#### Town Meeting Warrant

(As known February 19, 1943)

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for Pine Blister Rust Control.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to provide for the disposal of rubbish and garbage, and raise and appropriate money for same, and other expenses of the Health Department.
- Article 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal and maintenance of highways and bridges.
- Article 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the lighting of streets the ensuing year.
- Article 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the highway department.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to adopt the budget as printed in the report.

- Article 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf Library and salary for its librarian.
- Article 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.
- Article 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
- Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for proper observance of Memorial Day.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for parks, playgrounds and recreational development.
- Article 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of its cemeteries.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the following: \$2,500.00 to pay the amount maturing on the town building and water works bonds; \$1,000.00 on outstanding water works purchase notes; also the sum of \$1,435.00 to pay the interest on said indebtedness and on temporary loans.
- Article 16. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to allow a discount for early payment of taxes.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose of property acquired by tax collector's deed.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the White Mountain Region.
- Article 20. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Defense expense.
- Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the Littleton hospital.
- Article 22. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Franconia:

The enrollment of your schools last year was 157, the average membership 140.55 and the percent of attendance 94.4. There were 23 tuition pupils in the academy and 17 in the elementary schools. The average attendance in the academy was 58.66. This is the highest since I have been superintendent, and it may be an all-time high.

This year the actual enrollment on February 1st was only 123 with 43 in grades 9 to 12, and 80 in grades 1 to 8. This large decrease is due of course to conditions brought on by the war.

This decrease in enrollment and the scarcity of teachers has made it seem desirable to recommend the elimination of one of the teachers in grades 1 to 6 and to return to the system of having one teacher for grades 1 to 3 and one for grades 4 to 6. The elimination of one teacher will make it possible to pay your present teachers a larger salary and not increase your present budget.

The teaching situation is becoming very critical. There are no elementary teachers available and very few high school teachers. This shortage is raising the salary levels. The only way I have been able to get enough teachers for my schools this year is to hire married women who taught before they were married.

There were two changes in your regular teaching staff before school opened in September. Mr. Shipp

resigned in August to enter the navy. He was replaced by Mr. Wendell Tetley. Mr. Tetley is a graduate of Bates College and has had several years experience teaching in Maine. Mrs. Amadon resigned to accept a position nearer her home. She was succeeded by Mrs. Genevieve Choate. Mrs. Choate resigned in November. Mrs. Thelma Downing substituted until the Christmas vacation when she was succeeded by Mrs. Paul Lyster of Littleton.

Early in December Miss Keefe was released to accept a better position in Peterborough, N. H. Mr. John Chapman, Mr. Seldon Hannah and Mrs. O'Neil have served us well as substitutes. Mr. Edward Twomey, a former resident of Franconia, has accepted the position for the remainder of the year. Mr. Twomey is a graduate of St. Mary's University in Baltimore, Md. He also has a master's degree in English from the same institution. He has taught for several years in Maine.

Mr. Kermit Bennett resigned in August to accept a position in Connecticut. At that time it was impossible to find a teacher to replace him. Beginning in January Mr. Frank Goss has given his services as wood-working instructor in grades 7 and 8. This was made possible through the interest of Mrs. Joel Coffin and Mrs. Robert Peckett, Jr.

This year the School Board voted to accept the penny milk program. This makes it possible to provide milk to pupils at the cost of only a penny per bottle. The cost of this milk is being paid by the Greenleaf Civics Club, so that every pupil can have a half-pint bottle of milk each day.

The School Board is recommending that the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,300 for the next school year. This is a reduction of \$275 from the

amount raised for the present year. The reduction would have been larger if there had not been a decrease in tuition receipts.

The athletic program has been curtailed largely because of restrictions on transportation. It was impossible to obtain an athletic coach, so Headmaster Rhoades has helped all he could while carrying a very heavy teaching and administration program.

Mr. Rhoades deserves special commendation during the past two years. He has taken on the teaching of physics, chemistry and mathematics because no science and mathematics teacher could be obtained. He has administered the sugar, gasoline, and oil rationing programs, and as mentioned above he has coached basketball. This extra work has been carried on efficiently and without complaint. I certainly appreciate what he has done.

I also wish to express my appreciation for the help and cooperation of the Franconia teachers in the various rationing programs.
