THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Wentworth Location in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Schoolhouse in said Wentworth Location on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the water system.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Poor.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$17.48 to the White Mountain Region Association, being 10 cents per \$1,000.00 of the assessed valuation of the Town last year.
11. To see if the Town will vote to sell the Potter Littlehale place, owned by the Town, and if the vote be favorable, to appoint or elect a committee to have authority to transact the deal.
12. To see if the Town will vote to wire the Schoolhouse, and put in electric lights, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
13. To see what the Town will vote to do in regard to a Town Dump, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
14. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment and interest on Light Line Note.
15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
