## *Town Warrant*

---

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stark in the  
County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote  
in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, March 11, 1947, to act upon the subjects here-  
in after mentioned. The polls will be open at said place and date from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 3:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the recep-  
tion of your ballots upon the election of town offi-  
cers under the Non-Partisan Ballot System: fur-  
thermore, you are hereby warned that on said date and place, at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon, the mat-  
ter of appropriations and such other business prop-  
erly coming before said meeting will be taken up for your consideration and action.

1. To choose by ballot the following town of-  
ficers: one town clerk for one year, one selectman for two years, one selectman for three years and the following for one year: a town treasurer, a tax collector, one auditor, two road agents, two con-  
stables, two sextons and one trustee for the ceme-  
tery trust funds.

2. To see if the town will instruct its select-  
men to appoint all other town officers required by law.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Highways to be expended by the Road Agents.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Snow Removal.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Maintenance.

7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and appropriate \$301.36 and set aside for this purpose. The State will contribute \$1207.43.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Current Expenses.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Relief.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to meet Interest charges for the ensuing year.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Public Library Purposes.

13. To see if the Town will vote for a scale of discounts for payments of taxes on the basis of Three per cent if paid by Aug. 31, Two per cent if paid by Sept. 30.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year and pay such debts from tax money when received.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of the Cemeteries.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$48.85 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10 per cent per \$1000 of the assessed valuation for the purpose of issuing and distri-

buting printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.

17. To see what action the Town will take in regards to the Covered Bridge in Stark Village and raise money for same.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine blister control recommended by the Forestry Recreation Commission.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

I hereby respectfully submit my first report on the School of Stark.

### *I. Statistics:*

C. Perfect Attendance: The following named pupils are to be congratulated for perfect attendance during the school year 1945-1946: Beverly Miles and Homer Frizzell. It shows an earnestness of purpose of a caliber to be commended.

*II. Teachers:* The school year started with Mrs. Maude Sanderson teaching at Crystal and Mrs. Urania House and Mrs. Winifred Hart teaching at the Village school. Mrs. Elizabeth Stone was secured to fill the vacancy made by the resignation of Mrs. Hart.

The teacher supply in the United States has reached crisis proportions and we must all keep in mind the difficulty of filling vacancies as they occur. The teachers who have returned to aid in this emergency are to be commended for their patriotism, for it is with them during these trying times that a great measure of the future success of our country lies.

*III. School Program:* The Superintendent and teachers have carried on a continuous program of revision of the reading, program purchase of modern textbooks, and where possible, unifying the teaching program in the district.

## ANNUAL REPORT

It is possible that by the beginning of next year we will have a program in reading, arithmetic, spelling, history, health, writing and science that will closely correspond as far as books and materials are concerned with those schools to which the pupils go after leaving Stark.

A testing program is to be inaugurated this term which will give us a fair picture of the pupil's strengths and weaknesses, thus enabling the teachers to better aid in the correction of these deficiencies.

Reference books, such as encyclopedias, have been purchased. The Superintendent secured from the State Library a set of encyclopedias for the Crystal School. Many supplementary books, both text materials and books for reading pleasure, are provided by the State Bookmobile.

### *IV. General:*

A. Repair: The Village school rooms were painted this year and a new stove was purchased and installed in the primary room. Considerable repair is needed at the Crystal School. Though some have been made, the extent was so large that sufficient funds were not available to take care of this need.

B. The School should be the social center of the community, and in carrying out this precept the teachers in the Village and in Crystal have organized and aided in the presentation of parties, socials and other community activities. They are to be commended for their work in this field.

C. Health: Every pupil in the Stark School District was given a physical examination by Miss Florence Wheeler, R. N., school nurse. The following is pertinent information presented by the school nurse:

Thirty-four school children received diphtheria immunization in two clinics. Audiometer hearing tests were given to all pupils except those in Grade 1.

*V. Recommendations and Conclusions:* The Superintendent believes that in order to carry out the minimum requirements of the school program, our teachers must be given financial reward commensurable with their contribution to the community. In view of the national and state trend, it will be impossible to staff our schools unless we follow this.

It would be desirable next year for this district to avail itself of the Federal aid for a program of hot lunches during the winter months. Funds are available and will be used.

It is evident that a major repair program is needed to maintain the Crystal School in a condition desirable to house our young boys and girls. It is therefore suggested that the community either carry this program of major repair or find other facilities for educating the youth of the Crystal area.

## ANNUAL REPORT

The Superintendent suggests that in the next year we provide sufficient funds so that modern textbooks and teaching materials can be made available to our future citizens.

In conclusion, the Superintendent has found the discipline and morale of the pupils for the most part excellent. In the past, Stark's pupils have done reasonably well in the schools attended after leaving our district. It is hoped and desired that this will always be the case.

I wish to commend the teachers for their diligence and cooperation and to express my appreciation to the School Board for its help in providing schools for all the children of all the people. It is only through the combined efforts of pupils, teachers, citizens and the School Board that each individual child's needs may be realized.
