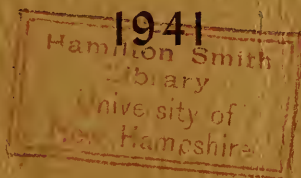

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. s.]

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Eaton in the County of Carroll in the said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Odd Fellows Hall in said Eaton on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same including Town Officers' Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Election and Registration Expenses, Town Hall Expense, Police Department, Fire Department, Town Maintenance, General Expenses of Highway Department, Street Lighting, Library, Town Poor, Old Age Assistance, Health Department, Perambulation of Town Lines between Freedom and Eaton, and Interest on Temporary Loans.
3. To see what time the Town will vote to close the polls at this meeting.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.00 for the upkeep of the Snowville and Eaton Center Cemeteries.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of white pine blister rust.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town in co-operation with other towns in the lakes region.

7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes if necessary.

8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

9. To see if the Town wishes to continue printing the names of delinquent tax payers in the Town Report.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay on debts of the Town.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$351.00 for State Aid Construction on the Brownfield road, the State furnishing \$1,000.00.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to pay one-third of the amount needed to construct a bridge on the Brownfield road near the State line, provided the State will furnish two-thirds of the necessary amount.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10.00 for the flags and markers for the soldiers' graves in the Town of Eaton.

14. To see if the Town will vote to have the Road Agents' duties include both summer and winter maintenance of the Town roads and determine how the money shall be divided between the two districts.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to pay the auditor to audit the books of the Treasurer, Town Clerk, and Tax Collector if any one of these offices should be left vacant before the end of the year.
