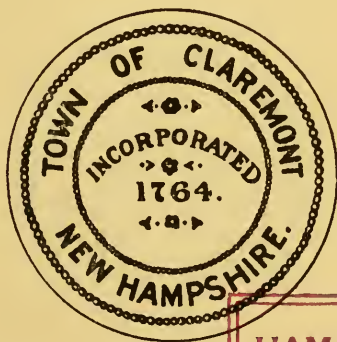

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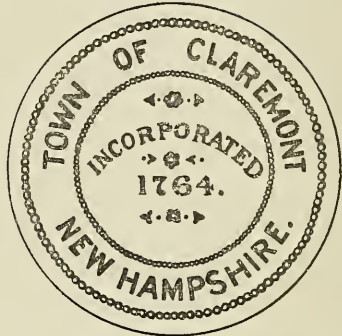
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# Town Warrant

To the inhabitants of the Town of Claremont, in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.



You are hereby notified to meet at the lower assembly room and the room above said assembly room, both in the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday the eighth day of March next, at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To elect one Selectman who shall serve for three years.
3. To elect one Assessor who shall serve for three years.
4. To choose one member of the board of three trustees who shall have the custody of all trust funds of the Town, to serve for three years.
5. To elect one Sewer Commissioner who shall serve for three years.
6. To elect one Water Commissioner who shall serve for three years.
7. To elect ten Delegates to serve at the Constitutional Convention.
8. To choose three members of the Board of Trustees of Fiske Free Library to serve for three years.
9. To see if the Town will choose or appoint a committee of citizens to act as a Committee of Finance for the ensuing year, whose duty it shall be to investigate all proposed appropriations, previous to any Town Meeting held during the ensuing year and to report their recommendations to the Town Meeting which is to act upon the proposed appropriations.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,257.50 to pay Town Officers for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500 for Incidental Expenses for the Town for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for the salary and expenses of the Health Department.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,500 for the salary and expenses of the Police Department for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.



14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,150 for the repair of Highways and Bridges for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,295.76 for the purpose of applying for Class V Road Assistance.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$867.80 to replace a truck of the Highway Department.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 for Oiling and Cleaning streets and highways of the Town for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the purpose of building new sidewalks and repairing those now in use.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to purchase a Cold Patch Mixer.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$18,500 for the support of the Fire Department for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for the purpose of repairing the roof, doors and windows at the Fire Station.

22. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$475 to purchase a portable generator and floodlight equipment.

23. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to increase the salary of the Chief of the Fire Department.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$541.62 for the purpose of Liability Insurance on the fire trucks.

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,350 for the use of Hydrants for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.

26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 in aid of the Claremont General Hospital.

27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,500 for Street Lighting for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$65,000 to pay the Debts of the Town, including bonds of the School District maturing during the fiscal year, and interest on the same.

29. To see if the Town will vote to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the present municipal year, said debt to be paid within one year after the date of incurrence out of the taxes of said year.

30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,500 for the support of Fiske Free Library agreeably to the contract with Andrew Carnegie and Samuel P. Fiske.

31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to make burials, help take care of, and beautify the cemeteries of the Town.

32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300 for the maintenance and development of Moody Park.

33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for the maintenance and development of Monadnock and Barnes Parks and Playgrounds.

34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for snow removal for the year ending January 31, 1939.

35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to help carry on the work of the Red Cross Public Health Nurse.

36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$475 for Milk Inspection.

37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300 for the collection of Garbage and Refuse.

38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$971.60 for the care of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.

39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800 for Band Concerts by the American Band for the ensuing year.

40. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for Memorial Day.

41. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 for the support of the Town Poor and carrying out the work of the WPA Projects for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1939.

42. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 for Old Age Assistance according to State Law.

43. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500 for the general operating expenses of the Town Buildings.

44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for purchasing Compensation Insurance to protect all Town Employees for the ensuing year.

45. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the salary of the Building Inspector.

46. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to aid the Dartmouth Swimming Club in conducting and maintaining the Public Swimming Pool at the George H. Boynton Memorial Dam.

47. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.

48. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for trimming and spraying trees.

49. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for the purpose of constructing a foot bridge at Beauregard Village.

50. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for the purpose of a revaluation of real estate and printing report of same.



51. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will authorize the construction of a cement sidewalk from Chapel street to the Post Office lot, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 therefor.

52. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the Toll House, so called, located at the easterly end of the Connecticut river bridge.

53. (Inserted by request.) To see what action the Town will take in granting permits for the use of private incinerators. Said permits to be issued by the Fire Warden or Chief of the Fire Department.

54. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for the purpose of running a surface drain down Wolcott street.

55. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fourteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,400.00) for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region. Said appropriation to be disbursed by the Selectmen.

56. (Inserted by request.) To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct the Selectmen to negotiate with the Federal Government for its participation in the development of the Claremont Airport as a Relief Project, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500, \$2,500 thereof to be used for the purchase of land, and \$5,000 thereof to be used in the performance of such things as are required to be done by the Town.

57. (Inserted by request.) To see what action the Town will take in regard to the construction of a bridge across Sugar River at Beauregard Village.

58. To determine the rate of Discount the Town will allow persons paying their taxes within such periods as the Town may designate.

59. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The rainfall in 1937 was the largest in the past 23 years, and the smallest was 28.53 inches in 1930; however a large precipitation does not always mean plenty of water during the summer months; our records show that if we have a large precipitation the first four months of the year, it is well to be prepared for a large consumption during the hot dry summer months.

I fear we shall have to seek another supply as so many towns and cities in New England have done in the past ten years. In most instances pure water in abundance has been found in driven or drilled deep wells. The dug wells on Kelsey Island are not worth considering as a water supply; there is an abundance of water, but the iron content is so high, that a plant to treat this water and make it potable is really prohibitive.

In 1935 we completed the Rice Reservoir, giving us 40,000,000 gallons more storage; June 1st, 1936 the Reservoir was full, Sept. 1st it was empty and our other storage was down to 52,000,000 gallons. Our low point in storage in 1936 was 24,000,000 gallons. If the Rice Reservoir had not been built in 1935, we would have had no water in our Mains for three weeks or would have been using water from the Kelsey wells. In 1937 the rains came more to our advantage; our lowest point reached 53,000,000 gallons: we also used 16,500,000 gallons more of water this year than in 1936: at this increased rate of consumption what are we going to do for more water?

## REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF FISKE FREE LIBRARY

To the Trustees of Fiske Free Library:

The "recession" seems to have struck libraries as well as business, so that we as well as libraries in general have to report a decrease in circulation. The number of books circulated this year was 77,852 which is the smallest number since 1929. The loss in circulation was more noticeable during the first part of the year when better times and more employment left less leisure time for reading. When the shops went on short time there was a noticeable increase in the number of readers, especially in the reading room.

It is rather hard to find the exact cause for the decrease but at least there are two points upon which most librarians agree, less leisure and a depleted stock of books owing to inadequate book funds over a period of several years. 1035 books have been added of which 239 were given. Many of these books were replacements so the actual number of new books was not as many as usual.

Many books which we were unable to supply have been borrowed from the State Library and we have borrowed two lots of books from the Public Library Commission.

There is no decrease in the use of the Reference room, rather there have been more requests for material than formerly.

The usual activities have gone on and we have helped as best we could schools, clubs, and all others who have made special requests. Books have been sent to the County Home, Schools, Frances J. Tolles Home, C. C. C. Camps, Rural Women's Reading Club, Congregational Reading Club and the Newberry Library.

Two library conferences have been attended. The N. H. L. A. at New London and a district meeting at Charlestown. Miss Mildred Converse attended the two week Summer School session at Manchester.

Worthwhile books are brought to the attention of the public through the medium of table exhibits. Last year we had at various times throughout the year special tables for Boy Scout reading, books of Travel, books for gardeners, books for Lenten reading and novels of distinction. The Caroline Stoughton Bookshop loaned some of their books to supplement our own for "Good Book Week." Another well patronized and extremely interesting exhibit was the collection of photographs displayed by the Claremont Camera Club. The Campfire Girls had an exhibit of the dolls they dress every year for Christmas giving.

## CHIEF ENGINEER'S REPORT

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To the Board of Selectmen:

Three hundred and thirteen still calls and 16 bell alarms were received at the Central Fire Station for the twelve months ending January 31, 1938 for a total of 329 alarms to which the fire department responded during the year. This was not far below last year's record total of 351, and well up to the average of any previous year. Still calls once more were instrumental in checking at an early stage blazes which otherwise might have necessitated bell alarms and caused more serious losses.

### HYDRANTS

No new hydrants have been added during the last twelve months to the town system, which so far has proved itself adequate to provide any emergency service which has arisen.

### FIRE ALARM SYSTEM

No new fire alarm boxes have been installed during the past year. The fire alarm system, due to improvements made in recent years, is now at a high level of efficiency and is being maintained at that level. The new compressed air whistle, recommended by Chief Sears last year to replace the steam whistle at the Claremont Paper company plant, has been installed at the Central Fire Station and is considered a marked improvement over the previous arrangement.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

I would recommend this year that an appropriation be voted sufficient to cover cost of reroofing of the Central Fire Station, or repairs to the cornices, and of minor miscellaneous repairs to doors and other parts of the building, of which it has been found to be sadly in need.

I would recommend also the purchase of a portable forest fire pump for the use of the department, which I believe would prove invaluable in combating farm fires and in many cases blazes in more thickly settled residential sections as well, in addition to its employment against brush and forest conflagrations.

I take this occasion to voice my appreciation of the splendid cooperation accorded me by members of the department during my period of service as its head, and to bespeak for my successor the same loyalty and devotion to duty which has always characterized the work of the fine group of men who safeguard the interests of the community. I appreciate also the cooperation of residents generally in making easier the work of the department in many ways, and of the telephone company for another year of special emergency service.

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## HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

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To the Honorable Board of Selectmen:

I herewith submit my annual report, covering the activities of the health department for the fiscal year of 1937. The year's health record has, for the second successive year, reached a new low figure in the number of cases of communicable diseases in Claremont, with a corresponding low mortality rate in this classification.

A total of 141 cases of communicable diseases were reported as follows: Chicken pox, 24 cases; measles, 17; German measles, 2; mumps, 13; pneumonia, 28; scarlet fever, 7; tuberculosis 16; whooping cough, 6; venereal disease, 26.

The only deaths in the list of communicable diseases were one death from tuberculosis, and seventeen from pneumonia. The apparent high percentage in the death rate from pneumonia is due to the fact that not all cases of pneumonia were reported, while all deaths were.

Prompt reporting of every case of communicable disease aids materially in its control. Where no physician is called on a case, it becomes the duty of every citizen who knows, or may have reason to suspect, the existence of any case of communicable disease in his, or any household, to make sure that the Board of Health is notified at once.

Immunization of children for the prevention of diphtheria has been continued as in past years. This year free inoculation was given 238 children of school and pre-school age.

The fact that Claremont has not had a single case of diphtheria for more than six years, that our school children are now practically 100 per cent immune from this disease, is most convincing proof that the work started in 1925 for the eradication of diph-

theria has been a most successful health project and well worth the money expended.

Sanitation, an important part of the duties of the health officer, and one that covers a large and varied field of activity, is that of sanitation. A part of this program is the frequent inspection of food stores, eating establishments, etc.

Regulations now require that all eating utensils, drinking glasses, etc., used in restaurants, lunch rooms, or any place where food or beverages are served, shall after each use, be cleansed by washing with soap and water, then be subjected to a thorough disinfection before being used again.

The Barber Shop Law. This law, enacted at the last legislative session, requires that health officers regularly inspect all barber shops located in the town or city within the officers' jurisdiction, and to prosecute violations of this law or regulations pertaining thereto.

Water Analysis. Twenty-two samples of water have been forwarded to the State Laboratory for bacteriological analysis. Four samples were from the Grannis system (public) at West Claremont. 18 samples were from private springs and wells.

Milk. Sixteen samples of milk, collected from producers and dealers, were forwarded to the Laboratory.

Nuisance Complaints. Approximately 125 complaints of this nature were received, covering various unsanitary conditions and practices. All complaints are investigated and nuisances ordered abated whenever conditions were found to substantiate the complaints, and the removal of a nuisance was possible.

A special effort has been made during the past year to stop the dumping of rubbish into Sugar river, which has become a public dumping ground by many of those living along the river. The practice has been stopped to some extent, and more drastic action will be taken in the future, if conditions are not further improved.

The New Hampshire Tuberculosis Christmas Seal Sale of 1936, provided the necessary funds to continue the regular diagnostic clinic and nursing services for the people of Claremont, and the following report gives a brief outline of the work accomplished during the year:

## REPORT OF MILK INSPECTOR

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Approximately 300 visits have been made by the milk inspector in and during the past year.

Several days were spent in going over the dairies with the State Board of Health, and a very good report was made by them. One dairy pasteurized their milk during an infection period in their herd. About 800 samples of milk have been tested in our laboratory and infected cattle have been destroyed. No tuberculosis has been found thus far in cattle supplying milk to Claremont. The entire supply has been put under the N. H. Milk Board.

No human disease has been traced to our milk supply this year.

Again I wish to thank the dairymen and public for their fine cooperation. We have 2 pasteurized plants at present time, 2 Grade A plants and about 110 producers and dealers selling milk in Claremont, N. H.
