# STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, Auditor, and all other necessary Town Officers.
- 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for-

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club, for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid construction of Class V roads, commonly known as town road, raise and appropriate for the purpose, the sum of \$490.74, and receive from the state \$1,960.96.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for advertising, the same to be expended through the Board of Trade.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$205 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%), for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$8,000 to aid in maintenance of the Morrison Hospital.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the amount of \$400 to continue the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, thereby receiving the usual State Aid.
- 10. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate not to exceed \$1,500 for new sidewalk construction, which amount includes estimated cost of new sidewalk on High Street in front of Allard and McKean Blocks and removal of trees.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise not to exceed \$500 for maintenance of Whitefield Municipal Airport.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Account, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of the lands and buildings within the town, to equalize valuations in accordance with the law, and to appropriate money for this purpose.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to take care of the land in front of the Old Cemetery on High Street.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to erect two street markers on North Street. (Petition)
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to have the Board of Selectmen arrange for the renumbering of the residences and business buildings in the village of Whitefield and that the owners be required to obtain their designated number or numbers and place the same on their property where they can be plainly seen from the street. (Petition)
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to permit horse racing under pari mutuel system to be held in said town from July 1, 1949 to Labor Day, 1949, inclusive. (Petition)
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate not to exceed \$500 for the maintenance and upkeep of the skating rink on Johns River. (Petition)
- 20. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

#### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and in New England, fire damage and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With the continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90% of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these man-caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help, as follows:

- (1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.
- (2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In automobiles, always use the ash trays.
- (3) Report fires and smoke to the warden without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.


