of Trust funds and make their return to be voted upon at the next annual meeting.

Article 23. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of both truck snow plows.

Article 24. Voted to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the Albert S. Chickering Trust Fund, the income to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Association for the perpetual care and improvement of the Albert S. Chickering burial lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery.

Article 25. Voted to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the Farr-Kingsley Trust Fund, the income to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Association for the perpetual care and improvement of the Farr-Kingsley burial lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery.

Article 26. Voted to accept the sum of \$50.000 to be added to the Elsie Albee-Fassett Trust Fund, the income to be used for the perpetual care and improvement of the Elsie Albee-Fassett burial lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery.

Article 27. Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

At one o'clock p. m. the Moderator called the meeting to order. Voted to extend the time of balloting until two-thirty, at which time it was voted to adjourn.

The counting of the ballots cast for the election of town officers by the Australian ballot system resulted as follows:

For Town Clerk. Imogene L. Chickering had 223 votes.

For Selectman for three years. Chester M. Burnham had 234 votes.

For Selectman for one year. John Mansley had 140 votes; John P. Redding had 128 votes.

For Town Treasurer. Ada W. Allen had 230 votes; Viola V. Tuttle had 1 vote.

For Tax Collector. Henry E. Winn had 247 votes.

For Spofford Road Agent. Lyle W. Pierce had 97 votes; Walter J. Post had 169 votes.

For Center Road Agent. William E. Nurse had 101 votes; Roger C. Spaulding had 164 votes.

For West Chesterfield Road Agent. Emroy G. Carey had 47 votes; Lyle B. Chickering had 142 votes; Clarence F. Springer had 72 votes.

For West Chesterfield Fireward. Harold W. Ingalls had 219 votes, Gaylord Aldrich had 1 vote.

For Trustee of Town Library. John Mansley had 4 votes, C. D. York had 2 votes; Charlie York had 2 votes; George E. Joslin had 3 votes; Paul M. Penning had 2 votes; Paul Penning had 2 votes; and Charles D. York, Frederick C. Robinson, Frederick Robinson, M. Friedsam, Morris Friedsam, Paul Penn., E. J. Winslow. Hobart Rhinesmith, Clifford W. Tuttle,

Alice Spaulding, Ella M. Lewis, Ella Lewis, Imogene Chickering, George Goodridge, Fred Humphrey, Merton Davis and John Ryans each had one vote.

For Budget Committee for three years. Maurice L. Amidon had 191 votes; Fred C. Humphrey had 165 votes; Clifford W. Tuttle had 1 vote; A. H. Post had 1 vote.

For Budget Committee for one year. Clifford W. Tuttle had 27 votes; Paul Penning had 1 vote; Clifford Tuttle had 3 votes; Henry Chickering had 2 votes; and Ralph Chickering, Ralph C. Chickering, Henry C. Chickering, Maurice Amidon, Maurice L. Amidon, Moses Chickering, Moses H. Chickering, George E. Joslin and Walter J. Post each had 1 vote.

For Auditors. Ralph C. Chickering had 186 votes; John H. Nurse had 109 votes; Wallace W. Record had 118 votes; Chester B. Allen had 1 vote.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for three years. William E. Nurse had 204 votes; Frederick V. Houghton had 1 vote.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for two years. Viola V. Tuttle had 26 votes; Frederick V. Houghton had 11 votes; Fred V. Houghton had 4 votes; Viola Tuttle had 4 votes; Jessie M. B. Joslin had 4 votes; Ralph C. Chickering had 3 votes; Mrs. Clifford Tuttle, Mrs. Tuttle, Mrs. C. Tuttle, Chester M. Burnham, Fred Humphrey, John M. Ryans, A. H. Post, Mr. Winslow, Charles D. York and Henry C. Chickering each had one vote.

Sexton Spofford Village Cemetery. Byron A. Davis had 100 votes; Patrick B. Gallagher had 90 votes; George W. Goodridge had 46 votes.

Sexton Center Cemetery. Fred W. Holman had 210 votes.

Sexton New Boston Cemetery. Paul E. Welcome had 207 votes.

Sexton Pattridge and Atherton Hill Cemeteries. Frank Whorfe had 6 votes; Lionel A. Cashmore had 2 votes; Lionel

Cashmore had 2 votes; John Mansley, George Goodridge, Byron Davis, James A. Wilson, William E. Nurse, Everett Pearson, George W. Goodridge, John Redding, and Charles York each had one vote.

Spofford Constable. William D. Pierce had 126 votes.

Center Constable. Charles Furlone had 94 votes; Charles H. Spaulding had 158 votes.

West Chesterfield Constable. Harold E. Randall had 222 votes; Harold Ingalls had 2 votes.

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber. George W. Goodridge had 184 votes; John P. Redding had 4 votes; Walter Dunbar had 2 votes; Chester Burnham had 2 votes; A. H. Post had 2 votes; Harold E. Randall had 2 votes; William D. Pierce had 2 votes; Walter J. Post, Emroy G. Carey, Roger C. Spaulding, Roger Spaulding, Fred Ball, John Redding, Morris Amidon, William Gallagher, H. Randall, Fred W. Chester M. Burnham, Selectman, called on John Mansley, Selectman, to explain recent developments after which it was voted to adjourn the meeting until 6.30 p. m. standard time Tuesday, May 26.

On Tuesday, May 26 the meeting was again called to order by the Moderator E. James Winslow at 8.05 p. m. and the articles of the warrant were disposed of as follows:

Article 4. Voted to pass over the article.

Article 5. Voted to authorize the selectmen to borrow money on serial notes to cover the money raised on the preceding articles.

Article 6. Voted to adjourn at 8.35 p. m.

Dear Sir:—I herewith submit my annual report as School Nurse of the Chesterfield schools:

- 133 pupils were examined.
- 2 pupils showed defective hearing.
- 9 pupils showed defective vision—uncorrected.
- 7 pupils showed poor posture.
- 13 pupils were underweight.
- 78 pupils were in need of dental care.
- 24 pupils were recommended to have a throat and nose examination by a physician.

Dental clinics were held October 26, 27, 28 and Nov. 2, 1936, with work done as follows:

Total number of fillings,	22
Total number of porcelain fillings,	7
Total number of extractions,	32

The clinic rates were: Cleaning, 50c; extractions, 50c; porcelain and silver fillings, 50c; the total bill for this work was forty-one dollars (\$41.00) paid for by the parents of the pupils having work done.

3 pupils had their teeth cared for by their own dentist.

4 pupils had special eye examinations and defects corrected.

1 tonsil case was treated.

8 pupils have been examined by Dr. R. B. Kerr at the Tuberculosis Clinic at the Keene Community hospital.

Much time is spent in home calls, business calls, providing clothing for needy pupils and transportation of pupils to dentist, oculists and physicians.

I wish to express the appreciation of the district to the Spofford Red Cross Chapter, West Chesterfield Red Cross Chapter, Miss Alice Bennett, Mrs. Viola Tuttle for assistance given in carrying on the work in the past year.

I also wish to express my appreciation to the members of the School Board, Superintendent, teachers, parents and pupils for their help and co-operation.
