HIGHWAY REPORT

The Sawyer's River Road and the Arethusa Falls Road, leading to the Post Office was plowed by the State Highway Department for the Town.

The T. R. A. money was turned over to the State Highway Department, the money being used on the repair and improvement of town roads.

SCHOOL REPORT

No schools are maintained by the Town of Hart's Location. The school tax is raised for the Town at the rate of \$3.50 per thousand of rateable estate. This amount goes into the State Equalization Fund of the State School Department, the Department taking care of the needed education for this town.
