

## State of New Hampshire

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To the inhabitants of the Town of Randolph in the County [L. S.] of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the next year ensuing, including two auditors, one road agent, one selectman for three years, one library trustee, one trust fund trustee by ballot for three years.
2. To raise \$1,000.00 to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair town highways and bridges, that is \$300.00 for town highways, \$500.00 for snow removal, and make appropriation for the same.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to build Class V roads, highways and bridges, that is if State will pay part, Town to raise not over \$400.00.
5. To raise \$1,482.00 for street lighting and make appropriation for the same.
6. To raise \$150.00 for care of cemetery and resetting memorial tablets, and make appropriation for the same.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 for the support of the Town Library, and make appropriation for the same.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 for police patrol and to protect our property against theft for the ensuing year.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100.00 to assist town poor, and make appropriation for the same.
10. To see if the Town will vote to allow 3% discount on all taxes paid before June 1, 2% discount on all taxes paid before August 1, and 1% discount on all taxes paid before October 1.
11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue necessary temporary notes in anticipation of 1937 taxes.
12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use unexpended appropriations at their discretion.
13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen

to offer a reward not to exceed \$500.00 to be paid to any person or persons who may give evidence leading to the arrest and conviction of any person or persons unlawfully breaking and entering into unoccupied buildings in Randolph.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$150.00 for repairs and expenses of the Town Hall and make appropriation for the same.

15. To raise \$1,200.00 to pay State tax less State credits, and make appropriation for the same.

16. To raise \$2,219.91 to pay County tax, and make appropriation for the same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money not exceeding \$400.00 to advertise the scenic beauty and accessibility of the Presidential Highway, provided adjoining towns will cooperate in raising proportional amounts.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100.00 for discounts allowed on taxes.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money not exceeding \$500.00 toward paying \$1000.00 note due August 10th, 1937.

#### ARTICLE FOR TOWN WARRANT

Article 20. "TO SEE if the Town will approve the acquisition by the United States Government of approximately 9,913 acres of land situated in the Town, forming additional purchase unit of the White Mountain National Forest, and described as follows:

Starting at a point in the 1929 proclaimed Forest Boundary on the Randolph-Gorham town line at the height of land between Moose Brook drainage and Jericho Brook;

Thence southerly along the Randolph-Gorham town line to the southeast corner of Lot 1 Range 9 according to the lots as laid out in the Town of Randolph;

Thence westerly along the south lines of Lot 1 Range 9 and Lot 2 Range 9 to the northeast corner of Lot 3 Range 8;

Thence southerly along the east line of Lot 3 Range 8 to the northwest corner of Lot 2 Range 7;

Thence easterly along the north lines of Lot 2 Range 7 and Lot 1 Range 7 to the northeast corner of Lot 1 Range 7 which is also a point in the Randolph-Gorham town line;

Thence southerly along the Randolph-Gorham town line to the southeast corner of Lot 1 Range 7;

Thence westerly along the south lines of Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 all in Range 7 to the northeast corner of Lot 7 Range 6;

Thence southerly along the east lines of Lot 7 Range 6 and Lot 7 Range 5 to the southeast corner of Lot 7 Range 5;

Thence westerly along the south lines of Lot 7 Range 5, Lot 8 Range 5 and Lot 9 Range 5 to the northeast corner of Lot 10 Range 4;

Thence southerly along the east line of Lot 10 Range 4 to a point on said line one-half the distance between the northeast and southeast corners of said Lot;

Thence westerly on the same bearing as the north line of Lot 10 Range 4 to the west line of said Lot, one-half the distance between the northwest and southwest corners;

Thence southerly along the west line of Lot 10 Range 4 to the southeast corner of Lot 11 Range 4;

Thence westerly along the south lines of Lot 11 Range 4 and Lot 12 Range 4 to the northeast corner of Lot 13 Range 3;

Thence southerly along the east line of Lot 13 Range 3 to a point 400 feet from U. S. Highway No. 2;

Thence south-westerly parallel to and 400 feet from U. S. Highway No. 2 to a point in the south line of Lot 13 Range 3, 400 feet from U. S. Highway No. 2;

Thence westerly along the south lines of Lots 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19, all in Range 3, to a point 400 feet from U. S. Highway No. 2;

Thence northerly parallel to and 400 feet from U. S. Highway No. 2 to a point in the west line of Lot 19 Range 3 which is also a point on the Randolph-Jefferson town line;

Thence northerly along the Randolph-Jefferson and Randolph-Kilkenny town lines to a point in the proclaimed Forest Boundary which is also a point in the height of land between Stag Hollow Brook drainage and the Upper Ammonoosuc River drainage;

Thence following southerly, easterly and northerly the proclaimed Forest Boundary to the point of beginning;

Containing 9,913 acres, more or less."

21. To transact any other business that may legally come
