REPORT OF

The Board of Education

The Board of Education organized in April, 1898, as follows :

President, Frank O. Lamson ; Treasurer, Henry F. Dodge, the newly elected member ; Secretary, Annie E. Perham. The school year ended Feb. 10, 1899. A larger sum than usual was appropriated, and we have been able to have three terms of ten weeks each, with teachers as follows :

Miss Clara H. Blood, Spring ; Miss Lillian J. Cooke, Centre, Fall and Winter ; Miss Amy V. Hutchinson, South ; Miss Mary Ellen Smith, West ; Miss Eva M. Bugbee, East, Fall and Winter, and Miss A. M. Buffum, Spring.

We are very glad to report a profitable year as a whole. During the year some new books have been added. In the Fall Milne's Elements of Arithmetic was introduced. We considered this book best adapted to our scholars. Oral and written exercises are given in connection with each subject, and frequent and thorough reviews serve to test the pupil's proficiency and to train and develop his power of reasoning. Redway's and Hinman's Natural Geography was selected because it demands work from the pupil rather than from the teacher, while it stimulates independent thought and excites the interest of both.

Then our own country, the United States, is always before the child's mind, as other countries, size, customs and industries are compared with the home country.

We believe the children should be taught to think for themselves. We all know that rapidity of thought is not sufficiently common among the pupils of any

school, and that to secure it, it is necessary to train the mind to rapidity of action. It is said, "We owe our prosperity and happiness largely to our school system," and we believe it to be very true.

It has been our aim during the past year to have those things brought before the child's mind which are in keeping with the demands of modern times, and will produce the best results for them. Lowell says: "Better a high mark unreached than self-satisfied mediocrity."

We wish to thank the parents and town's people for their liberal support. We are conscious "It is one thing to see that a line is crooked and another thing to be able to draw a straight line."

Mont Vernon Town Library.

The Trustees of the Mont Vernon Library make the following report:

At the annual town meeting, Henry F. Dodge was elected a member of the Board of Trustees. The board then organized as follows: H. F. Dodge, Chairman; F. C. Greenwood, Treasurer; G. W. Cox, Secretary.

From the town appropriation 70 new books were added in April; later one book was added by donation. This number, in connection with the 569 volumes previously reported, makes a total of 640 volumes, exclusive of a large number of magazines. By order of the town the Trustees subscribed for ten magazines. The library has been open Sundays and Wednesdays, as usual.
