# Warrant

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Errol in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Errol on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next at 9 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the public library.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the fire department.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the police department.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town poor.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the cemetery.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$84.75 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10 cents per \$1000. of assessed valuation (1-100th of 1 per cent) for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- To see if the town will vote to install an oil burner in the Fire House and to raise money for the same.
- 11.. To see if the town will vote to have the library painted and raise money to pay for the same.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 to purchase fire fighting equipment such as hoes, pails, shovels, axes, etc. and build a box in which to store same. With the understanding that the State Forestry Department will furnish an equal amount.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the health department.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1116.50 for the services of a district resident physician who will reside in Errol, N. H., said physician to be hired only in case adjacent towns cooperate, and on agreement and choice of the physician by a joint committee composed of members from each cooperating town, said members to be appointed at this meeting.

### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damages and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90 per cent of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these man caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help, as follows:

- (1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.
- (2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In automobiles, always use the ash trays.
- (3) Report fires and smokes to the warden without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Errol, in the County of Coos, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District, on the 8th day of March, 1949, at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following articles:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing year.
- 5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 6. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 7. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 8. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing year.

- 9. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to exchange a small piece of land on the westerly side of the pond near the library and owned by the District for a larger piece of land now a part of the ball field on the easterly side of said pond and owned by Julia Bean. Dimensions of said pieces of land are on file with the School Board.
- 10. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 11. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

A record of perfect attendance was achieved by the following pupils: Norman Eames, Donna Travers, Julia Turner, Anita Turner, Sherry Turner, Beverly Travers, Betty Gray, Wendell Turner, Jack Turner, and Gloria Porter.

Mrs. Lila Nutbrown, who has had several years of successful teaching experience, was elected to teach grades seven and eight.

Mr. William E. Bigelow returned as headmaster and teacher in grades nine and ten. Mrs. Esther Bean and Mrs. Shirley Hawkins returned to teach in the primary and intermediate grades.

Our teachers attended summer school at Plymouth Teachers' College and a Workshop in Elementary Education held at Groveton. This in-service training program was sponsored by the State Department of Education under the supervision of Dr. Gertrude M. Lewis, Director of Elementary School Services. A complete study was made of the unit method of teaching and teachers worked cooperatively in the development of sample units of work. This intensive course gave us a real understanding of the purposes of social education and a professional zeal for greater participation in the preparation of our youth for democratic living.

The addition of Mrs. Nutbrown to our teaching staff made it possible to assign a teacher to the ninth and tenth grades which unquestionably has improved the quality and type of instruction for those intending further secondary education. Errol has willingly paid this high cost to insure the best possible education for all the children.

The school program was expanded this year to include the continuation of shop work for boys and sewing and cooking experience for the girls in grades seven through ten. One notable project completed by the girls in their sewing classes was the making of the uniforms for the girls' baseketball team.

A well organized program of extra curricular activities included regularly scheduled games for our boys' and girls' teams in basketball, providing wholesome recreation for a large percentage. This activity was enthusiastically supported by the students and the community.

A large electric refrigerator has been purchased to add to our cafeteria equipment. Our successful school

lunch program is continuing this year with its policy to serve nutritious, balanced meals for 20 cents per meal.

We were most fortunate to secure the services of Dr. R. I. Hinkley and Miss Florence Wheeler, R. N. to provide us with an outstanding health program, complete details of which may be found in the Report of the School Nurse.

I again take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the School Board for their help in the administration of school affairs, to the citizens of Errol for their efforts in behalf of education, and to the teachers for their loyal and conscientious service.

#### REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The sixty-three school children of Errol were given, this year, a complete and thorough physical examination by R. I. Hinkley, M. D., assisted by Florence M. Wheeler, R. N.

Clothing was removed so that all parts of body could be carefully checked. Parents and guardians were urged to be present, to observe and to answer any necessary questions. Many respoded to the request.

A urinalysis was made for each child who brought the required specimen. This request was met by nearly a 100% response.

Two days time was required for the Physical Check-up, with an extra day for the Vision Test, made by Miss Wheeler with the Massachusetts Vision Test Machine, which picks up many small vision defects, not always needing immediate attention, but once detected, can be watched, thus preventing them from ever getting to a serious stage.

Hearing tests have not as yet been given, but will be before the end of the year.
