To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wentworth Location in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Schoolhouse in said Wentworth Location on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Water System.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Poor.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
8. To see what sum of Money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12.09 to the White Mountain Region Association, it being 10c per \$1,000.00 of the assessed valuation.
11. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano, be adopted in this Town?
12. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Collector of Taxes additional compensation for his service in collecting the State Head Tax and to fix the amount thereof.
13. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment and interest on Light Line Note.
14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
