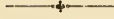

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

[L. S.]

To the inhabitants of the town of Hill, in the county of Merrimack
in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Hill
on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in
the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1 To choose all necessary Town Officers for year ensuing.
- 2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for ensuing year and to see if the town will vote to make appropriation of the same as per estimate made in the town budget and such additional appropriation if any as voted in town meeting.
- 3 To see if the town will vote to authorize its selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4 To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 5 To see what action the town will take in regard to a budget committee to serve with the selectmen.
- 6 To see if the town will accept state aid construction of the Class II road known as the Center road, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$930.00; or will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$492.45.
- 7 To see if the town will vote to either move a street light from Mill Hill to River Street east of railroad, or to install another street light at said point on River Street, and to raise and appropriate a sum of money for same.
- 8 To see if the town will vote to reimburse Tripeak Grange for the whole or a part of the amount advanced by them to finance preliminary drawings for a new town hall.

9 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in co-operation with other towns in the lakes region.

10 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of white pine blister rust.

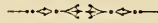
11 To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

12 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
