State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston, in the County of Hillsborough, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are notified to meet at the town house in said New Boston on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, polls to close at six o'clock P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same, or act in relation thereto.
 - (a) For town officers' salaries.
 - (b) For town officers' expenses.
 - (c) For election and registration.
 - (d) For the expense of the town hall.
 - (e) For the police department.
 - (f) For the fire department.
 - (g) For the health department.
 - (h) For vital statistics.
 - (i) For summer maintenance of highways.
 - (j) For winter maintenance of highways.
 - (k) For street lighting.
 - (1) For general expense of highway department.
 - (m) For support of the library.
 - (n) For town poor.
 - (o) For old age assistance.
 - (p) For Memorial Day and care memorial.

- (q) For interest.
- (r) For the payment of long term notes.
- (s) For the town dump.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,066.50 for state aid construction of the Weare road the state to contribute the sum of \$2,132.00, or act in relation thereto.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for cooperation with the state in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust or act in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for capital reserve for rebuilding bridges, or act in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to build any bridge the ensuing year, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to buy any highway equipment, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to improve the water supply and toilet facilities at the town house, or act in relation thereto.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the Merrimack Valley Region Association, or act in relation thereto.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the road leading from the Wilton road to South Hill, from the Wilton road to a point near land of Walter Berry, or act in relation thereto.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell or administer property of the town acquired by tax deed or gift.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to deliver inventory blanks at the time the inventory is taken.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to petition the division of accountancy of the State Tax Commission to audit the town accounts, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School District of New Boston:

I hereby submit my annual report as superintendent of the schools of New Boston.

The current school year opened with three changes in the teaching staff. Miss Helen Burnham, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, replaced Mrs. Margaret Conway in Home Economics; Miss Elizabeth Hoyt was secured as instructor in English; Mrs. Marion Hayes, who had previously taught in Farmington, took the place of Mrs. Marion Pounder in grades 4-6, Mrs. Pounder asking for her relelase shortly before the opening of school in September.

Due to our inability to find a qualified teacher for English and French, it was necessary to handle the French through the Extension Division of the University of Nebraska. Although such an arrangement is not ideal, the materials of instruction provided is quite adequate and provides an opportunity for pupils to have instruction in fields in which the personnel is not available. Many of our smaller schools in the state are taking advantage of the services rendered by the University of Nebraska (whose program has the approval of the State Board of Education of our state). In addition to French, Latin, Spanish, Art, and Typewriting are being taken by pupils of your high school. The expense of these courses are met by the School District only for such courses as we normally include in our program of studies. The remaining courses are paid for by the pupils themselves.

Even though we have had to make certain adjustments in our program in order to meet the problems necessitated by the war period, I strongly feel that our schools in New Boston have carried on their work in a satisfactory manner. In these days of fewer and fewer well-trained teachers, we can be very thankful for experienced and successful teachers. Our schools have suffered but little throughout these last few years, in times when many towns were forced to curtail their instructional programs, even to the point of closing schools entirely.

The School Board's Budget, which is included as a part of the Town Report, indicates that our needs for schools will be considerably larger another year. This increase is mainly due to two factors—increases in teachers' salaries, and added costs of transportation. This condition is common in all school districts at this time. With a decreasing supply of teachers and an increased cost of living, together with higher wage scales in other lines of activity, towns must increase salaries in order to retain present teachers and to attract potential teachers for the years ahead. In districts maintaining high schools the problem is perhaps even more acute, for, even though there is little justification for it, the fact remains that secondary teachers are receiving more for their efforts than are elementary teachers. This condition will undoubtedly continue for several years, and as long as the smaller communities desire to retain and maintain a high school they must expect to pay added costs of maintenance. With the State of New Hampshire providing aid only for elementary schools, it means that the entire increase in costs for secondary schools must be carried by the towns themselves, while the elementary increases will be partly carried by State Aid—providing the General Court appropriates sufficient funds to meet the needs of the towns of the state.

May I express my appreciation to the teachers of the New Boston Schools, and to the School Board, for their earnest efforts on behalf of our schools.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The school nurse submits this report for the school year, September 1934, through December 1945.

About 130 pupils were examined by Dr. Fraser, our school physician, and the parents notified of any defects found.

The following report shows the number of pupils affected at the time of the regular fall examination:

Defective vision 17. Number of defects corrected 14.

Defective teeth 95. Number of defects corrected 60.

Diseased tonsils 10. Number of defects corrected 7.

Six children had chicken pox.

Thirty-four children had mumps.

There were two orthopedic cases under treatment.

One child had an appendectomy.

At the baby clinic, June 6, 1945, four school children and twenty-seven pre-school children were given the Patch test. All were found negative to tuberculosis. The toxoid treatment was also given to three school children at this time.

The audiometer test was given May 1, 1945. This test is given to determine how well a child can hear.

On December 5, 1945, thirty school children and thirtyone pre-school children were given the toxoid treatment for diphtheria. In view of the increasing number of cases of this disease in the country the State Department of Health and the State Board of Education are combining their efforts to prevent, as far as possible, any spread of diphtheria by an intensive program of diphtheria immunization by establishing clinics which will reach every community. Those children through the fourth grade who had had one treatment were advised to have the second one, and babies from the age of six months and over should all be protected by this procedure of immunization.

A second toxoid clinic will be given a little later on.

Thirty home visits were made during this school year.
