Town Meeting Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Benton qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Building in said Benton on the second Tuesday of March next (March 14th) at ten o'clock in the forencon to vote and act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, John Boutin being the outgoing member, one Highway Agent, one Tax Collector, one Town Treasurer, one Auditor, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, and all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To hear the reports of officers and agents heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for town officers' salaries and expenses, for the repair and maintenance and construction of highways and bridges, for the observance of Memorial Day, and all other town charges and expenses for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see what action the Town will take in regard to how Memorial Day will be observed.
- Article 5. To see what action the Town will take to authorizing the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with delivery of inventory blanks until April 1st.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of property taken by the Town by tax deeds.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the requested sum to be paid to the White Mountain Region Association.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize a discount of 2 per cent on taxes paid before a date authorized by the Selectmen.
- Article 11. This Town Meeting Warrant shall remain open for articles to be inserted by the Selectmen until posting date.
- Article 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Benton School District:

I herewith submit my seventh annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment of the school in 1948-49 was 21, the average membership 18.97 and the percentage of attendance 97.52. There were few tardinesses. There was one pupil attending Lisbon High School, two elementary pupils attending at Warren, two at North Haverhill and four high school pupils attending Haverhill Academy.

At Benton Street School this year the total enrollment is 20. There are eight pupils attending high school, six at Haverhill and two at Lisbon. One pupil is attending elementary school at Pike and three at Glencliff.

Benton has three tuition pupils from the Town of Easton.

The total appropriation voted at school meeting last year was \$4,500. You received an increase in state aid so that your appropriation was reduced to \$4,100. This year your school board recommends an appropriation of \$3,860 permitting another reduction in your school tax.

Several people have asked me about teachers' salaries. The average salary for women elementary teachers in the State of New Hampshire this year is \$2,414. Out of the 1650 women elementary teachers employed there are but 100 who receive a salary of \$1,900 or less. At the present time the State Department is granting about 300 special teacher permits. Benton and many other schools would close if these permits were not granted. The shortage of elementary teachers will continue for several years.

Benton is one of the fortunate communities able to maintain a good one-room school during the past few years. The work of Mrs. Paige and the interest of the parents have been a real help to the education of the children.

I wish to thank the school board and teacher for their cooperation.
