TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Candia in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Odd Fellows Hall in said Candia on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for Memorial Day.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be used for the maintenance of fire apparatus and equipment of the Candia Volunteer Firemen's Association, Inc., the money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the use of the Smyth Public Library Association, the money to be expended under the direction of the Association.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for white pine blister rust control, the money to be spent in co-operation with and under the direction of the State Forestry Department.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred and forty-two dollars and sixteen cents (\$542.16) for Town Road Aid, to which the state will contribute two thousand one hundred and sixty-eight dollars and sixty three cents (\$2,168.63).
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00)

for summer maintenance of roads and bridges, and the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for general expenses of the highway department.

- 8. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to purchase snow removal equipment, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to accept such trust funds as have been received the past year.
- 10. To see what additional charges the town will instruct the tax collector to make on poll taxes after October first.
- 11. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and treasurer to negotiate temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 12. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to provide for Non-Partisan Ballot System etc. in accordance with the Act recently enacted by the New Hampshire Legislature.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the further sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) to repair the Fitts Museum.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to provide for additional fire and police protection, and for the use of the town Health Officer and Board of Health due to the war emergency.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of the Abbott Road, so called, lying between the entrances, as now used, to the residences of Mrs. Martin Dubiel and Waldo Glidden.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of the budget not already acted upon, and authorize the selectmen to raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
