# REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

We herewith submit our annual report of the schools in this town for the current school year.

By referring to the statistical table it will be seen that 12 different teachers have been employed during the year; 10 in the Common Schools and 2 in the High School, all females. Of the whole number, 6 are residents of this town, and 6 non-residents. Five of the 12 have never taught before. The scholars in No. 2 have attended in No. 7, the same as for several years past.

The High School, Intermediate and Primary in No. 4 have been open to scholars from any part of the town, and several have taken advantage of the opportunity.

Considering the small number of scholars in several of the schools, we think the year's work has been as satisfactory as could be expected. While we do not think it advisable to review or criticise the work of each individual teacher, we can say they all have tried to make their schools a success, and have attended to their duties with commendable interest. Some have been highly successful; none have been failures. All the schools have made fair progress; some have excelled.

Those teachers who have been most successful have devoted themselves to their work with energy and enthusiasm, and have united systematic methods of instruction with gentle, but firm and absolute discipline, commanding first the respect of their pupils, then winning their good will and affection. A teacher should be able not only to teach science from the text books, but they should be able to inspire in their pupils a desire to obtain knowledge; should direct their wayward and selfish inclinations into quiet and unselfish desires to make the world better for having lived in it, and should

teach them to be useful and patriotic citizens. No teacher should undertake these responsible duties without feeling that they can control and direct the restive spirits under their care.

To have good schools requires not only good teachers, but the hearty co-operation of the parents with the teacher. Too frequently this is not given. Parents cannot take too deep an interest in the welfare of the schools: for in them to a great degree are laid the foundations of the mental, moral and physical character of their children.

### SCHOOL HOUSES.

There has been but little expended in repairs upon the school-houses during the year, and no extensive repairs are anticipated for the coming year unless it should be thought best to re-seat the school rooms in the primary department in No. 4, and in the school house in No. 6. The seats in No. 6 are very hard and unfit for small scholars. The primary department in No. 4 would be much improved by more modern style of seats. The seats now in use are cramped and inconvenient.

### FREE TEXT BOOK SUPPLIES.

We have pursued the same course in the purchase of these supplies that was pursued last year, buying them through the agency of W. H. Spalter, bookseller, of Keene, and paying him a commission on the wholesale price. By this method we save express charges, and procure in such quantities and at such times as they are needed, with but little if any greater cost than if purchased of wholesale houses in Boston.

# State of New Hampshire.

To the inhabitants of the town of Marlow qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Jones Hall in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1.—To choose three Selectmen, town Treasurer, Clerk and Auditors.

ART. 2.— To choose a Collector of taxes, and all other necessary town officers and agents for the year ensuing.

ART. 3.—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools; for paying the town debts and defraying the interest thereon, and for laying out and repairing highways and sidewalks, building and repairing bridges; and for other necessary charges arising in said town; to establish and maintain public libraries.

ART. 4.—To hear the reports of the Town Treasurer and Board of Selectmen to the Town Auditors; the reports of the Auditors, Agents, Committees, or other officers heretofore chosen or appointed, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

ART. 5.—To transact all other business which may come before said meeting.

ART. 6.—To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation the capital stock of any new business that may be started within the town of Marlow, for a term of years not to exceed ten years.
