## INTRODUCTION

The new Sullivan Town Highway Barn is nearly complete. Construction work done in 1980 included all electrical work, insulation, exterior finish and installation of overhead doors. An oil heating system, purchased from 1980 appropriation is now being installed.

The East Sullivan Town Hall has had much use this past year, with an increasingly active recreation Department sponsoring the annual Halloween Party and Walt Disney movies at the hall. The newly formed Sullivan Teen group has, in short time, held two dances here, and numerous meetings and hearings have taken place at the hall. The resurgence of activity, coupled with an October survey of Sullivan taxpayers which strongly indicated that they favor the refurbishing of this building, both give credence to the idea that Sullivan needs its own place of gathering, whether for social or government events, for both young people and adults. Many residents have volunteered their time to wash and paint the interior in the Spring of 1981, and fund raising events are being planned to aid in the financing of renovations. There has been no vandalism at the Town Hall in 1980 - an encouraging turn of events!

The Police Department and Selectmen's Office are pursuing the publication and enforcement of local ordinances to ensure that Sullivan's growth is orderly, with an eye to future growth as well as present stability. Copies of the Residential Building Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, the Campground Ordinance as well as other statues by which the town is governed are available from both the Selectmen's Office and the Planning Board. Building permits may be obtained by application to the Selectmen.

An informal Town Meeting held in October proved informative to both the administration and residents - all offices and committees of the town benefit from the ideas and voiced concerns of townspeople; with this input, town government can be more responsive.

The audit of Sullivan town books and records by the State of New Hampshire was completed in October of 1980. The letter accompanying the full audit results is published in this copy of the Town Report.

The 5 ton Civil Defense truck acquired for the Town by Selectman Laurent Roberts is in the process of being modified to fill the Highway Department's needs. The near-finished hydraulic plow system should complete the refitting and add a valuable piece of equipment to the Highway inventory.

The Selectmen have contracted with the City of Keene for computer services; 1980 billing for both resident and property taxes was satisfactorily completed by this service, and this contract will be extended.

#### TRANSMITTAL AND COMMENTARY LETTER

Board of Selectmen - Sullivan Town Office Sullivan, New Hampshire 03445

Members of the Board:

We have examined the financial statements of the various funds of the Town of Sullivan for the year ended December 31, 1979 and have issued our report thereon, dated March 18, 1980. As part of our examination, we reviewed and tested the Town's system of internal accounting control to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards. Under these standards, the purpose of such evaluation is to establish a basis for reliance thereon in determining the nature, timing and extent of other such auditing procedures that are necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements. Such study and evaluation disclosed the following conditions that we believe to be material weaknesses.

#### Accounting System:

A general objective of an accounting system is to provide complete, timely and accurate financial information to all parties responsible and concerned with the Town's operations. In addition, the accounting system must provide the Board of Selectmen with the results of financial operations in an effective and timely manner in order to enable the Board to determine that financial operations comply with legal provisions and other constraints under which the Town operates. We found the Town's accounting and record keeping deficient with these objectives in the following areas:

## Tax Collector:

The Tax Collector did not maintain her cash receipts journal in the format prescribed by state regulations.

The procedures used in recording Yield Tax Security Deposits is improper.

#### Town Clerk:

The Town Clerk did not maintain her cash receipts journal in the format prescribed by state regulations.

The filing system was found to be most inefficient and audit time was excessive as a result of this system in use.

## Remittance Advice:

During the course of our examination, we noted that the Tax Collector and Town Clerk record the details of cash receipts remittances to the Treasurer on the same remittance advice. Because of this procedure, we were required to analyze in detail cash remittances for the year from the Tax Collector and Town Clerk to the Treasurer.

Both the Town Clerk and Tax Collector have been instructed in the proper accounting record that should be maintained and plan to impliment our recommendations for the year ended December 31, 1980.

## Safeguarding of Town Records and Cash:

During the course of our examination, we noted that valuable Town records and cash are not being secured in fireproof facilities. Because the cost of reconstructing these records, if possible, would be costly, we recommend that both the Tax Collector and Town Clerk's records be secured in fireproof facilities when not in use. This would also help prevent the potential theft of town funds (cash).

## Purchasing:

The Town does not have any formal guidelines for purchasing assets or supplies. As a good business practice, a bid system should be used at some dollar value that would enable the Selectmen to purchase at the most favorable price. All fuel and gasoline prices should be contracted for by season.

## Long-Term Debt:

The Town appropriated \$6,000 for debt service in 1979 and various amounts in years previous to 1979 without the liability for such debt. The appropriation was raised to recover previous unauthorized expenditures. There can be no appropriation if no liability is payable by the Town.

## Long-Term Authorization To Borrow:

The Town should rescind all open articles that authorized the borrowing of long-term debt by the Selectmen.

## Other:

The objective of internal accounting control is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance as to the safeguarding of assets against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and the reliability of financial records for preparing financial statements and maintaining accountability for assets. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that the cost of a system of internal accounting control should not exceed the benefits derived and also recognizes that the evaluation of these factors necessarily requires estimates and judgment by management.

There are inherent limitations that should be recognized in considering the potential effectiveness of any system of internal accounting control. In the performance of most control procedures, errors can result from misunderstanding of instructions, mistakes of judgement, carelessness or other personal factors. Control procedures whose effectiveness depends upon segregation of duties can be circumvented by collusion. Similarly, control procedures can be circumvented intentionally by management with respect either to the execution and recording of transactions or with respect to the estimates and judgments required in the preparation of financial statements. Further, projection of any evaluation of internal accounting control to future periods is subject to the risk that the procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions and that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

Our study and evaluation of the Town's system of internal accounting control for the year ended December 31, 1979, which was set forth in the first paragraph, would not necessarily disclose all weaknesses in the system.

## ARTICLE 4

To see if the Town will vote to borrow and appropriate the sum of \$200,000.00 including any and all other funds available for the purchase of the Ashuelot Ridge property (Map 3, Lot 030) currently owned by David and Ann Bradley, or any portion thereof, and to designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to use said monies to carry out the purpose for which they are borrowed and/or granted.

## ARTICLE 5

No opinion declared on Article 5, relative to the sale of the East Sullivan Community Hall.

#### ARTICLE 6

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the total sum of \$32,000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges and construction of the same for the ensuing year. \$17,000.00 to be raised by taxes, and \$15,000.00 to be withdrawn from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

Voted by voice vote, to delete the amount of \$10,990.00 to come from highway subsidy and additional highway subsidy.

## ARTICLE 7

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$531.41 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State's share of \$3,422.75.

## ARTICLE 8

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,700.00 to be used to complete the new Highway Building.

## ARTICLE 9

Motion to table Article 9, carried. Article 9 was laid on the table. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 for the purpose of installing a septic system for the East Sullivan Community Hall.

## ARTICLE 10

Moderator declared that no action to be taken on this Article. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80,000. for the purpose of improving the Gilsum Road.

## ARTICLE 11

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of purchasing highway equipment and place therein the amount of \$5,000.00 and designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purpose for which it was established.

#### ARTICLE 12

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,969.00 to provide and maintain public library service and authorize the Library Trustees to receive and use supplemental funds otherwise provided.

#### ARTICLE 13

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,375.00 for the operation of the Fire Department for fire protection and purchase and maintenance of equipment and building for the Fire Department.

#### ARTICLE 14

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the operation of the Police Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment for the Police Department.

## ARTICLE 15

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the care and maintenance of Town Cemetaries.

## ARTICLE 16

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of revaluation of the Town to be added to the existing Capital Reserve Fund.

## ARTICLE 17

Voted, by voice vote, to increase the amount by \$3,700.00 to \$4,200.00 to be raised and appropriated for the purpose of defraying cost of a "Walk in Audit" conducted by the State of New Hampshire.

## ARTICLE 18

Theodore and Constance R. Sheehan Fund \$200.00 Edson Family Fund 400.00

The Francis D. and Gwendolyn Johnson Fund was not accepted, because of insufficient funds.

#### ARTICLE 19

Amendment was voted, by voice vote, to add "expend"

- 21. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for and to accept, on behalf of the Town, and to expend any and all gifts, grants or other funds which may now or hereafter be forthcoming over and above the total appropriations voted by the Town.

- $22.\ \ \text{To}$  authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 23. To vote to accept the reports of Agents, Auditor and Committees as printed in the Town Report.
- 24. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting and to listen to opinions of a purely advisory nature in regard to the conduct of Town Affairs for the ensuing year.

#### NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

A new law effective April 1, 1978 imposes a penalty for failure to file a <u>fully</u> completed inventory form.

"RSA 74:7-a Penalty for Failure to File. Any person who fails to file a fully completed inventory form on or before April 15, unless granted an extension under RSA 74:8, shall pay a penalty of one percent of the property tax for which he is liable. In no case, however, shall the penalty be less than \$10 or more than \$50. Any person who fails to file an inventory form and who becomes liable to pay the penalty specified in this section shall lose his right to appeal any matter pertaining to the property tax for which he is liable or exemptions to which he may be entitled. This penalty has all the force of taxation and shall be treated as incident to the tax."

Inventory blanks are mailed before March 25 as required under RSA 74:5, but if for any reason you fail to receive one, you should contact the Selectmen to obtain one and complete it as required above.

### SULLIVAN PUBLIC LIBRARY REPORT

The Sullivan Public Library has 210 registered patrons: 2,783 books were borrowed in 1980 and 501 state Bookmobile books were loaned. There are close to 3,000 town books and six monthly magazines available for circulation. The New Hampshire Bookmobile came twice in 1980. Books purchased in 1980 totaled 185 and 237 used books were donated by town residents.

At various times during the year the library display case has held exhibits of old tinware, old valentines, antique letter-writing implements and old letters (during National Letter-Writing Week), maple sugaring equipment, old Easter cards and Ukranian decorated Easter eggs, an antique key collection, fossils, locally made crafts, old school books and early Sullivan school records.

On March 26th Herbert Nims was guest speaker at an evening program with a slide show on Taxidermy and an elaborate exhibit of his work.

August at the library featured a premier exhibition of Pam Sayre's oil paintings with an Open House Tea on August 2 to meet Pam. One of her local scenes, painted on the Valley Road, was purchased from the Bessie Jewett Memorial Fund and will remain on the library wall.

On September 24 an evening slide show program was presented by Marjorie Smith on the History of Nostalgia

of a Small Town (Sullivan).

The library was filled with kites on October 16. Chester McMartin of Keene spent the day at the Sullivan school helping the children make and fly kites and in the evening he presented a kite film at the library to top off a busy "Kite Day" in town that was co-sponsored with the P.T.O.

The trustees presented a Holiday Food/Craft Night on November 12. Betsy Smith, a floral designer at Anderson's Florist Shop in Keene, demonstrated wreathmaking and holiday arrangements using three types of greens. Everyone was invited to bring a gift-making idea and/or a holiday food for sampling. Instructions and recipes were exchanged.

Three \$5 gift certificates were awarded by the library trustees for a Father's Day Essay Contest in June on "What My Father Means To Me." Winners were

Loriann Lancy and Jennifer and Gail Knox.

A story hour for pre-schoolers was started during National Library Week in April and continued on Saturday

mornings for several months.

Twenty-eight children participated in the "Star League" Summer Vacation Reading Program from the end of June through August. Top readers were Betsy & Tammy Bourassa, Robin & Cheryl Bice, and Gail Knox. Robin Bice won the Moon-Rock Guessing jar contest, and Gail Knox was winner of the Bookmark designing contest. A Splash-Down Party was held at the library on August 27

with refreshments & presentation of awards and book-marks.

Darlene Marshall and Gail Knox have been volunteer Junior Library Helpers this past year and their work has been much appreciated.

A Coupon-Exchange basket was started in 1980. Granite posts were placed at the front of the library during the summer and flowers at the front of the buil-

ding were an enjoyed attraction.

Trustees and several interested residents of town spent an evening at the library sorting out old town records. A donation has been received with which to purchase folders and materials necessary to preserve and file records in permanent order and this will be an on-

going project to be completed in 1981.

Library trustees collected recipes from local cooks and in November printed the first issue of a Sullivan Cookbook on holiday foods. The cost of the booklet was \$1, benefit of the library. Calico-covered notebooks to fit the booklets were made by Libby Corindia and were available for \$3.50. The first recipe booklet will be followed by others during the coming year with recipes using maple syrup, maple sugar and honey being planned for the March 1981 cookbook.

Marjorie Smith was appointed librarian in 1980 after the resignation of Kay Pearl. Elizabeth Corindia was appointed a new library trustee to replace Gwen Johnson who resigned because of her 8-month residence out-of-town.

# MONADNOCK REGION SCHOOL DISTRICT-BOARD REPORT

1980 brought several significant changes to the Monadnock Schools and in particular to the Northern Elementary Schools. Margaret Regan assumed duties as principal of the Northern Schools replacing David Bell who became principal of Mt. Caesar and Cutler Schools in Swanzey. Dave Bell will be missed in the northern towns and deserves our thanks for his efforts over the years. Miss Regan is doing an excellent job and is one of the hardest working principals in the district and we feel fortunate that she chose to come to New Hampshire. In general, our Elementary Schools are doing an excellent job and we in Sullivan should be thankful for what I consider to be a superior staff at the Sullivan School.

Monadnock High continues to do an excellent job for our students. Anyone who wishes to take the time will discover that our students gain acceptance to some of the finest schools in the country.

I can't help but point out that in spite of rising costs Monadnock School District has one of the lowest per pupil costs in the state. Approximately \$1500.00 - \$1600.00 per pupil. One of the reasons school costs in Sullivan jumped was because of student numbers. We had approximately 4% of the students in the district and this year we have approximately 5% of the students, that's a 20% increase in pupils. The number changes every two years when the state takes a student census.

The budget this year will take a jump of about 13.8% including salary increases. At this writing the Budget Committee has not met to review the figures and the percent increase may change. There will be three bond issues on the school warrant. The board has set priorities and number one is five classrooms added to the high school for \$450,000.00. Number two is \$450,000.00 for a new roof and number three is a combination cafeteria gym for the junior high for \$500,000.00. All of the above are capital improvements and the district will receive 55% state aid. The bond issue for the present high school will be paid for this year and this will mean little if any increase in money for bond issue payments. proposal is modest and necessary and I urge Sullivan voters to support the proposal. The longer we delay the more expensive things become.

### REPORT OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT 1980

The winter of 79-80 ended with minimal snowfall. We did have problems with ice build up and culverts freezing. A lot of this was due to the lack of snow. Several roads washed out because of the culverts freezing. We did what was necessary to correct and possibly prevent these problems. Due to the type of winter we had we finished with a surplus of road sand.

The summer brought us into general road maintenance. We put approximately sixteen hundred yards of gravel on the roads throughout the town. Some culvert work was done on the Valley Road along with the removal of several large boulders. Major repair work was required on the grader to keep it in good operation.

The department has purchased a new pickup style sander. It has really proven to be a great help entering the winter of '80-'81.

Work is progressing on complete outfitting of the town's 5 ton dump truck for winter snow removal and summer maintenance.

Culvert work was done on Bowlder Road with money from the income of the John Woodburn Trust Fund, set up for the maintenance of this town road.

### SULLIVAN PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board held two meetings each month during 1980: the first and third Wednesdays at 7:30 p.m. at the public library. The first Wednesday of each month is a regular meeting to transact all legal business. The third Wednesday is reserved for a work session to discuss town needs.

For the past half year the Board has been discussing and preparing a zoning ordinance. The Southwest Region Planning Commission with its expertise and knowledge has contributed greatly toward the completion of our Comprehensive Planning Program and the proposed zoning ordinance. The Zoning Ordinance will be voted on at the March 1981 town meeting.

The Comprehensive Planning Program was adopted April 2, 1980 after more than a year's study and work. The Planning Program provides an assessment of the community and makes recommendations to guide future growth and is intended to be used as a flexible guide for development over the next 15 to 20 years. It is advisory in nature and carrying out its recommendations depends on actions of the Town Meeting in passing various land controls, capital improvements, programming, land acquisition, tax policies, etc.

The Board approved five 2-lot subdivisions of land

in 1980 for the following people:

October 5, 1980: Sullivan's historic Town Pound on the South Road was cleared of brush by volunteers. On November 8th 15 history buffs walked to Table Rock, the Stone Cave, Houghton's ledges, and the old Price quarry. Other historic walks are planned for 1981.

## REPORT OF THE SULLIVAN FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Sullivan Fire Department wishes to thank the many people who have donated to the Fire Department. Also the Firemen's Wives organization would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who have donated to our very successful food sales.

The Fire Department held an Open House on November 15, 1980 at which the Firemen gave demonstrations and Keene Fireman Paul Symonds, Jr. brought Keene's ladder truck and helped with the demonstrations. The Firemen's Wives served refreshments and there were games for the children. There will be another Open House in the Spring; we hope you will all attend.

There have been several chimney fires in town caused mainly by wood-burning stoves. Anyone installing a wood burning stove who would like to have it checked may feel free to contact someone from the Fire Department. Other fires in town have included four structure fires, automobile accidents and automobile fires.

Norman Houle has taken extensive training in Keene this year and is now certified to train other Firemen. He will be giving training sessions in 1981.


