#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sandwich, in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the Ninth Day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see if the town will determine by vote the salary to be paid any of its officers or agents.

3. To raise money to pay interest on School Fund note for the year ensuing.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the support of the Library in addition to the amount required by law.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise money to pay the expense of decorating soldiers' graves.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the observance of Old Home Week.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the repair of the Notch and Dale road.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the maintenance of the Trunk Line road.

9. To raise money for the maintenance of State Aid roads.

10. To see if the town will re-appropriate the balance of the six hundred dollars raised in 1925 for the West Sandwich road to the State Aid construction ac- • count.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise money in

addition to the sum required by law to obtain State Aid for the construction of State road.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise money to build a new bridge at the Adams Mill Pond.

13. To raise money to make and repair highways and bridges and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise money to repair mill hill and bridge near Squam Lake.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise money to help eradicate the White Pine Blister Rust.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise money for fire protection.

17. To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen to install Electric fans in the town hall.

18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay town charges for the ensuing year.

19. To see if the town will vote to raise money to buy a stone crusher.

# Superintendent's Report

To the Citizens of Sandwich:

I hereby submit my fifth annual report as superintendent of schools, it being the seventh in the series of such reports.

The schools are moving along the same lines as usual and good progress is being noted. All the teachers are new except at the Center Schools and at Chick's Corner. We were glad to retain these teachers. The new ones have been welcomed to their respective schools. Pupils in the eighth grade are looking forward to attendance at the Quimby School. Nearly every pupil who graduates from the Grammar School goes to High School.

Our school record for the year ending June 30, 1925, showed an average attendance of 69, an average membership of 74 and a per cent. of 94. The total enrollment was 80—47 boys and 33 girls. Comparing this with the previous year, we find that the average attendance is exactly the same; the average membership has droppd from 76 to 74; the per cent. of attendance has risen from 90 to 94. Unfortunately the school population of Sandwich is growing less. I earnestly wish these beautiful hillsides might be peopled with good-sized families of children and our schools filled to capacity.

Since no place could be found for a teacher to board nearer than the village, it was found necessary to close the Lower Corner School. The pupils are now transported to the Center Schools.

There are six teachers now in the employ of the district:

Uldine M. Bryan at Chick's Corner has 11 pupils.

Marion C. Clark at East Sandwich has 5 pupils.

Mary L. Boyd at Whiteface has 11 pupils.

Edith A. Welch at North Sandwich has 6 pupils.

Nellie L. Muzzy at the Center Grammar School has 20 pupils.

Belle E. Forbush at the Center Primary School has 18 pupils.

The trustees of the Alfred Quimby Fund employ three teachers:

Kenneth M. Clark of the University of New Hampshire is headmaster and cares for the agriculture.

Isabelle Barnett of the University of New Hampshire has charge of the Quimby Cottage and the domestic arts work.

Gertrude L. Middleton of Plymouth Normal School teaches French, English and History.

I recommend that Sandwich unite with some other towns in employment of a school nurse who should visit the schools and look after the physical condition of the pupils.

I urge that girls from Sandwich attend Normal School and train for teachers.

#### QUIMBY SCHOOL

This school has its largest enrollment—32. It is fine that Sandwich can have a high school. We graduate the first class in June—two young men, both of whom plan to take advanced work at higher institutions of learning. A much-appreciated extra activity this year was the special opportunity for cabinet work and woodturning. The trustees provided a lathe and a special instructor, Willard H. Nute of Concord, and gave to boys who desired it a five day course of intensive work. It is not far to imagine that such project work might lead to the establishing of a wood-turning factory which could use the hard woods on the hillsides and give employment to citizens. Among the projects made were a floor lamp, butterfly table, rocking chair, and a tabouret.

#### REPAIRS

The buildings were cleaned and general repairs made in the summer. The seats were removed from Durgin schoolhouse—part being taken to Lower Corner and part to Chick's Corner. Slate blackboards were installed at Chick's Corner and a commodious book closet built. The walls were given a coat of paint. The North Sandwich schoolhouse was painted inside. Lower Corner schoolhouse was shingled. The Whiteface schoolhouse was painted on the walls and in the new toilet.

The playground at Whiteface should be graded. The yard at the Center should be graded and beautified. At least two buildings should be painted outside. The Center building should be equipped with chemical toilets.

#### CHARACTER EDUCATION

Special attention has been given to character education. An approved Moral Code has been provided for each school. In addition to the training which comes through the regular studies and play activities, special effort is made through clubs, noon lunch hour, special readings, and discussions to focus attention on character in citizenship.

I wish to thank the school board, teachers, pupils and citizens for helpful co-operation.
