## TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. s.)

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hopkinton in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Hopkinton on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- (1) Town Officers Salaries
- (2) Town Officers Expenses
- (3) Election and Registration
- (4) Expense and care of Town Hall
- (5) Police Department
- (6) Vital Statistics
- (7) Fire Department
- (8) Cemeteries
- (9) Town Poor
- (10) Old Age Assistance
- (11) Interest on Notes.

3. To choose a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges in addition to the one quarter of one per cent of the Town's valuation, which is required by law, estimated \$5400.00.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for general expense of the highway department and street lighting.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the employment of a District Nurse and other health expenses.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Hopkinton Free Public Libraries.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Old Home Day.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for Town construction and permanent improvement of roads.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Class V road assistance.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the painting of the Blackwater River Bridge.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a fence and improvements to the Park in Hopkinton Square.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for legal expenses.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Merrimack Valley Region Association.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Town dumps.

18. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to transfer the sum of \$400.00 now held in reserve for the purchase of a hook and ladder truck, to the fire department appropriation for the purchase of necessary equipment.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following cemetery Trust Funds, the income to be used as directed, subject to provisions adopted at the Town Meeting of March 10th, 1925.

(a) The sum of \$150.00 from Russell O. White for the care of the Russell O. White lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.

(b) The sum of \$100.00 from Florence D. Savory

for care of the Charles C. Davis lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.

(c) The sum of \$150.00 from the William A. Baker Estate for care of the William A. Baker lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.

(d) The sum of \$150.00 from Donald E. Symonds for care of the Donald E. Symonds lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.

(e) The sum of \$37.69 from the Estate of Ella L. Kimball for the care of the Ella L. Kimball lot in the Old Cemetery in Hopkinton Village.

(f) The sum of \$100.00 to be added to the Lewis B. Hardy fund for care of the Lewis B. Hardy, Elwin L. Hardy and Marion L. Hardy lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.

(g) The sum of \$300.00 from Mabel D. Coolidge for care of the Kempton-Danforth lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.

20. To see if the Town will vote to accept a plot of land from Mr. & Mrs. A. C. Huntoon, situated at the junction of Maple and Cedar Streets in Contoocook Village, for Park purposes, in memory of Captain Grovenor A. Curtice.

21. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the 1948 tax levy.

22. To act on reports of Town Officers, Library Trustees, and Committees for 1947.

23. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the

Selectmen to distribute inventory blanks not earlier than April 1st, 1948.

24. To hear and transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF THE TOWN PLANNING BOARD

---

  
THE TOWN MANAGER PLAN

At the 1947 Town Meeting the Planning Board was instructed to make a study of the town manager plan. Our studies up to this time reached their climax at a public meeting held under the sponsorship of the American Legion at which Mr. Stafford Hill of the N. H. Federation of Taxpayers Assn. was the principal speaker.

There are times when all of us feel that the Town's business could be handled more efficiently and we are inclined to condemn our officials. We forget that they are persons like ourselves whose livelihood depends on other fields of endeavor. Their remuneration from the Town is relatively so small that they must give their primary attention to their own businesses. The N. H. law regarding town managers is designed to give a town a full time executive who can relieve the Selectmen of the routine details which now take up most of their time. He is hired by the elected Selectmen and is subject to dismissal by them. The Town Meeting and the Selectmen establish the policies and the town manager has the duty of executing those policies. To the manager are assigned enough of the official positions, including that of highway agent, so that the combined salaries of the several positions may approximate his salary.

In some towns a manager can effect economies which more than offset his salary. In a town of the size of Hopkinton it is doubtful that the adoption of the manager plan would result in substantial budgetary savings but it is likely that the town would get more for its tax dollar. We could not afford to pay a large salary and

would probably have to select a young man fresh from one of the special training courses now being given on the subject in some of the universities; such a man would undoubtedly leave us for a larger community once he had proven himself.

The law in Maine permits several towns to employ the same manager and thereby gives them the opportunity to hire at a good salary a man of high caliber and proven ability. This is not permissible under the N. H. law but there is a feeling that it would not be difficult to get the legislature to make the change.

Several cities and towns in N. H. have recently adopted the manager plan. Our recommendation is that we all watch for success in these communities before we take any action on the subject.

Re:—STUDY OF SCHOOL SYSTEM

Considerable study has been given the problem of improving the present school system. The purpose of this study is to determine the efficiency of the present system, in relation to the educational tax dollar.

A complete report is not available at this time. Several lines of investigation are being followed with the idea that as much information as possible be submitted to the people concerning the present system, possible remedies or improvements.

Much interest has been shown in other communities in consolidation of schools in an attempt to raise the standard of public school education. Groups of towns have cooperated in this effort and have made exhaustive analysis of the possibilities of such a system.

Additional time is needed by your committee to assemble sufficient information to properly integrate and present a proper evaluation of this problem.

REPORT OF HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

---

At the 1947 Town Meeting, a motion was passed instructing the Town Planning Board to make a study of the Town Highway Department's operations, for the purpose of increasing its efficiency, savings in highway expenditures, and improving the conditions of the town roads.

The Planning Board appointed a separate committee to make this study and this is a preliminary report of that committee.

Due to the magnitude of the subject, the committee feels that more time and study should be devoted before specific recommendations are made and such conclusions as are stated here should be taken as preliminary to further investigation.

The Organization of the Town Highway Department is composed of two road agents elected by the people for a term of one year each. The town road net is divided into two areas with one agent in control of each area. The road agents are responsible to the selectmen and are sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties and give bonds to the satisfaction of the selectmen and may be removed from office by them. He buys materials, supplies, hires labor, rents equipment as he sees fit, and submits his various bills to the Board of Selectmen for payment.

Conclusion: It is believed that a more efficient Highway Department would be obtained by authorizing the Selectmen to appoint a single agent for the town.

The administration of the Highway Department is

carried on by the Selectmen and the agents except for special instructions voted at Town Meeting.

**Conclusion:** A determined effort should be made to prepare a program of expenditures each year and follow it carefully. The agent should keep his accounts in such shape as to allow the computing of the various unit costs of the work performed so that these unit costs can be used for future guidance.

**Equipment:** Each agent has his own assigned equipment, storage yard and building. However, no inventory of the actual equipment owned by the town for the use of the agents is available at this time. In general, each agent is equipped with a tractor, light graders, snow plow assemblies and various small tools, other equipment is rented as needed. Maintenance of the town's highway equipment is the responsibility of the road agents.

**Conclusion:** The agent should be responsible and accountable for all equipment turned over to him. He should keep an up to date inventory of all items, prepare and carry out a schedule of maintenance and see that all such equipment is properly housed.

**The Town Road System:** It is believed that there are numerous instances where sections of the system could be abandoned or subject to gates and bars. There are other sections that should be improved by reconstruction and it is the opinion of this committee that a careful study should be made along these lines.

Writing school reports for the town of Hopkinton is not a new experience for me, although it is my first

opportunity to write the Superintendent's report. As I took office on July 1, 1947, my report will deal with the schools from that period on.

There has been some talk that the teacher shortage is over but I do not believe this to be so. It is true that there are more teachers in some high school fields; in others the shortage is more acute than ever. The situation is not good in the elementary field. There will not be more than twenty-four elementary teachers graduate from the two Teachers Colleges this June. In January the Superintendents were polled and at that time, they reported that they would have at least ninety-five vacancies to fill. This number will increase considerably by June. I haven't the slightest idea from where these replacements will come. Last year we had to find an apartment in order to get a teacher. I don't know what we will have to do this coming year; perhaps promise a rich husband.

There is a committee working on a school building program which should report on town meeting day. I know that some people are interested in a consolidated school for the town of Hopkinton, while others are interested in a cooperative high school which would serve a number of towns. Each plan has merit and should be carefully studied to see which would be best for the town of Hopkinton. If the school population continues to increase, some sort of a building program will have to be undertaken in the near future. The last Legislature passed a bill allowing school districts to appropriate money to be set aside for a sinking fund, the amount not to exceed one-half of one per cent of the assessed valuation of the community. This will enable communities to spread the cost of a building program over a longer period of time.

It will be noted from the Headmaster's Report that

the enrollment of the High School is steadily increasing and during the past four years new courses have been added to the curriculum and the outside or co-curricular activities have also been increased. This has meant a heavy burden on the teachers. We have reached the point where an extra teacher would be invaluable in carrying out the program of the school.

I have enjoyed my work as Superintendent very much. There are many, many fine people on the various boards. Of course my continued association with the Hopkinton Board, teachers and people of the community has been extremely pleasant.

Figures in parentheses denote number of times classes meet per week. (Four years of English and United States History are required of all). We are using this flexible program to meet the needs and requirements of the students.

## EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Extra-curricular activities are a vital part of our modern school. In order to meet the needs of our pupils the following activities are being conducted at Hopkinton High School.

Activities this year include boys' and girls' athletics, glee club, dramatics, music, school paper, Future Farmers, and Future Home Makers. The school is also participating in a new program "The Junior Town Meeting of the Air" conducted over a nearby radio station, with the surrounding high schools. The values are great and the participating students are enjoying, and profiting by this program. Assembly programs are being sponsored by different groups within the school.

In regard to adult education, the School Board in cooperation with the Veterans' Administration is conducting a Veterans' Training Program in Agriculture with Mr. John L. Babson as teacher.

Faculty leaders of these activities are to be congratulated in the manner they are being conducted.

## SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

This year as in the past year, our school is conducting a noon lunch program. From December 1 until April 16, this program operates under the direction of Mrs. Evelyn Rice, Home Economics Teacher. Due credit must be given Mrs. Elsie Straw and Mrs. Mary Shurtleff for their able assistance in the preparation of these meals. This year we are serving an average of 168 pupils a meal at the High School (which includes the Grammar Schools). When adverse weather conditions exist, the food is transported to the Grade School. An average of 50 pupils are served at the Hopkinton Village School. This is an average of 218 meals served per day

or 1,090 meals per week, which will give one an idea of the work necessary to conduct such a project. This program is a Federal project sponsored through the State Board of Education at a nominal fee of fifteen cents per pupil per day. For every fifteen cents paid by the pupils, the government contributes nine cents toward the cost of the lunches. The local Red Cross and the School Board have given us financial assistance, which is greatly appreciated. We cannot possibly leave the subject of Hot Lunch without paying a great deal of respect to the Home Economics Classes and their teacher, who this fall canned more than 2,000 quarts of fruits and vegetables for this program, yet this is only a small number compared to what will be actually used. Many individuals donated vegetables, and many others assisted in the canning and preparation of these items; to them our thanks. We are deeply grateful for such help. During the summer of 1947 a few minor repairs were made at the High School. In the chemistry laboratory, gas has been installed to be used in conducting chemistry experiments. This was proven to be a great advantage. Also, a gas stove was installed in the Home Economics Room, which is of great assistance in carrying on the Hot Lunch Program. A small room formerly used as a teacher's room is being converted into a school library.

Hopkinton High School is endeavoring to meet the needs of the pupils within this community. As well as the studies listed, we have a visual aid program and other activities with which to accomplish our objectives. During the fall of 1947 a faculty member attended a week's course in Driver Education conducted at Keene Teachers College. It is hoped that in the near future

Driver Education will be a part of our Program of Studies.

Before closing this report I would like to express this thought: we, the faculty are very much interested in the children of this community. If at any time problems exist which concern the school, do not hesitate to come and visit your school, and to talk over these matters freely with the faculty. They will be pleased at any time to discuss such problems.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank the School Board, Superintendent of Schools, and the faculty for their cooperation since assuming the duties as headmaster of Hopkinton High School.

It is the cooperation, understanding, and thoughtfulness of you, the people of Hopkinton that aid us in maintaining the type of school which you desire.
