STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Warner in the County of
Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said
Warner on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of
the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray
town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of
the same.
3. To see if the Town will change the method of paying the tax
collector from a percentage basis to a salary of Eight Hundred
(800) Dollars per year and rescind any and all resolutions which
may now exist in the Town Records pertaining to tax collector's
salary.
4. On petition of ten or more legal voters, to see if the Town
will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Sixteen Thousand
(16,000) Dollars to purchase and install a new heating plant in
the town hall central heating system; the sum of Two Thousand
(2,000) Dollars plus interest to be raised by taxation in 1956;
and the selectmen and town treasurer authorized to borrow the
remaining amount on the note, or notes, of the Town, to be paid
Two Thousand (2,000) Dollars annually until said note or notes
are paid.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the
sum of One Hundred (100) Dollars for the Dartmouth-Lake Suna-
pee Region Association for the purpose of promoting and publi-
cizing the natural advantages of the Town, together with other
towns in the region.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the
sum of Four Hundred (400) Dollars towards payment of the
Concord Hospital deficit.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the
sum of Four Hundred (400) Dollars for Pine Blister Rust Con-
trol in the Town in co-operation with the State Forestry De-
partment.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred (300) Dollars to complete Depot Street.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand (5,000) Dollars for a new truck, plow, wing and plow mount; the sum of Twenty Five Hundred (2500) Dollars to be raised by taxation in 1956 and to authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow on the note, or notes, of the Town the sum of Twenty Five Hundred (2500) Dollars to be payable on or before December 31, 1957.

10. To see if the Town will vote that all resolutions voted on at Town Meeting be recorded by the Town Clerk in the records of the Town as presented and number of yes and no votes cast be included.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow money in the anticipation of taxes on the note, or notes of the Town, payable on or before December 31, 1956.

12. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to sell property taken for taxes.

13. To hear reports of the officers of the Town heretofore chosen and committees appointed and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

Be A Good Citizen - Cooperate

Smoking and debris burning caused more than 50 percent of the forest fires occurring in the state of New Hampshire in 1955 - 235 fires out of a total of 463 originated from these two sources. Lighted smoking material and matches thrown from moving vehicles along the highway or dropped by fishermen, hunters, hikers, berry and flower pickers accounted for 26 percent; debris burning in the wrong place or at the wrong time by those who failed to heed all pleas for safety or refused to recognize the logical, sensible rules and regulations set up under legislative authority governing the use of fire in or near woodlands accounted for more than 24 percent. This is inexcusable.

Everything possible is being done officially to remedy the situation. Since 1909 there has been a statute on our law books which requires everyone to secure written permission from the local forest fire warden before starting a fire in or near woodlands or where fire can be communicated to woodlands, unless the ground is covered with snow. A never ending program of educational work is being carried on by your local warden and state officials to inform the general public both of the value and necessity of securing the required permit for such burning. Much progress has been made, but there are still many who fail or refuse to cooperate. The value of our permit system was definitely proven in this district during the 1955 calendar year. Local wardens issued 3,864 permits for debris burning fires. That's a lot of permits. The records show only 2 permit fires got out of control. This proves several things - while wardens were liberal in the issuance of fire permits, accommodating every applicant so far as possible, they were cautious, following closely directives outlining overall policy governing the issuance of burning permits and thoroughly instructing permit users. The latter, too, fully appreciating their responsibility in using their permits, governed themselves accordingly. Result? Much burning done legally and safe.

But what of the smokers? Despite all the efforts of those officially charged with the responsibility of preventing fires, too many were careless or thoughtless in disposing of smoking material and matches. Why? It is difficult to say. Autos are now equipped with ash trays. Why not use them. The crushing out of a cigar, cigarette and the complete extinguishment of matches before being discarded is an easy chore.

If the costly habits of the careless and indifferent smoker and debris burner could be overcome, more than half of our annual

forest fires would be eliminated. Will YOU do YOUR share to bring this about?

REMEMBER

1. Get a written permit from your local warden before starting your debris burning or camp fire. The law requires it.
2. Make certain they are dead out before leaving them.
3. Become a safe smoker by extinguishing smoking material and matches before discarding them.

There has been only one change in the teaching staff this year. Miss Catherine Shaw was employed as second grade teacher at the grade school. We have been very fortunate in the past two years in having a very small teacher turnover. The supply of teachers continues to be much less than the demand for them, and there are no signs that this situation will change in the next few years.

Simonds Free High School has done its share in the past in sending its graduates on to teacher training institutions. If other high schools in the state had done as well there would be more teachers available. This year we hope to have one or two seniors observe in the grade school in hopes that their interest in teaching will continue. The more young people are encouraged to enter the teaching profession, the better off we will be. We adults should encourage young people to enter the teaching profession. The need is very urgent. At the present time, I have had one position open for a month with no prospects in sight at the moment.

Our School population has not changed very much in the past few years, and our census figures indicate little change over the next five or six years. There may be some increase in high school population as the bulge we have had in the grade schools reaches the high school. The population in the lower grades in the sending towns indicates a slight increase in tuition pupils for four or five years and then a slight decrease in tuition pupils. Few of the Sutton children now attend Simonds and only about half of the Webster pupils now attend Simonds. Therefore, we must conclude that there won't be any radical change in the population of the Warner Schools.

Some improvements have been made in the property. New fluorescent lights have been installed in the Junior High room so that for the same cost we are getting about twice as much lighting as we had previously. More lighting should be added to the other rooms. A new heating system has been installed in the Principal's house and this will be paid for over a period of time by increased rent. Certainly the property is more valuable with an adequate heating system.

I have enjoyed my work in Warner and wish to thank the parents, School Board and teachers for their cooperation.

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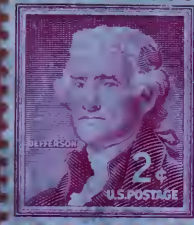
