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SHAHEEN, HASSAN, SHEA-PORTER REMAIN POPULAR; 2ND DISTRICT DIVIDED ON KUSTER

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DURHAM, NH – Senator Jeanne Shaheen continues to be the most popular member of the state's congressional delegation and her colleague Senator Maggie Hassan is also popular in the state. However, the popularity of both senators among Democrats has slightly declined since October. Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter, who is retiring at the end of her term, has seen an increase in popularity since October while Congresswoman Ann Kuster has seen a decrease.

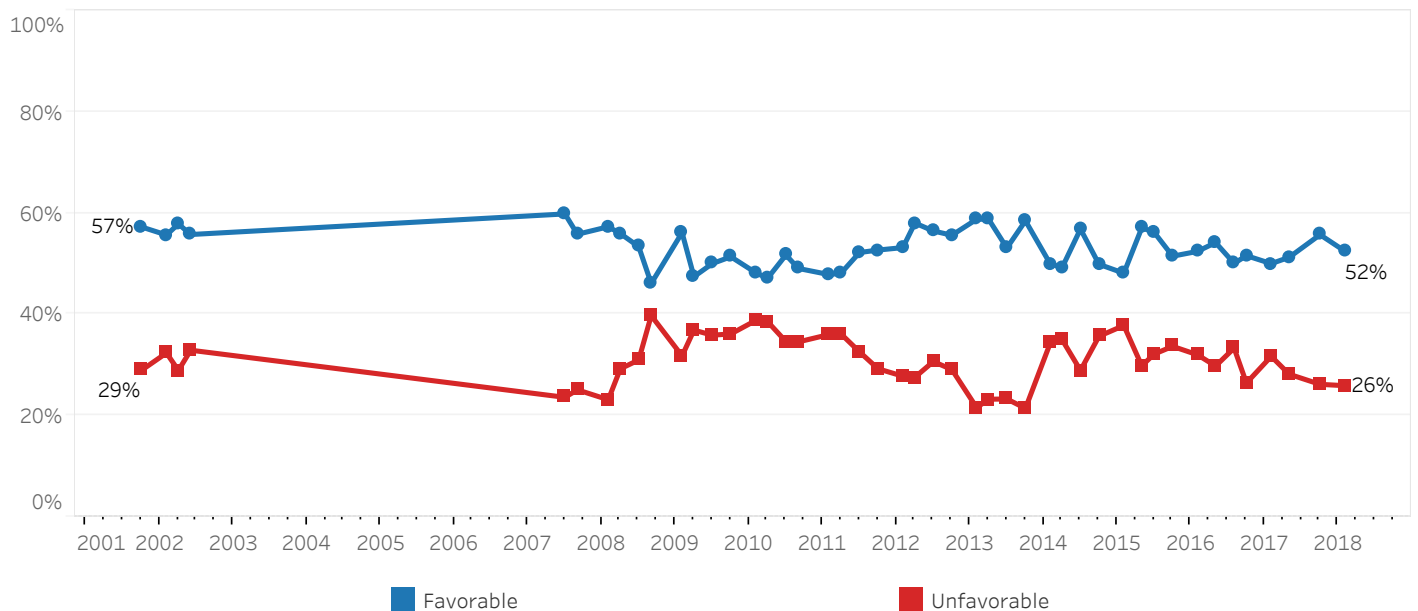
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and twenty-three (523) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 28 and February 10, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. Included were 275 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 5.9%) and 248 from the Second District (MSE +/- 6.2%).

Favorability - Jeanne Shaheen

New Hampshire Senior Senator and former Governor Jeanne Shaheen continues to be popular in the state. Currently, 52% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 26% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral, and 13% don't know enough about her to say.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016 (84% favorable), self-described liberals (77%), NHPR listeners (76%), Seacoast residents (74%), self-identified Democrats (73%), those who have completed postgraduate work (66%), *Boston Globe* readers (65%), and college graduates (64%) are most likely to view Shaheen favorably. Those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016 (21%), self-identified Republicans (22%), self-described conservatives (25%), conservative talk radio listeners (29%), those with a high school education or less (38%), and Central/Lakes Region residents (41%) are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Shaheen.

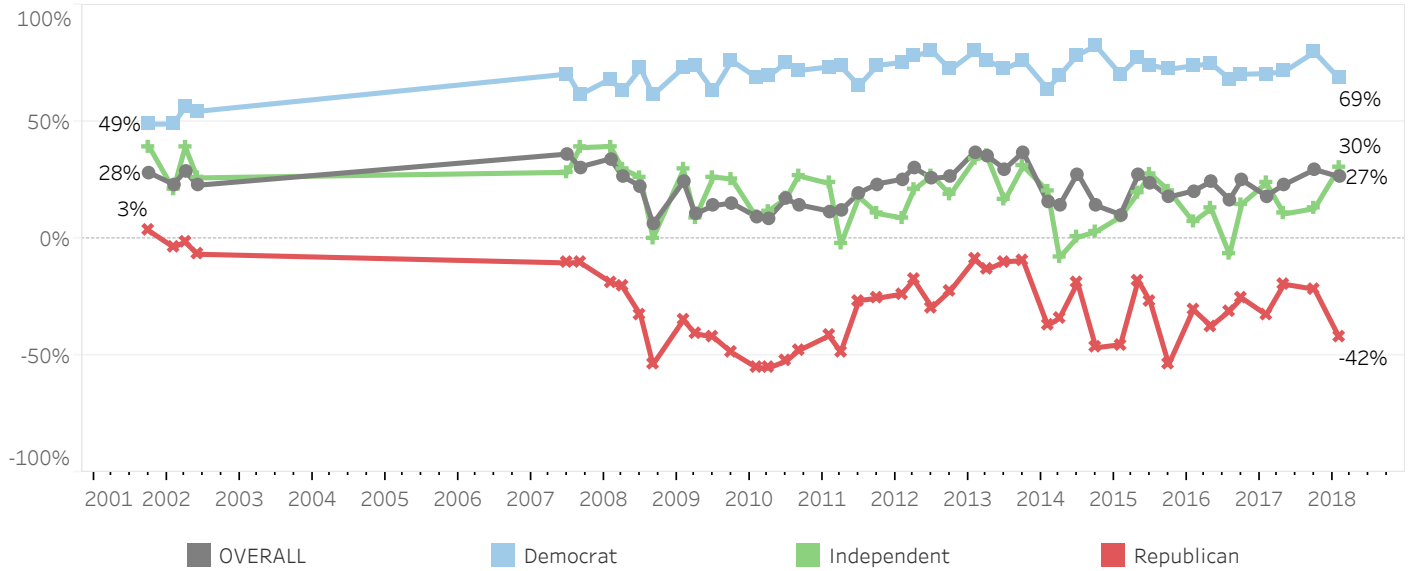
Shaheen Favorability Rating

Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have a unfavorable opinion) is +27%, largely unchanged since October (+30%). She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +69%) and somewhat popular among Independents (+30%), but unpopular among Republicans (-42%). Shaheen's net favorability has declined among Democrats (+80% in October, +69% currently) and Republicans (-22% in October, -42% currently) but has improved among Independents (+13% in October, +30% currently).

 Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

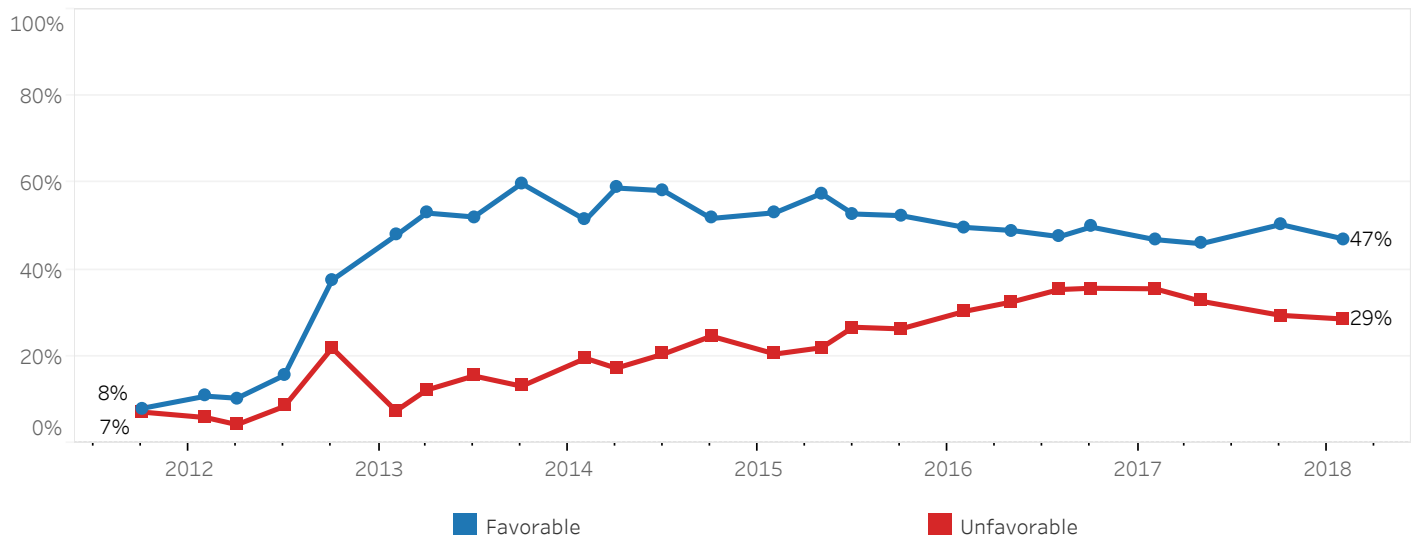


Favorability - Maggie Hassan

New Hampshire's Junior Senator Maggie Hassan is slightly less popular than her colleague Jeanne Shaheen. Currently, 47% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Hassan, 29% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 7% are neutral, and 17% don't know enough about her to say.

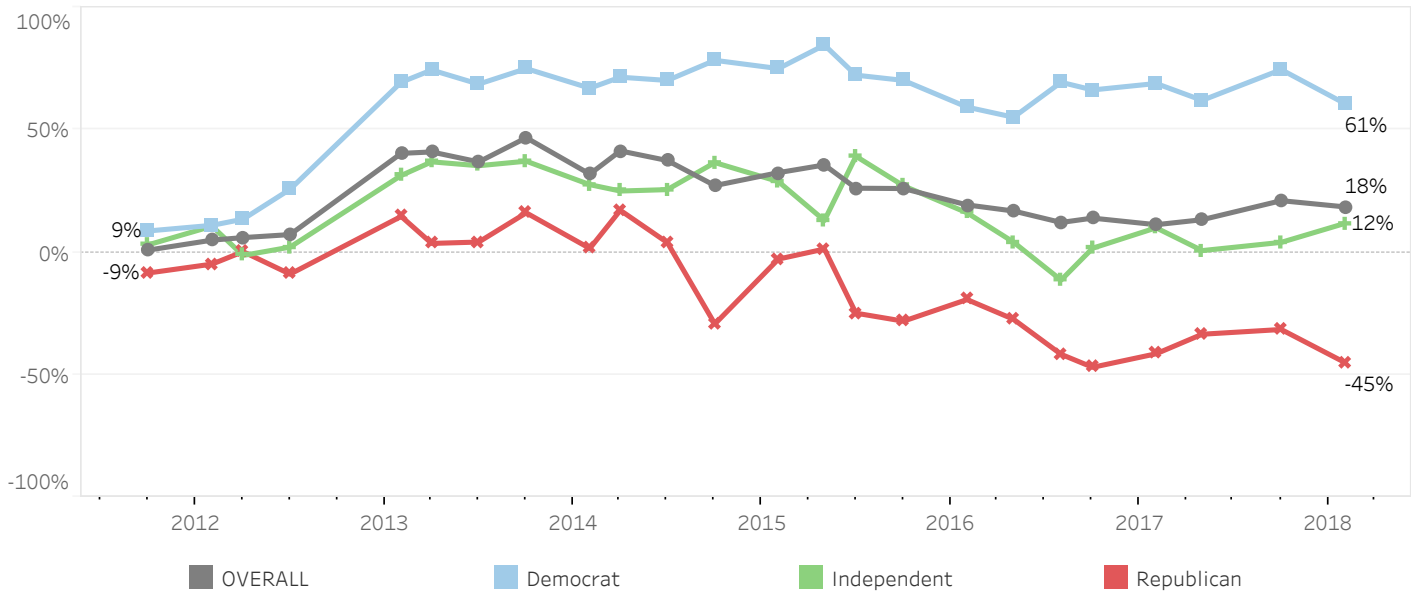
Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016 (82% favorable), self-identified Democrats (70%), NHPR listeners (68%), Seacoast residents (65%), self-described liberals (63%), those who have completed postgraduate work (62%), *Boston Globe* readers (60%), self-described moderates (59%), *Union Leader* readers (58%), and college graduates (57%) are most likely to view Hassan favorably. Conservative talk radio listeners (13%), those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016 (18%), self-identified Republicans (18%), self-described conservatives (20%), Central/Lakes Region residents (30%), those with a high school education or less (34%), and Massachusetts Border residents (37%) are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Hassan.

Hassan's net favorability rating is +18%, largely unchanged since October (+21%). She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +61%) and somewhat popular among Independents (+12%) but unpopular among Republicans (-45%). Hassan's net favorability has fallen among Democrats (+75% in October, +61% currently) and Republicans (-32% in October, -45% currently).

 Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

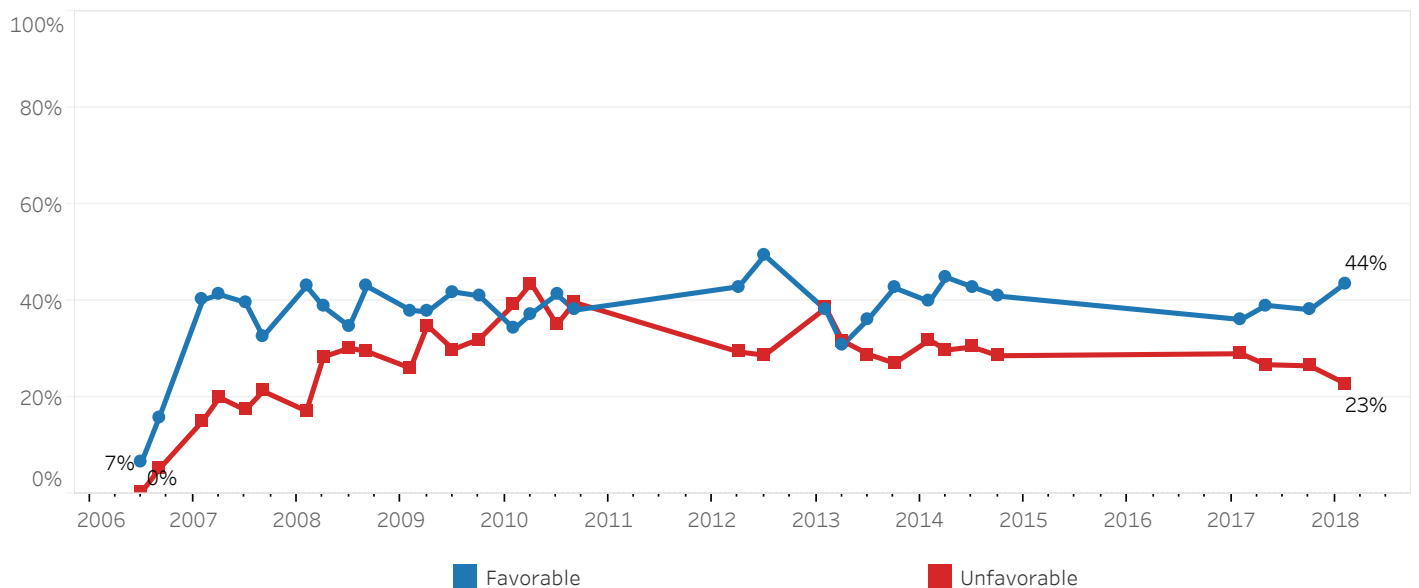


Favorability - Carol Shea-Porter

Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter, who will be retiring from Congress at the end of her current term, is somewhat popular in New Hampshire's First District. Currently, 44% of residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District have a favorable view of Shea-Porter, 23% have an unfavorable view of her, 10% are neutral, and 24% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +21%, slightly higher than in October (+11%).

Shea-Porter is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +60%), somewhat popular among Independents (+30%), and unpopular among Republicans (-50%).

Shea-Porter Favorability Rating - First District

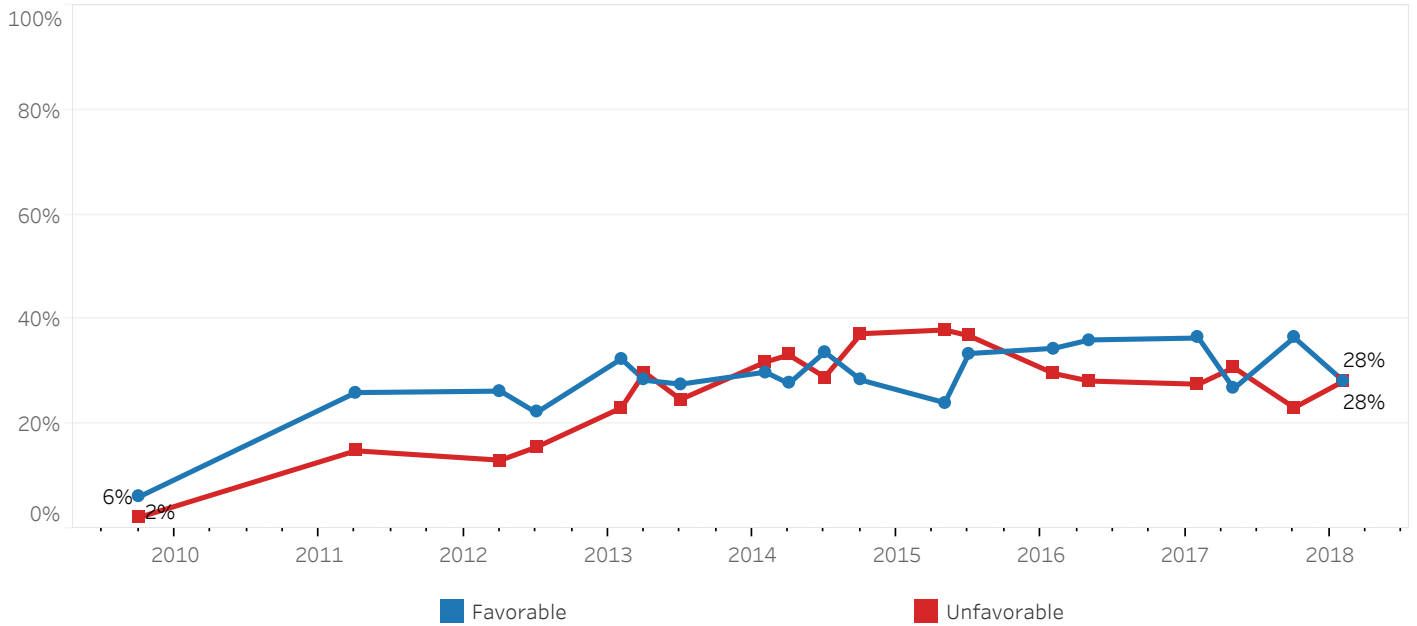


Favorability - Ann Kuster

Second Congressional District residents remain divided in their opinion of Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster, with many saying they don't know or are unsure about her. Currently, 28% of residents of New Hampshire's Second Congressional District have a favorable view of Kuster, 28% have an unfavorable view of her, 14% are neutral, and 30% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is 0%, down from +14% in October.

Kuster remains somewhat popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +23%) but is much less popular among them than in October (+58%). Independents are neutral on Kuster (-6%) and she remains unpopular among Republicans (-33%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and twenty-three (523) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between January 28 and February 10, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. Included were 275 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 5.9%) and 248 from the Second District (MSE +/- 6.2%). The design effect for the survey is 1.3%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
