THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Errol in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Errol on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next at 9 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the public library.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the fire department.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the police department.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town poor.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the cemetery.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the White Mountains Region Associa-

tion for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and otherwise calling attention to the resources and advantages of the Town in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the White Mountains Region.

- 10. To see if the town will vote to install a new heating system in the town hall and to raise money to pay for the same.
- 11. To see what action the town will take in regard to procuring the services of a district nurse and raise money for the same.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to secure the services of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to finish laying new pipe to the Hepsy Brook reservoir.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Errol covering the fiscal year ended December 31, 1947; which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the town.

Scope of Audit

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water Department Collector and the Municipal Light Department.

Financial Statements

Comparative Balance Sheets, Dec. 31, 1946-Dec. 31, 1947: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1946, and December 31, 1947, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the Surplus decreased by \$8,539.70 during the year.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the town during the year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues:

(Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1947, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$685.38, less a net revenue surplus of \$334.44, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$350.94.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1947, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of December 31, 1947, is indicated in Exhibit F.

Statistical Tables:

The second section of the report is comprised of statistical tables covering the ten year period from 1937 to 1946. These are as follows:

- I Comparative Balance Sheets
- II Comparative Statement of Indebtedness,

Valuation and Taxes

III Comparative Statement of Taxable Valuation and Taxes Assessed.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures were verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depositary banks.

General Comments

The accounts and records of all town officials were found in good condition and the accounting procedure conformed to the uniform system prescribed by this Division.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Errol for their assistance during the course of the audit.

1947-1948

I herewith submit my first annual report of the Errol School District.

Teaching Staff

Mr. William E. Bigelow was appointed to the position of Headmaster to succeed Mr. Robert Owens. Mr. Bigelow, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers' College, came to Errol from Center Sandwich, M. H., where he taught in the elementary school.

Mrs. Esther Bean and Mrs. Shirley Hawkins returned to teach in the primary and intermediate grades.

General Information

The regular work of the school in all grades has progressed steadily and effectively. Despite the chortage of one teacher in the ninth and tenth grades, the minimum standards were achieved through the conscientious effort of Mr. Bigelow and the high school program was approved by the State Department of Education.

Through the assistance of the Parent Teachers Association, who contributed generously towards the purchase of a new 16 m.m. projector, the pupils are now assured the many advantages of educational films which will aid in the entire learning process as well as providing wholesome entertainment.

One of the outstanding and most important features of the school program has been the addition of a hot lunch program, which provides for a well balanced, nutritious meal for 20 cents. This low price is made possible through federal subsidization of 9c per meal per child. Out of a total enrollment of 59 pupils, between 50 and 55 pupils eat regularly at the School Cafeteria under teacher supervision where the children learn the importance of eating the right kind of foods, good table manners, and the development of habits of consideration for others.

Much credit is due the School Board and interested parents for their efforts in aiding in the establishment of the school lunch program. A testing program has been planned and is being carried out with a view toward the achievement of a better and more complete understanding of each pupils weaknesses and capabilities so that the teaching of each individual may be more effective.

New text books were purchased for most grades and most of the out-moded books have now been replaced.

Recommendations and Conclusions

Once again the problem of including the ninth and tenth grades in the Central School must be decided. The complete budgets for grades one through ten and grades one through eight have been included in this report so that you may compare the cost of education to Errol for either program.

Because of the difficulty in obtaining labor, very little repair work was done on the school this year. The school house should be painted and minor repairs made.

A health program is one of the most essential parts of the school program. Each pupil should be thoroughly examined by a school physician at least once a year and treatments and corrections made whenever necessary. Provision should also be made for complete dental inspections for all children.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board for their help in the administration of school affairs, to the residents of the town for their efforts in behalf of education and to the teachers for their loyal and conscientious service.
