

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges except snow work.
- 4. To see how much money the town will raise for plowing and sanding roads in winter.
- 5. To see if town will accept Town Road Assistance and raise money for same.
- 6. To see if town will raise \$400.00 for Blister Rust control.
- 7. To see if town will raise \$51.00 for the Lakes Region Association for advertising the advantages and attractions of Alexandria.
- 8. To see what action the town will take relative to buying new equipment for snow removal and make any desired appropriation for the same.
- 9. To see if town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
