



TOWN MEETING WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lyman in the County of Grafton in said State qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Lyman Town Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday the 12th day of March 1929, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.

3. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Old Home Day.

4. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five dollars for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

6. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways, and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum for State Aid Maintenance on its state highways. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairing of highways and bridges.

9. To see what action the town will take towards fixing the compensation of the Tax Collector.

10. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.

11. To choose agents or committees to any article in the warrant.

12. To see if the town will vote to allow 2 per cent. discount on taxes paid before July 5th.

13. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.
