To the inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the SEAL County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriation of the same
- 3. To hear the reports of Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$61.57 for Town Road Aid construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the relief of town poor.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire prevention, including fire trails.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$482.91 to purchase a portable fire pump, hose and equipment.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 to be used by the Committee in improving the town forest.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$80.00 for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.

15. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.

16. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$4,300.00 for repairs to the town hall, to purchase a lot of land and to build thereon a suitable town garage, this amount to be raised in two equal installments of \$2,150.00 each.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

School Superintendent's Report

Shelburne, New Hampshire,

February 1, 1946

To the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne:

At the present time your school has an enrollment of ten pupils with no one in the Eighth Grade.

The school opened this year with a new teacher, Miss Madeline E. Lary, in charge. Miss Lary is a graduate of Farmington State Teachers' College and also has the degree of B. S. from the University of Pittsburgh. As a result of regular semi-monthly visits of inspection and supervision, I would say that good work is being accomplished in this school.

We now have seven high school pupils registered at Gorham and two at Berlin. Two of these pupils are Seniors and will be graduated this spring, leaving a probable enrollment of seven High School pupils.

The percentage of attendance for the year ending June 30, 1945, was 89.9, somewhat lower than it should be. The enrollment by grades for the past complete school year was as follows:
