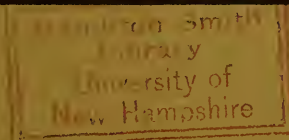

Town Meeting Warrant

(As known February 5, 1941)

Article 1. To hear reports of committees and agents and act on same and to choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year ensuing and to appropriate money for the same.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for Pine Blister Rust control.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to provide for the disposal of rubbish and garbage and raise and appropriate money for same and other expenses of the Health Department.

Article 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal and maintenance of highways and bridges.

Article 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the lighting of streets for the ensuing year.

Article 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the highway department.

Article 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling its roads.

Article 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf Library and salary of its librarian.

Article 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.

Article 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for proper observance of Memorial Day.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for parks, playgrounds and recreational development.

Article 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of its cemeteries.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate as follows: \$2,500.00 to pay the amount maturing on the town building and water works bonds; \$1,000.00 on outstanding water works purchase notes; and \$1,000.00 on state aid construction note; also the sum of \$1,655.00 to pay the interest on said indebtedness and on temporary loans.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to allow a discount for early payment of taxes.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose of property acquired by tax collector's deed.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to lay out a street connecting the Thomas Johnson property and Sunset Lane, and to raise and appropriate money for construction of same.

Article 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

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Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Franconia:

The enrollment of your schools last year was 159, the average membership 145.63 and the per cent of attendance 95.82. There were 24 tuition pupils in the high school and 15 in the elementary schools. This is an increase in high school enrollment over the previous year.

This year the total enrollment to date is 161 with 99 in grades 1 to 8 and 62 in the high school. This is the largest high school enrollment for many years. It has made it necessary to use one of the recitation rooms as a home room for the freshman class. There are 26 tuition pupils in the high school and 18 in grades 1 to 8.

There was only one change in the regular teaching staff this year. Miss Dorothy Ackerman of Derry, N. H. succeeded Mrs. Claire Moore as teacher of home economics and junior high school subjects. Miss Ackerman is a graduate of Keene Teachers College in the class of 1940.

The revised Elson-Gray reading system was introduced this year in the first grade. This is the newest and most carefully developed system in the country today. It is the result of extensive research and experiment and is proving very successful. The material for this grade has been simplified and made much more attractive and interesting to children.

The manual training equipment has been moved from the building which was once one of the horse sheds to the new room on the first floor of the gymnasium building. This new room is much warmer and lighter and more convenient than the old one. Mr. Bennett and

the boys in his class built new benches, new vises, and a new tool cabinet for the storage of all hand tools. Much credit is due Mr. Bennett for his skill in planning and constructing inexpensive equipment for this new room.

One more thing is needed to complete the equipment of the gymnasium building. Locker rooms with shower baths should be constructed in the vacant space on the top floor of the building.

Under the direction of Miss Callahan and Miss Blanchard money was raised to purchase a new Bell & Howell sound moving picture machine of the latest type. With this machine it is possible to show either silent or sound 16 millimeter film. It can also be used, if supplied with a record reproducer, to play phonograph records. It is planned to use moving pictures to supplement regular classroom teaching. Special films for this purpose can be rented from the extensive film library of New Hampshire University.

This year the Greenleaf Civics Club is helping to provide milk for under-weight children in addition to providing hot soup or cocoa for noon lunch during the winter months.

The School Board is recommending that the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,525.00 for the next school year. This is a reduction of \$1400.00 from last year's appropriation. It has been made possible largely because of the sale of the post office building and increased tuition receipts.

I wish to thank the members of the School Board and the teachers for their cooperation.
