To the inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the County [L. S.] of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To hear the reports of Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriation of the same.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$62.10 for Town Road Aid construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the relief of town poor.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire prevention, including fire trails.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for a permanent Honor Roll.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 to be used by the committee in improving the town forest.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$80.00 for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$250.00 for further dredging of Clement Brook.

- 15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.
- 17. To see if the town wishes the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 8. To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the District, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
