TOWN WARRANT

(LS) THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday the 11th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon (the polls to close at 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year, and a Selectman, Trustee of the Trust Funds and a Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for Class V roads, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$370.25 for that purpose, the State to pay \$1,481.00.
- Art. 4. To see if the town will accept State aid for Class V highway bridges, and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for that purpose.
- Art. 5. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges, and keeping the roads open during the winter.
- Art. 6. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the General Expense of the Highway Department.
- Art. 7. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting, and for lighting town buildings.
- Art. 8. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting brush on the roadsides of the town highways.

Art. 9. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the upkeep of cemeteries.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for its use during the year, in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1946 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the salaries of the Selectmen.

Art. 13. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of buying culverts.

Art. 14. To see what action the town will vote to take in regard to building a road from the Ferry Place, so called, to Rockybound Pond, and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for said purpose.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control, to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.

Art. 16. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Art. 17. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Croydon School Board:

I herewith submit my first annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

I have enjoyed the helpfulness and support of the School Board, the cooperation of the parents, the seriousness of purpose of the teachers and the steadfastness of purpose and friendliness of the pupils. In such an atmosphere education should continue to progress.

In spite of serious teacher shortages, the schools are enjoying another profitable year under the guidance of conscientious, competent teachers. Croydon is very fortunate in having two resident teachers. Everywhere the teachers are demanding and getting increased salaries. It would seem only fair to pay our present teachers the same compensation we would have to pay any replacements.

The new playground equipment at the Flat School has proved to be a very helpful and beneficial addition. When such fine cooperation can be found between the school and the community, the possibilities are unlimited.

Interested townspeople have mentioned the possibility of expanding the playground of the Village School by changing slightly the road that cuts the grounds and grading that whole area from the schoolhouse to the main road. Such a project would be a great asset to the school and is well worth being given careful consideration.

The costs of the schools are increasing along with everything else. However, there is before the legislature a State Aid bill which, if passed, would mean additional aid to the town of Croydon of considerably over \$1000. This would help materially in keeping the

amount having to be raised by taxation within a reasonable limit.

Realizing that the costs of all departments of the town are increasing and that the taxpayers are interested in keeping the tax rate as low as possible, every effort to curtail unnecessary expenses in the schools is being made. However, we should realize that the education of our children is an investment in the future and necessary expenses are justifiable.
