# **TOWN WARRANT**

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

CARROLL, SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Conway, County of Carroll qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House at Center Conway, New Hampshire, March 14, 1950, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

Art. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

Section a Town officers' salaries

- b Town officers' expenses
- c Election and registration
- d Municipal Court
- e Expenses Town Hall and other buildings
- f Town office expense
- g Police department
- h Fire department
- i Health department
- j Vital statistics
- k Town maintenance of highways-summer and winter
- 1 Libraries

- m Town poor
- n Old age assistance
- 0 Memorial Day
- p Soldiers' aid
- q Parks and playgrounds
- r Damages and legal expenses
- s Interest, on temporary loans; on bonds
- t Payment on bond issue
- u Insurance
- v County taxes
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- Art. 4 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town the sum of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) if needed.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the system of electing three road agents, and authorize the Selectmen to appoint for 1950. And thereafter one to be elected by the voters annually.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new location for a Town dump and raise and appropriate the sum of \$2500 for the same.
- Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$518.50 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1000 (1/100th of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town for the previous year, for the purpose of

issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other towns of the region.

- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the activities of the Eastern Slope Region, Inc., for the year 1950, agreeably with a petition signed by Jesse E. Lyman and others.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to assist in maintaining the Memorial Hospital, agreeably with a petition signed by Robert N. Davis and others.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to assist in the operation of the Conway and North Conway Information Booths. This sum to be divided equally between the two booths, agreeably with a petition signed by Wendell D. Woodbury and others.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen to use funds already raised under Article 13 at the 1947 annual meeting for purchase and installation of an emergency rotary beacon and portable landing lights at the White Mt. Airport, agreeably with a petition signed by Wylie L. Apte and others.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,909.00 for State Aid Construction to be expended on the Kearsarge road and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$979.57 for Town Road Aid.
- Art. 13. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of beano be adopted in this town? Agreeably with a petition signed by Arthur J. Wiggin and others.
  - Art. 14. To see what sum the Town will raise and appro-

priate for the re-surfacing and tarring of Farrington St., agreeably with a petition signed by Charles E. Steele and others.

Art. 15. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.



# **Report of Forest Fire Wardens**

#### Forest Fires-Our Most Shameful Waste

Everyone apparently fears fires but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in and near woodlands. Official figures show that more than 98 per cent of all forest fires result from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently, we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste."

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their efforts far reaching. Such fires destroy the raw products of the forests, the protection forests provide for game and the supply of ground water. They upset local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring the expenditure of public funds to extinguish them.

Our forest fire organization is doing a good job in keeping the size of fires small but the number of fires is increasing. In 1949 there were 100 more fires in New Hampshire than in 1948, but they burned 500 acres less. For the warden and his deputies to do the job they are capable of, they must have the co-operation of the public—YOU!

The primary objective of all fire fighters is PREVENTION—fire stoppage. This is the goal toward which your local forest fire warden and his deputies are constantly working. It can be achieved ONLY if YOU and YOU and YOU co-operate with them. It is worth YOUR effort and can be accomplished by:

- 1. Being careful with fire in or near woodland, being particularly careful with matches and cigarettes.
- 2. Securing the required written permit from the warden when the ground is not covered with snow.
- 3. Insisting that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
- 4. Calling the warden promptly when fire is detected and aiding him to extinguish it.

Let's reduce the number of forest fires and eliminate our most shameful waste.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Conway qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall on March fourteenth, 1950, at 2:30 p.m. to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 4. To choose two Auditors for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see if the District will vote to increase the School Board to six members, as permitted in Section 14, Ch. 139 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire.
- 6. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 7. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing year.
- 8. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing two years.
- 9. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

- 10. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 11. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance for the ensuing year.
- 12. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board, in the name of the District, to contract with trustees of Fryeburg Academy for instruction of the high school pupils from East Conway, and to see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of new equipment for the ensuing year.
- 14. To see if the District will vote to continue the Special Committee, and instruct them to work with the School Board and Superintendent in continuing the survey of the building and educational needs of the District.
- 15. To see if the District will vote to reappropriate the one thousand dollars, or such balance of it as may remain on June 30, 1950, that was appropriated at the 1949 Annual Meeting of the District, in order that it may be used during the next fiscal year to defray the expenses of architectural studies, plans, and cost estimates in connection with the building problems of the District.
  - 16. To see if the Districts will vote to reappropriate such

balance of the \$500.00 raised at the 1949 Annual Meeting for the expenses of a survey of the building and educational needs of the District as may remain on June 30, 1950.

- 17. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate as a Capital Reserve Fund, said Fund to be placed in the custody of the Trustees of the Trust Funds in accordance with the Laws of 1943, Chapter 160 as amended by the Laws of 1945, Chapter 35 and Laws of 1947, Chapter 8.
- 18. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the District, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for school building construction or other educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the General Services Administration, or other U. S. Government or State Agencies.
- 19. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the District, such funds as may be available for advance school building plans from the General Services Administration, or other U.S. Government or State Agencies.
- 20. To see if the District will vote to elect its District Officers by an official ballot, and to adopt the provisions of sections 112 to 120 of chapter 34 of the Revised Laws as inserted by Chapter 22, Laws of 1943, the non-partisan ballot system.





### Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Conway:

The reduction in State Aid for schools this year eliminated Conway from any part of the \$19,477.66 it received in 1947-48 and 1948-49. In 1940 the people of New Hampshire spent 3.2 cents out of every income dollar for schools. In 1949-50 only 1.7 cents out of each income dollar is being spent for the schools.

I do not recommend keeping the Shirley School open for 1950-51. It is neither sound educational practice nor sensible expenditure of tax money. The seven pupils in grades 1-4 can be transported to Center Conway on the bus now carrying the upper grades without increased cost for transportation or for teachers.

The Survey Committee has spent a great deal of time studying the building and educational problems of the District. I recommend that the Committee be continued and that favorable action be taken on their suggestion that a sum of money be put in trust for future building needs. Unless additional facilities are available for grades 1-8 within four years, emergency measures will be necessary which will reduce the effectiveness of the educational program.

Federal Aid for school building construction is a distinct possibility in 1950 and federal funds for plans are now available.

The co-operation and counsel of the Advisory Committee in reviewing the budget and their suggestions on various school problems have been helpful and I hope that this type of work may be continued. This may be the first step in wider public understanding of school affairs.

A third room was opened in September, 1949, at Center Conway School and additional pupils transported to this school. A very successful lunch program has been established and I appreciate the help of everyone who has worked to make these lunches possible.

The High School offers a fine program for the college-bound pupils and for those going directly to work after graduation. The elementary programs are limited by inadequate buildings and grounds. I am confident that with continued study the School Board and the Survey Committee will find ways to improve the facilities for grades 1-8.

My sincere thanks are extended to the School Board, teachers, and all other members who have made the past year worth-while for the boys and girls.

### Headmaster's Report

Kennett High School opened September 7th with a gain of 28 pupils over the enrollment of a year ago. Fifteen students have dropped out of school to date, five of whom have transferred to other schools. This represents a 5% drop-out and transfer, a percentage considerably below the national average.

Through the kindness of Mr. Larry Frunzi and the Conway School District, Kennett has been able to add the Driver Education Course, complete with a dual control car and a specially trained instructor. Thirty-two members of the upper classes have been participating in this course, all of whom did not know how to drive at the outset of the program. A thorough and comprehensive study accompanies the actual roadwork required for the successful completion of this course.

In addition to the usual information concerning colleges, special schools, and work opportunities, the school conducted a most successful "Career Day" for members of the two upper classes. Panel and individual discussions were held relative to the question of seeking and holding a job. A complete battery of aptitude and vocational interest tests were administered to nearly 100 students by personnel of Boston University.

A most satisfactory automobile mechanics course has been instituted and with the initial year of organization behind us even greater possibilities in this vocational area should be realized. Next year we hope to add electricity which, together with the present courses in woodworking, general shop, and machine shop, will round out a diversified and effective program.

Our music program continues to operate on a high plane of accomplishment. Well over 100 students are actively participating in one or other of the various musical organizations within the school.

In the field of athletics, Kennett has held its own against some of the best interscholastic competition within the state. Kennett's team was invited to participate in the Class B Interscholastic Basketball tournament, one of eight teams to enjoy the distinction throughout the state. The girls' basketball program was one of the fullest in recent years with over fifty girls participating in intramural fall basketball, as well as the usual winter varsity season. A young ski team has definitely improved with each meet and was successful in its defense of the White Mt. Region Association Championship.

This report touches merely upon some of the highlights in the routine aspects of our overall program. A hard-working and sincere faculty group is constantly striving to maintain the high standards of achievement for which the community may be proud. To them much credit is due.

In closing I should like to express my sincere thanks to a most efficient and excellent faculty, to the Superintendent of Schools, and the School Board who have been a source of help and guidance.

### REPORT OF SCHOOL SURVEY COMMITTEE

In 1947 the Annual School Meeting authorized the appointment of a committee to study school needs of the town. Extensive studies have been carried on since and reports made at annual meetings. During this period additional members have been appointed to make the committee more representative of all sections of the town.

Material gathered and compiled includes a study of model school buildings and equipment, sites, financing, curricula; and a complete survey and census of needs, present and future, by the Superintendent and School Board.

There is no final report yet as the committee is still working on the details of this analysis.

The Committee has availed itself, without expense to the Town, of many opportunities, to study other schools and discuss our problems with people of experience.

Mr. Irving Hersey of Durham has been retained as an architect. His wide experience has already assisted us immeasurably in our work.

Facts developed indicating that inevitably we face a school construction program in the near future. State or Federal funds may or may not be available to assist us at that time. In the meantime this Committee recommends that a sinking fund be established, and that suitable amounts of money be raised and appropriated annually and placed in this fund.
