Solicitor's Report.

Wolfeboro, N. H. January 1, 1906.

TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS :

I hereby submit the report of the County Solicitor for the year 1905.

At the June term of the Superior Court, the Grand Jury returned twelve indictments, seven for the sale of spiritous liquor and cider, one for breaking and entering and four for assault. Only one of the accused stood trial, which resulted in a conviction. At the December term of said Court, the Grand Jury returned six indictments, two for larceny, one for maliciously taking a horse, two for keeping cider for sale and selling it and one for maliciously setting fire on land of another. The accused in the last case stood trial, which resulted in a disagreement of the jury, and the matter was subsequently disposed of by the respondent pleading "Nolo" and being sentenced to a term of two months in jail. All the rest of the indictments were disposed of without trial.

There have been thirty or more investigations and prosecutions for the sale of "spiritous liquor" under Chapter 117 of the Laws of 1905. These prosecutions have to be made at great expense to the county, the act providing for the payment of extra fees to the solicitor and officers. In many cases persons were reported as engaged in the traffic who were wholly innocent and in the opinion of the solicitor were never engaged in the sale of liquor; many others entered a plea of guilty and were sentenced to pay a fine and costs, one was sent to jail for thirty days, and suspended jail sentences are held over the rest. Sentences are suspended for various reasons which to the Court and the solicitor seemed just. These suspensions are made in part that some hold may be retained on the respondent in case of further unlawful acts. If no one has been required to serve a sentence in such cases it is for the reason that no one has asked that it be or furnished any evidence that the respondent has violated any law.

The sheriffs and all officers of the law have in the past year been noted for the conscientious and faithful discharge of their duties without fear or favor.

The outlook for the coming year is most satisfactory, and the solicitor does not look for any increase in crime or in expense to the county in consequence of the same.
