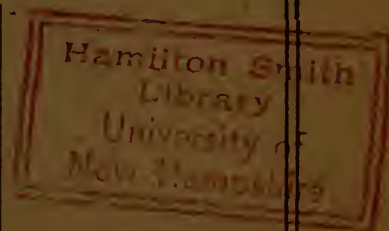

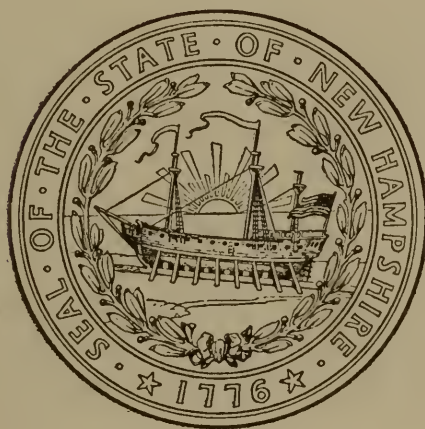

TOWN WARRANT

THE STAT OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jefferson in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Jefferson on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum \$1377.00 for State Aid Construction and receive \$2754.00 from the State or raise the sum of \$311.83 and receive the sum of \$1247.31 for Class V roads.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 to build another water hole for fire protection.

5. To see if the Town will approve the acquisition by the United States Government of approximately 5,529 acres of land situated in the town, forming an additional purchase unit of the White Mountain National Forest, and described as follows:

(Description below)

6. To see if it is expedient to revise the constitution.

7. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

8. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

9. To transact any other business that may come before this meeting.

PROPOSED LAND ACQUISITION BY U. S.

(See Article Five)

Starting at a point in the 1929 proclaimed Forest Boundary which is a point in common with the towns of Jefferson, Lancaster and Kilkenney;

Thence southerly and easterly along the Jefferson-Kilkenny town line to a point where said town line strikes the Randolph town line;

Thence southerly along the Jefferson-Randolph town line to the southeast corner of Lot 15 according to the lots as laid out in the town of Jefferson;

Thence westerly along the south lines of Lot 15 and Lot 14 to the southwest corner of Lot 14;

Thence northerly along the west line of Lot 14 to the southeast corner of Lot 3;

Thence westerly along the south line of Lot 3 to the southwest corner of said Lot;

Thence northerly along the west lines of Lot 3 and Lot 8 to the southeast corner of Lot 19;

Thence westerly along the south lines of Lot 19 and Lot 20 to the southwest corner of Lot 20;

Thence northerly along the west lines of Lot 20 and Lot 30 to the southeast corner of Lot 10 Range 11;

Thence westerly along the south line of Lot 10 Range 11 to the southwest corner of said Lot;

Thence northerly along the west line of Lot 10 Range 11 to the southeast corner of Lot 9 Range 10;

Thence westerly along the south line of Lot 9 Range 10 to the southwest corner of said Lot;

Thence northerly along the west line of Lot 9 Range 10 to the southeast corner of Lot 8 Range 9;

Thence westerly along the south line of Lot 8 Range 9 to the southwest corner of said Lot;

Thence northerly along the west line of Lot 8 Range 9 to the southeast corner of Lot 7 Range 8;

Thence westerly along the south line of Lot 7 Range 8 to the southwest corner of said Lot;

Thence northerly along the west lines of Lots 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 Range 8 to the northwest corner of Lot 1 Range 8 which is also a point in the Jefferson-Lancaster town line;

Thence easterly along the Jefferson-Lancaster town line to the point of beginning;

Containing 5,529 acres, more or less.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Jefferson, N. H., Feb. 1, 1937.

The schools opened for this last fall term with two changes in the teaching corps, Mr. Curtis having resigned during the summer vacation to accept a more advanced position at Caribou, Maine. Miss Jeanne Adams, a graduate of Plymouth Normal and a teacher of some experience, was appointed to the position of teacher at the Highlands.

The High School opened the new year with a change in the Headmastership, Mr. Philip R. Burlingame succeeding Mr. Richard Columbia. Mr. Burlingame has had many years experience as a high school executive and coach, and has been a member of the University of New Hampshire Faculty. He has a Master's Degree in Education.

The Senior High opened with an enrollment of 33 pupils, with three more registering later. There have been to date, five withdrawals, leaving a registration of 31, distributed as follows: Senior 1, Juniors 7, Sophomores 10, Freshmen 13. In the Junior High, there are 14 pupils.

In addition to the regular health examinations by the School Physician, Dr. Aldrich and School Nurse, Mrs. Spaulding, the State Department of Health has given the Audiometer tests to determine defective hearing. All pupils in town were thus tested.

Woody Arithmetic Tests have been given to determine individual differences in Arithmetic and assistance given to backward pupils.

The trio of students representing Jefferson High won the State Championship in Arithmetic at the Annual Scholarship Day held in May at Plymouth. Our champions were Earl Reed, Russell Crapo, and Mildred Bacon, now a student at New Hampshire University. We have reason to be proud of this achievement, as all schools in the State were in the competition.

A new subject was added to the curriculum this year—Physiography, or Geology. The Dramatic Club presented, in a very creditable manner, an amusing three act comedy to a very enthusiastic audience.

This year for the first time we shall have a Prize Speaking Contest.

Athletic teams are enjoying great success, and new uniforms for both boys and girls were paid for from Athletic Association funds.

Tardiness has been reduced, and the attendance has been excellent.

A Ditto Duplicating Machine has been purchased and is turning out material to assist the Grade School teachers as well as the High School.

Standardized tests have been given at intervals in the Grades and pupils generally are doing work commensurate with their ability.

The Starr King and Highlands schools are providing a warm noon lunch for their pupils.

The School Board and Superintendent have made an estimate of a proposed budget for 1937-38, and this estimate is to be found in another part of this report.
