HOUSE OF CORRECTION.

To the County Commissioners,

Gentlemen:

The number of persons committed to the House of Correction the past year was thirty-nine, for the following offences: Vagabond, 1; Common Drunkards, 14; Drunk and intoxicated, 11; Idle and Disorderly, 3; Embezzlement, 1; Assault, 1; Tramps, 8.

In consequence of the large number at the House of Correction the expenses for board and clothing have been larger than usual. Only \$35.88 in cash for fines and costs has been received, while the remaining amount has been paid in labor by those who could not pay in cash. Much of the labor performed has been for permanent improvements on the farm and buildings, for which the County will realize much benefit, hereafter.

Several who have been at the House of Correction have become steady, industrious, and good citizens. It is hoped that others will follow their example.

COUNTY JAIL.

The number of persons committed to Jail the past year was six, for the following offences: Assault, 1; Fornication, 1; Taxes, 1; Stealing, 1; Incendiary, 2.

Committed to State Prison, 3; Discharged, 3. There is no person in jail at present.

In presenting the Annual Report of expenditures in maintaining the County Poor, we would briefly say for the year the number of County Paupers has largely increased, the changing of the law in regard to gaining town settlements having thrown nearly all the town paupers upon the County, thus while largely increasing

the expenses of the County, in due proportion decreasing the expenses of the several towns.

We have a large number of County Paupers besides those supported at the farm, many of them being supported as cheap, and, in many instances, cheaper than they could be at the farm. While there are a number of aged people that cannot be removed to the County farm, and while they live it will cost more to support them than it would at the County farm.

The County Farm and Alms House have been under the superintendence of Wm. S. Woodman and wife, who have managed the same with reference to the comfort of the inmates, for the interest of the County, and, as heretofore, to the entire satisfaction of the Commissioners. Their services have been secured for another year.

During the past year a building one and one-half stories high, 26x80 feet, has been built, and is used for a wood, wash, and dry house, which was much needed, there being no building suitable for the storage of wood, or for washing and drying clothes, which has to be done daily, the lumber for the same being taken from the farm, while the labor of building the same with the exception of a portion of the carpenter and mason work, was done by the Superintendent and the ordinary help on the farm.

We further say that the buildings on the County farm are all nearly new, convenient and well adapted for the purpose for which they were erected, and no further buildings will be necessary for many years to come, the only expense for buildings will be the ordinary repairs on the same.

The Commissioners have deemed it proper to include in this Report a condensed statement of the transactions of the Superintendent of the County Farm and Alms House, showing his receipts and expenditures in managing that institution, believing it will be satisfactory to the tax-payers of the County.

Also, hereto annexed will be found the Report of the County Treasurer, giving a very satisfactory statement of the financial standing of the County.
