

District Warrant

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE-ROCKINGHAM, SS.

To the Inhabitants of Little Boar's Head District, a village district in the Town of North Hampton, organized under provision of Chapter 196, Session Laws of 1905, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to attend the annual meeting of said District to be held at the residence of Marion Stott, on Ocean Boulevard and Willow Avenue in said District, on the first Tuesday of September next, the seventh (7th) day of the month, at eight o'clock in the evening (8:00 P. M.) for the following purposes:

- 1. To elect a moderator, a clerk, three commissioners, a treasurer, and an auditor for the ensuing year.
- 2. To hear the reports of the clerk, treasurer, and other officers of said District, and to take such action as may be desired in regard to same.
- 3. To take such action as the District may desire in regard to allowing the same discount on district taxes paid on or before a given date, for the ensuing year, as shall be allowed by the Town of North Hampton on town taxes.
- 4. To see if the District will vote to add, to the purposes for which it was established, such of the following purposes as may not have been heretofore formally added to its purposes: (a) the construction, maintenance, and care of parks or commons; (b) the maintenance of activities for recreational promotion.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be needed for the extinguishment of fires, the lighting of streets, the planting and caring for shade and ornamental trees, the supply of water for domestic and fire purposes, the construction and maintenance of sidewalks and main drains or common sewers, the construction, maintenance

and care of parks or commons, the maintenance of activities for recreational promotion, the appointing and employing of watchmen and police officers, the enacting and enforcing of zoning regulations, and all other district expenses.

- 6. To take such action as you may desire in regard to giving the Treasurer of the District authority to borrow money in anticipation of taxes collectable during the ensuing year.
- 7. To transact such other business as may legally come before said meeting.

Commissioners' Report

1942-1943

Activities of our Village District in the past year were curtailed to a bare minimum because of the war and the attendant scarcity of labor. Mosquito prevention and life guard service were temporarily suspended. The increased annoyance from mosquitoes has been noticeable.

Matters undertaken during the past year have been as follows:

- I. Hydrant service for fire protection: Maintained as in the past.
- II. Sidewalks: Maintained as in the past. Owing to the shortage of labor, the grass along the walks has not been kept trimmed as effectively as in other years. The large expense of replacing the plank walk at Bass Beach this spring was largely due to war labor conditions.
- III. Rock Garden at Fish Houses: Maintained as heretofore by Mr. Miller. This has been an outstanding attraction.
- IV. Winter Watchman Service: Maintained for four months to supplement the military coast patrol.
- V. District Maps: We have had 100 copies made of the recent survey of our village district by Edward M. Smith, showing property lines. A copy may be had free of charge by any taxpayer or property owner. Additional copies are available at 25 cents apiece.
- VI. Zoning Appointments: Following the annual district meeting last September, your Commissioners appointed Edward R. Hale as Zoning Inspector for one year, and re-appointed Arthur L. Hobson as a member of the Zoning Board of Adjustment for a term of five years.
- VII. Taxes: Our District tax rate was kept at \$2.60 per thousand dollars' valuation. The total levy was

\$2,371.30, less discount allowed of \$103.77, to make a net levy of \$2,267.53, as against actual expenditures of \$2,005.46.
