THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewratstown, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are notified to meet at the Town House in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk
 - (b) Selectmen for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer
 - (d) Five Road Agents
 - (e) One or more Constables
 - (f) One or more Sextons.
 - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (h) Overseer of Poor.
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Funds.
 - (j) One Library Trustee for three years ensuing.
- 2. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Selectmen. If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, as follows:

- (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
- (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
- (c) Election and Registration. (d) Town Hall Expense.
- (e) Damages and Legal Expense.
- (f) Health Department.(g) Vital Statistics.
- (h) Interest on Temporary Loans.
- (i) Interest on Long Term Bond.
- (i) County Tax.
- (k) State Tax.
- To raise such sums of money as may be neces-4. sary for support of the Poor.
- To raise such sums of money as may be neces-5. sary for the support of Libraries.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise seven hundred thirty-five (\$375.00) Dollars, for street lighting.
- 8. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police Dept., including care of tramps.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- 9. To see what sum of money, if any the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for Town Road Maintenance.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Winter Road.
- 11. To raise such sum of money necessary to pay on Bond.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to Accept State Aid.

- 13. To see it the Town will vote to Authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the Municipal year and to pay debts out of the Tax money when it is received.
- 14. To see it the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through a Tax Collector's Deed.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount for the payment of taxes on a sliding scale as follows: 3 percent for payment on or before June 15; 2 percent by August 1st; and 1 percent by October 1st, for the year ensuing.
- 16. To see if Town will vote to buy any new equipment and make appropriation for the same.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Australian Ballot at Town Meetings.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to Raise five hundred (\$500.00) Dollars for the purpose of widening roads, for plowing.
- 19. To see it the Town will vote to discontinue road from the Amede Biron buildings on Piper Hill to the Linwood Harriman Turn.
- 20. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.

- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to apply on the school debt.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Stewartstown School District:

General

Public Education in America today faces a task and a responsibility of proportions probably never surpassed. The schools have found the demands made upon them greatly increased both in volume and scope. As never before, public education is being looked to as the means of qualifying whole generations for the difficult business of living in a highly complex culture.

Heavy though the demands and problems may be, the schools have, and will continue to face them squarely just so long as they are able to secure the cooperation, support and good will of the people in the communities which they serve.

It is important to our society that the schools continue to provide an education and a fund of knowledge which will not only be worth while in itself but will also tend to make more intelligent, more constructive and more responsible men and women. It is paramount that the schools in cooperation with many other factors produce individuals capable of becoming effective citizens and efficient workers.

Buildings and Equipment

The buildings are for the most part in quite good condition. The usual summer repairs; oiling floors, replacing glass, varnishing desk tops, re-slating blackboards and cleaning were completed. The side and front steps at West Stewartstown were repaired. The front side of the Hollow School was shingled, the interior of the Bear Rock, South Hill and Cedar Brook Schools was lightened.

Health

Colebrook Special, Colebrook Town, Columbia, Errol and Stewartstown now form the district being served by Frances Varney as school nurse. During the past year she made 251 visits to schools, 452 physical defects of children were found.

Home visits were made and the following corrections secured: vision 23, teeth 150, tonsils 20, orthopaedic 1, skin 19, pediculosis 33 and vaccinations 17.

Any child in the Union may attend the dental clinics which are held at the offices of Dr. Dickson and Dr. Hughes. 'The local chapter of the American Red Cross very generously gave \$100.00 to assist children unable to pay the entire cost.

The number of children who had all of their work done at the clinics during the year is as follows: Columbia 5, Colebrook Special 45, Colebrook Town 1 and Stewartstown 6.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's budget for 1940-41 totals \$17,590.00 as compared with \$17,394.00 for last year. The estimated income for the coming year is State Aid \$5884.17, Dog Licenses \$20.00, or a total of \$5904.17. Approval of the budget as submitted would therefore require that \$11,685.83 be raised by taxation. This amount is \$804.78 less than the amount raised last year.

You will note that the school debt stands at \$4200.00. A small appropriation each year would shortly wipe out the district's indebtedness.

Tuition

There are 27 tuition pupils at Canaan, 17 at Colebrook and one at Pittsburg for a total of 45 and of this number eight are seniors. It would seem likely

that we might have a still larger high school enrollment this coming fall as there are 21 in the 8th grade.

Enrollment and Attendance

The total enrollment is 206 or three less than last year at this time. There are 103 at West Stewartstown, 55 in the rural schools, 27 at Cnnaan High School, 17 at Colebrook Academy, one at Ptitsburg and

3 at the Harvey Swell School.

The percentages of attendance with the exception of North Hill and South Hill were quite good. The Hollow School had a very commendable record of 98.30. The best tardiness record was made by West Stewartstown Intermediate room with 18 tardinesses for the school year. The poorest record was made by Cedar Brook School with 136.

Teachers

There were several changes in the teaching personnel of the district. Venus Mallis, Plymouth Normal School; was elected to teach grades 3 and 4 at West Stewartstown; Vida Wood, Farmington Normal School, was selected for the Cedar Brook School; Martha Goodwin, Gorham Normal School was elected to teach the North Hill School and Hope Barker, Plymouth Normal School, filled the vacancy at Bear Rock; Barbara Greenwood was transferred from the North Hill School to the Hollow School and resigned during the Christmas vacation.

Conclusion

Our schools symbolize the aspiration of our peoples and are the foundation of that equality of oppor-

tunity for which democracy stands.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and friends for the interest they have shown in the schools and for their loyal support during the past year.
