THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at 10 a.m. in the forenoon to act upon the following articles.

Article 1. To bring in your votes for a town clerk, one selectman for three years and one selectman for two years, and all other town officials elected by ballot, candidates for President and Vice President of United States, delegates to National Convention, delegates to Constitutional Convention, and Sweepstakes Referendum.

It is the desire of the selectmen to adjourn when the polls close until Wednesday, March 11th, at 7:30 p.m. to the school auditorium to act upon the following subjects.

- Article 2. To see what action the town wishes to take upon the figures submitted and recommended by the budget committee.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town expenditures for the ensuing year:
 - a. Town officers salaries.
 - b. Town officers expenses.
 - c. Election and registration.
 - d. Town Hall and other buildings.
 - e. Parks and playgrounds.
 - f. Legal fees and vital statistics.
 - g. Insurance.

- h. Employees retirement and social security.
- i. Interest on temporary loans.
- j. Memorial Day.
- k. Town dump.
- 1. Street lighting.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for snow removal, salting and sanding.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway oiling, and general maintenance.
- Article 6. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$337.11 to which the State will contribute \$2,247.43 if voted and accepted, for the construction and maintenance of Class 5 roads.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, a portion of the highway, starting at a point south of the Eino Laine residence to the point where it connects the Old Richmond Road, or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to accept the conveyance from Troy Mills, Inc. of a certain tract of land located east of South Main Street for a public highway. Said highway starts at a point on South Main Street near the end of the present South Main Street water main, is 40 feet wide and goes easterly, then southerly, then westerly, back to South Main Street a total distance of 1200 feet to a point 550 feet south of the beginning point.

The town will assume responsibility for maintenance of only those parts of this highway which have been constructed and graveled to the specifications of the selectmen.

- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of the fire department.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the police department.

- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the maintenance and operation of the water department.
- Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for payment of water bonds and interest on same.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to accept a portion of 6 inch water main, 500 feet in length, starting at the fire hydrant opposite the Marrotte property on South Main Street and heading south 500 feet to a new fire hydrant located on South Main Street.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for replacement of water pipes located on Prospect Street, Morse Street and Brickyard Road.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$392.28 (six cents per \$1,000.00 of the town's equalized valuation) to the Monadnock Region Association.
- Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the employment of a district nurse.
- Article 17. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,079.00 as its share of the operating cost of Elliot Community Hospital.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the continuation of the War Memorial Program.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of the Gay-Kimball Library.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.
- Article 21. To see if the selectmen will be authorized to enter into a lease for a term of twenty-five years with Troy

Mills, Inc. covering the Sand Dam Lot for use of said Lot for municipal and public purposes.

- Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used for Public Welfare.
- Article 23. To see if the town will vote to amend the all night parking law now in effect to read: "that all night parking on the streets and by-ways will be prohibited from November 15th through April 15th.
- Article 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.
- Article 25. To see if the town will vote to elect a fire chief and two deputy chiefs annually, said men to have at least five years service with the Troy Fire Department. If so voted, these fire officials will replace the present board of firewards effective with the town meeting of 1965.
- Article 26. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following ordinance: Town Dump: It shall be unlawful to place or have placed in the town dump bulky, unburnable materials, such as, auto bodies, stoves, refrigerators and similar products. Tree trimmers or tree surgeons shall first obtain permission from the dump custodian before dumping quantities of brush, etc. It shall also be unlawful to dump any animal or human excrement on the premises. The custodian shall have the power of enforcing any of the above provisions. Anyone found in violation of these provisions shall be fined a sum not to exceed \$25.00 for each violation.
- Article 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for painting of the Town Hall.
- Article 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for a new snow plow.
- Article 29. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 for the purchase of 16 monitor radios which will be installed in the homes of the members of the Troy Fire Department. The purpose of said radios will be explained at the Town Meeting.

Article 30. To hear the reports of agents, officers or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

Also, badly needed was equipment which can account for some of this balance that is running in the

red. Therefore, we would appreciate your cooperation in observing the figures over and above in the black, as well as the over expenditures of the budget in the red. We sincerely hope that this year will be another slack year, as was 1962, so as to balance off our own budget. Thank you.

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Report of the Forest Fire Warden and Your District Chief

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and relinquishing of personel rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public co-operation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience—a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires. The following practices and suggestions will help:

- 1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- 2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump it's safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
- 3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
- 4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Lets all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.
