

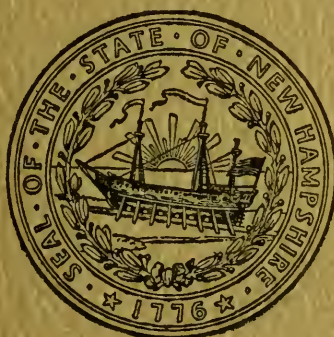

# TOWN WARRANT

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To the inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March next, at Ten o'clock in the forenoon and until six o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects.

ARTICLE 1. To choose necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

ART. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of money called for in the budget as prepared by the Selectmen.

ART. 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow necessary sums in anticipation of taxes.

ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.

ART. 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorized the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

ART. 6. (A petition). To see if the Town will vote to plow the yards of the residents the next winter season of 1946-47.

ART. 7. (Request). To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars for the "Francis P. Murphy Post No. 5386, Veterans of Foreign Wars," to be used for the purpose of buying or building a future home.

ART. 8. (Request). To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars to be used by the Francis P. Murphy Post No. 5386, V.F.W., for Memorial Day services.

ART 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Dollars for ditching and sanitary work on several water courses and brooks within the Town.

ART. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Dollars to be used for the purchase of snow removal equipment.

ART. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, to be used for moving and painting parts of the Upper Bartlett Cemetery fences.

ART. 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to have charge of snow removal work, by authority as given under Section 5, Chapter 188, of the 1945 Revised Laws.

ART. 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

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## HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

---

Forest fires are, for the most part, unnecessary and avoidable for ninety-eight percent of such fires, are, annually, the result of human carelessness — yours and mine. This can and should be remedied — Now! The rules of the game are simple.

1. *Always* be careful with fire in or near woodlands.
2. Comply with regulations governing the use or starting of fires.

Remember —

- a. You need written permission from your local forest fire warden for debris burning when the ground is not covered with snow.
  - b. Be sure your match, cigar, cigarette and pipe ashes are OUT before dropping them.
3. Be fire-minded NOW as never before; be careful; caution others to be careful; be co-operative and thus help your warden, your town and yourself!

## TO ALL OWNERS OF DOGS

-----

The Selectmen hereby respectfully request all owners and keepers of dogs in this Town to read these sections of the law carefully.

### Chapter 150 of the Public Laws:

- 6 Every owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually on or before April thirtieth, cause it to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year from the first day of the ensuing May, in the office of the clerk of the city or town wherein said dog is kept, and shall cause it to wear around its neck a collar distinctly marked with its owner's name and bearing attached to said collar a metal tag distinctly marked with its registered number. Said tag shall be furnished by the clerk at the expense of the city or town from the amount received from dog license fees.

### 15 FORFEIT

Whoever keeps a dog contrary to the provisions of this chapter shall forfeit fifteen dollars to the city or town in which the dog is kept.

### 40 HOW RECOVERABLE

All fines and penalties provided in the preceding sections relating to dogs may be recovered on complaint before a municipal court or justice in the town or county where the offense is committed.

## Report of Superintendent

---

*To the School Board and Citizens of Bartlett:*

This report is made at the end of one month as your superintendent. You are fortunate to have a full staff of teachers during these days when so many schools have been closed and grades combined because no teacher could be found for the position. There are a few more high school teachers available and this field will probably continue to improve with more and more service men returning. However, the elementary teachers are fewer than at any previous time and there is little, if any, relief in sight. The young men and women who graduate from the high schools throughout the state and would become good teachers need to be urged to consider this profession.

Two graduates of Gorham Normal School were secured as replacements for the grade school. Miss Kathleen Gray is teaching Grades 3-4 and Miss Flora Giles Grades 5-6.

These post-war days require better teaching of the fundamentals. The best teaching materials should be made available to effective teachers in order that the pupils get the kind of education they need. However, it is important that the child really want to learn if he is to meet with success in school.

Schools are assuming more social responsibility today than ever before. The Teen-Age Club is one of the attempts to cope with the growing problem. There is a need for directed leisure time activity for the teen-age boys and girls which offers a challenge to the best leadership in the community. The school should be a cooperating institution in helping the youth solve its recreational problem.
