Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pittsburg, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget and raise money for the same.
- 2. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to distribute blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to observe Old Home Day and raise money for same.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to elect a committee, or instruct the moderator to appoint a committee, to set the date and manage the Old Home Day observance.
- 6. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to investigate and define for public knowledge and use rights of way to First Connecticut Lake.
- .7 To see if the town will vote to have the Selectmen examine and if found suitable to accept an acre of land from Earl Philbrook for the sum of one dollar, to enlarge the Hollow Ceme-

tery with the provision that not more than one-third of the land will be cleared and lotted out at one time or until the land is needed for lots.

- 8. Providing Article 7 is accepted by the town.

 To see if the town will give the Selectmen authority to assess a sum not to exceed \$500.00 to fence and improve the land designated in Article 7 for cemetery purposes, if accepted by them as fit and suitable for such purposes.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to accept a strip of land from Earl Philbrook 50 feet wide, such land to be deeded to the Town of Pittsburg, said strip of land to leave the State Road 1900 feet south of the Beach Road turn and running towards Back Lake and along the Southernly shore of the same for a distance of one half mile, with the provision that if the Town accepts this land they are to build a road on the same leaving the roadside free of debris, also to raise the sum of \$3,000 to construct the proposed highway.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) to be laid out on the Cheese Factory Road.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to pay trucks \$1.25 per hour instead of \$1.00 to work on the summer roads and they shall haul 2 yards of sand or gravel instead of 1½ yards.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to finish the road between Metallak Road and Lee Wilkinson's known as the Stearns Road.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not to exceed \$1500.00 to buy one or more snow plows.

- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not to exceed \$200.00 to be contributed to the White Mountain Regional Association.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not to exceed \$200.00 for the purpose of preparing to seed, seed and fertilize the Town Lot so-called.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to elect a committee or have the moderator appoint a committee to bring in recommendations to the Selectmen by January 1st, 1951, for a suitable Soldier's Memorial to be erected on the Town Lot so-called.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not to exceed \$500.00 for the purpose of cutting out the Town Line.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to appoint all necessary Town Officers not listed under Article 19.
- 19. To bring in your ballots for one Selectman for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, one Library Trustee for 2 years and the following officers for one year.

 One Library Trustee, one Road Agent for the Lake District, one Road Agent for the Middle District, one Road Agent for the Lower District, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Three Auditors, three Trustees of Trust Funds, and one Overseer of the Poor.

Polls shall be opened at 10 A. M. and not close before 6 P. M.

- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory ob-

ligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to use any or all of the balance of the current school-year for the purpose of purchasing school equipment.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3000 to insulate and for general repair of the Danforth School Building and maintain this district school.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Pittsburg:

Foreword

In making provision for the operation of our schools, there are two primary factors to be considered. The one uppermost in our minds, in all probability, is the amount of money which will have to be raised and appropriated by our local community. With the loss of state aid in most cases and with generally increased enrollments, higher tuition rates, continued scarcity of elementary teachers, plus necessary expansion and improvements to meet pressing needs, increases will result. The extent to which these growing costs are to be met brings us to the second and more important factor to consider, namely, the returns on our investment—the degree to which our boys and girls mature as a result of their school experiences.

As important as are the accumulation and organization of facts in this scientific age, of vastly greater importance is their application to improve life situations. How effectively this is done will be determined very largely by a mind that has been developed over a period of years in such a way that it functions in making its independent estimate of things and in drawing its own conclusions. In order to provide opportunities for the building of this type of mature mind means, that throughout school, confronting it with problems to be solved, letting it search out relevant evidence, letting it learn to weigh this evidence, coming to a conclusion, and testing that conclusion. It means, further, the planning and maintaining of a long range program conducive, in so far as is possible, to the realization of this all important educational outcome which time alone can determine.

Teachers

This year three new teachers have joined the teaching staff. In the high school a veteran teacher with wide experience in this and other states, Helen Barclay, is teaching the English and French. Lula G. Bakoulis, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, teaches Social Studies and the Physical Sciences. In the elementary grades Ursula O. Jensen, an experienced teacher, is the teacher of Grades 3-4. We are again fortunate to have James A. Jordan return as headmaster and mathematics teacher, Marion K. Gray to teach commercial subjects, Doris E. Fissette to teach Grades 5-6 and Eva S. Schoff to teach Grades 1-2.

Enrollment and Attendance

The total enrollment as of this date is 137 as compared with 143 last year and 133 the previous year. Two of this number are tuition pupils from Clarksville. Five Pittsburg pupils are enrolled in the West Stewartstown School. The average percentage of attendance for the past year in Grades 1-6 was 92.63, Grades 7-8 was 93.95 and for the High School 94.93.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's Budget for 1950-51 which includes a provision of \$41,037 for the regular operating expenses plus principal and interest payments of \$13,860 on the bonds issued to finance con struction of the new school building totals \$54,897 as compared with a \$38,080 operating budget plus \$14,100 for principal and interest payments on the bond issue for the current school year, to make a total of \$52,180. With no state aid forthcoming and the estimated income reduced to \$150 makes the requested appropriation \$54,747.

New School Building

As last year when this report was submitted no actual construction has been started. The burning

of the old school building just at the time when the final details were being worked out with the contractor for the addition and alterations meant that work had to be started all over again, this time, for the construction of a new building. As a result the school board, building committee and architect had to put in much time and study in determining feasible plans to be submitted to the district for consideration and for the preparation of the subsequent specifications for the contractor. Now, at last, after a lapse of two vears since the district first voted to go ahead with construction, final arrangements have been made and the contract has been awarded to the Camillo Profenno Construction Company from Portland, Maine for \$128,614. Since the terms of the contract call for the completion of the building the latter part of the summer, it is expected that work will begin in the early Work upon the selection and purchase of equipment, the cost of which will be in addition to the above amount, has already been started.

Health

In addition to the several pupils who have attended the dental clinic conducted by Dr. Dickson during the past year, nearly 100% of all elementary pupils took advantage of the Sodium Fluoride Treatment given gratis by the Federal Government. Periodic examinations and check-ups have been made in the routine of the regular health supervision with special attention being given and follow-up work done in some cases.

Legislation

Little need be said under this caption. As a result of the big reduction in funds available for educational purposes and the reverting back to an old formula for their distribution, Pittsburg lost all of its state aid. With the exception of the teachers' retirement, which is to be taken up again at the special session this year, most of the other educational laws passed are confined to regulations governing the operation of our schools.

Conclusion

Although we may find ourselves unequipped with adequate facilities with which to measure the results, there is no more significant a task for our schools than to help prepare our young people to become mature thinking adults. The world needs, as never before, adults who meditate values, who consider the bearings of things, and who try to foresee the consequences

As in the past, may I again express my deep appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help received in our work together to maintain high standards in our schools.
